Handbook Ohio Farm Prices 1909-1955

This bulletin is a revision of Circular No. 14 and several other price bulletins formerly released by this department.

It is a compilation of average prices received by Ohio farmers for their products at the point of first sale of farmers' lands. This is generally at a local market. They should not be confused with prices of specific grades or classes of commodities at central markets.

Source: These prices are reported to the state statistician of the Crop Reporting Board by "price reporters" and subsequently released by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Marketing Service in the monthly publication "Agricultural Prices" and the annual publications of "Agricultural Statistics" and "Crops and Markets."

Ohio prices are carried currently also in "Timely Economic Information for Ohio Farmers" issued monthly by this department.

Purpose: This bulletin is designed to serve as a source or reference book for farmers, county agricultural agents, teachers and others interested in the agricultural industry. We have attempted to assemble these prices in a convenient form by months for seasonal comparisons and by years to review price trends.

Annual prices are simple averages of the 12 monthly prices. In the case of Seasonal averages prices are weighted average of prices in the marketing year.

Ohio Prices Index: The Ohio farm products prices index is calculated on a 1910-14