

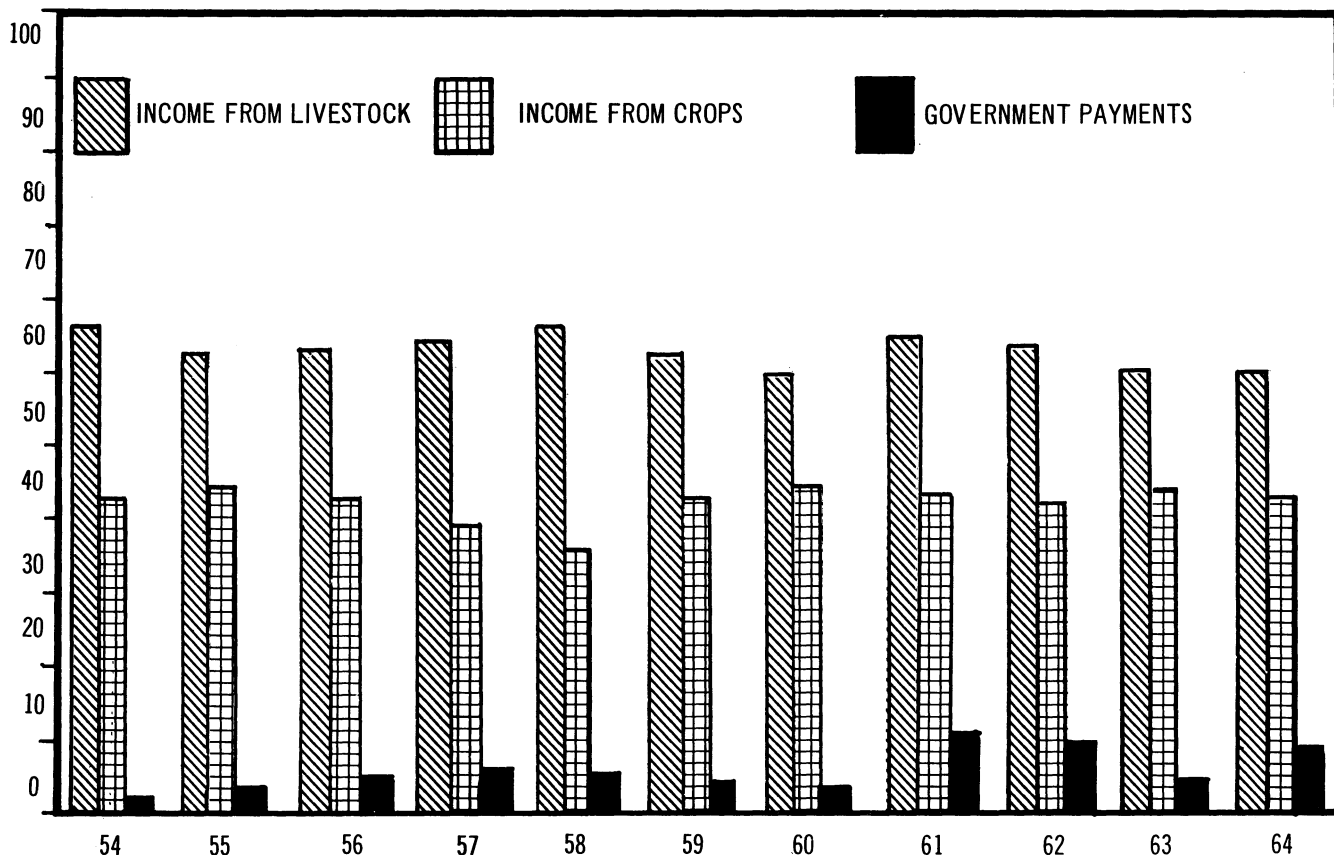

CASH RECEIPTS FROM FARMING IN OHIO
1964

Cash receipts to Ohio farmers from marketings and government payments totaled \$1,114,674,000 in 1964. Returns from the sale of farm commodities were up slightly from the revised 1963 figure, but government payments rose 12 percent. Total cash receipts from farming were one percent higher than a year earlier.

Farm marketings during 1964 amounted to \$1,058,768,000. Of this total, cash receipts from the sale of livestock and livestock products accounted for 59.3 percent. The marketings of crops accounted for \$431,162,000 or 40.7 percent of the total. Cash receipts from crops were down slightly while cash receipts from livestock and livestock products rose slightly from the comparable revised 1963 estimates. In both cases the change was less than one percent.

Cash receipts from meat animals were virtually unchanged from 1963. Slightly higher returns from cattle and calves offset slight declines in hogs, and sheep and lambs. An increase in cash receipts from dairy products--up two percent--was accounted for in higher prices received for milk and cream, even though the quantity of milk and cream sold was below a year earlier. Only turkeys showed an increase from the revised 1963 figure in the poultry category with a one percent increase. Cash receipts from wool increased nine percent, and honey was up 41 percent from the revised 1963 totals.

Lower market prices and smaller marketings of wheat caused cash receipts for wheat to drop 37 percent from 1963. Cash receipts from corn were one percent higher because of higher market prices even though marketings were lower. Soybean returns were 16 percent above the revised 1963 total based on higher market prices. Much of the increase in vegetable cash receipts was accounted for by higher returns from tomatoes, especially late summer field grown tomatoes for processing, and potatoes. Returns from fruit and nuts were considerably above the abnormally low figure of 1963. Near normal crops of apples and peaches returned the cash receipts of fruits and nuts to approximately the 1962 level.

The sale of dairy products continued to be the largest single source of cash receipts to Ohio farms, accounting for 20.5 percent of the State total returns from farm marketings. Cattle and calves ranked second, and hogs third accounting for 15.4 and 13.2 percent respectively. Soybeans, corn, and poultry and eggs accounted for just under ten percent.

The five leading counties in total cash receipts from farming--Fulton, Wood, Darke, Wayne and Putnam--each had total returns of over \$25,000,000 in 1964. Wayne County continued as the leading county in the sale of dairy products. Fulton County had the greatest returns from the sale of cattle and calves, and Clinton County led in cash receipts from the sale of hogs in 1964.

PROCEDURE

Estimates of cash receipts from farm marketing in Ohio were published initially in 1927 and annually each year since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts are published annually by the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology of the Ohio State University and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the Statistical Reporting Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains the 1964 Ohio county cash receipts estimates, and revised 1963 commodity estimates.

Cash receipts represent gross returns from the actual sale of crops and livestock during the calendar year. The value of home consumption and inter-farm sales is not included as cash receipts. Production expenses such as feed, fertilizer and feeder animals are not subtracted from cash receipts. The addition of government payments to cash receipts provides a measure of gross cash income, or total cash receipts from farming.

Current cash receipts estimates for Ohio and the remaining States appear in the USDA's Farm Income Situation-199--Supplement, August, 1965. These estimates are prepared by the Economic Research Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture from basic data provided by the Statistical Reporting Service, the 1959 Census of Agriculture, and other sources. These 1964 estimates do not reflect information obtained from the 1964 U. S. Census of Agriculture taken in late 1964. This source of information has not yet become available.

The State estimates published in this bulletin may differ from previously published estimates. These differences are caused by revisions in marketings, in shipments, inventory numbers, etc., as more complete information becomes available. Therefore, income data by county is not always strictly comparable with previous years. The relative importance of each county in each district can be considered to be unchanged for each commodity.

County estimates of cash receipts from the sale of dairy products are not strictly comparable with previous years. Data from the milk market administrators have provided a basis for a change in the relative position of some counties. This change came about as a continuing program to develop more complete sources of information for all estimates.

As in recent bulletins, the sale of dairy cows and veal calves has been included with the sale of cattle and calves. Poultry cash receipts include income from the sale of eggs, farm chickens, broilers and turkeys during 1964. Because of the confidential nature of the data, cash receipts from turkey eggs and other poultry are included as other livestock. Included with sheep cash receipts are returns from sheep and lambs as well as wool sales.

Cash receipts from the sale of greenhouse vegetables are included with vegetable cash receipts, and not with greenhouse and nursery. The county vegetable estimates are a combination of field grown vegetables and vegetables grown under glass. For purposes of ranking, potatoes were considered as separate from vegetable cash receipts. Cash receipts from fruit crops are made up of returns from small fruits as well as fruits and nuts.

In 1964 government payments amounted to \$55,906,000 or 5.0 percent of the total cash receipts in Ohio. The Feed Grain Program was again the largest program accounting for \$37,127,000. The Wheat Program accounted for \$6,740,000; conservation payments, \$6,489,000; and the Soil Bank Program, \$3,931,000. Payments under the Sugar Act and Wool Act accounted for \$969,000 and \$650,000 respectively.

Two important factors influencing any comparison by counties are the size of the counties and the major source of cash receipts in each county. Included in Table V are the average cash receipts per farm and per acre by county. These averages aid in the comparison of counties with similar farming practices better than a comparison of the total cash receipts. The average per farm and per acre are based on the 1959 U. S. Census of Agriculture "number of farms" and acres of "all land in farms." In some counties the average per acre cash receipts are relatively low because the Census designated acres of "all land in farms" includes a considerable amount of land not cultivated and some not even used for pasture. The 1959 Census defined a farm as any tract operated as a unit of 10 or more acres; or if less than 10 acres, had sales of agricultural products totaling \$250 or more.

County estimates of cash receipts do not include the value of commodities used on farms. For example, producers may market grain and hay in the form of beef or milk rather than in its original form. By counties the relative importance of some commodities would be different if the value of these commodities used on farms where produced were computed. Assuming a season average price for each commodity, the value of selected crops used on farms where produced in 1964 would amount to \$150,000,000 for corn, \$20,000,000 for oats and \$75,000,000 for hay.

The publication of any bulletin is only possible through the cooperation and aid of people. The preparation of this bulletin has been possible through the efforts of many people. Included are personnel of the Ohio Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, Federal Milk Market Orders operating in Ohio, the Ohio Department of Agriculture, and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center. Special recognition is due the professional and clerical work done by the staff of the Ohio office of the Statistical Reporting Service. However, the greatest recognition is in order for the people who provided basic data from which the information for this publication was compiled--farm operators, the representatives of grain elevators and livestock markets, etc., and other interested parties.

GOVERNMENT PAYMENTS, OHIO, 1964

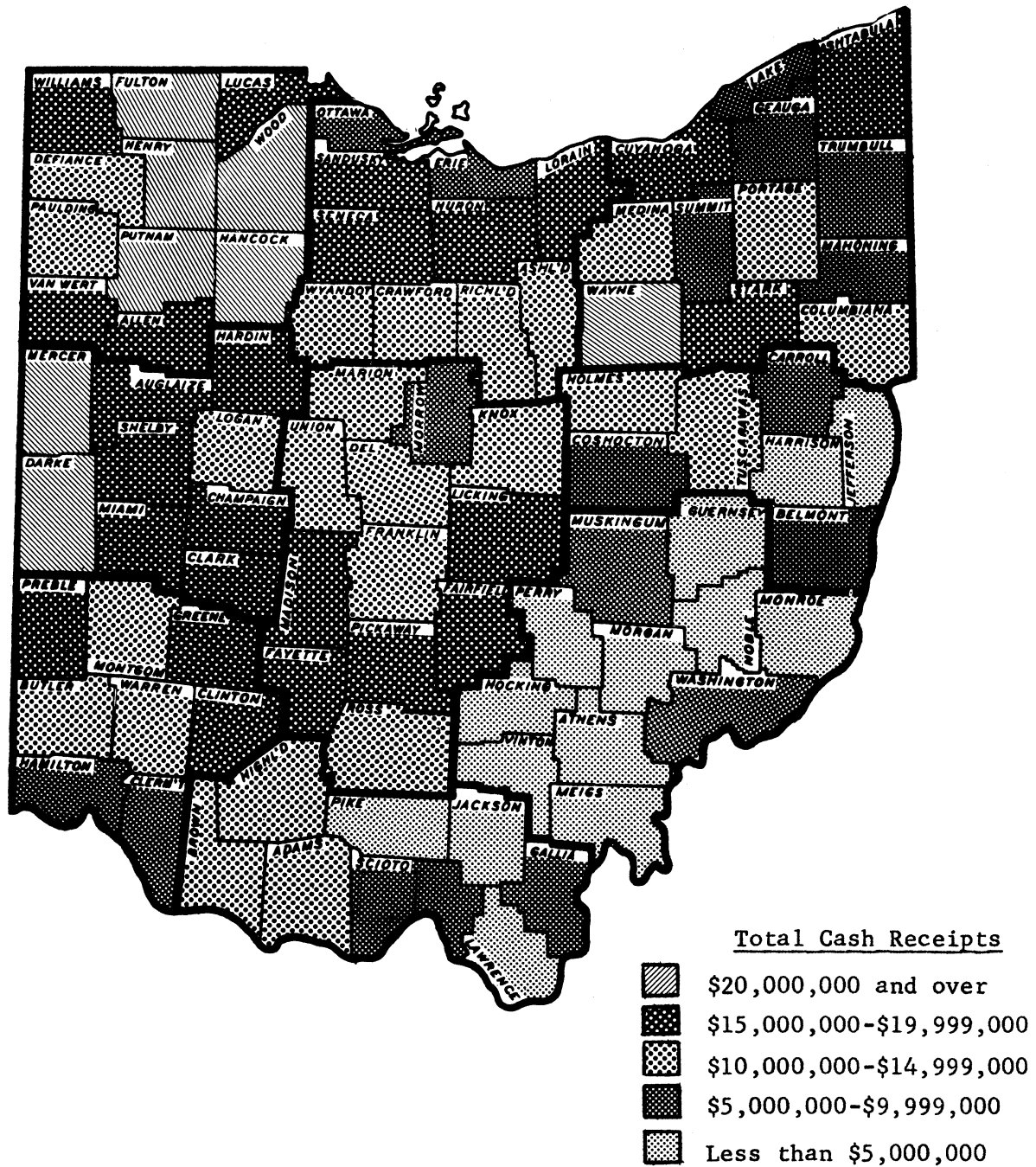
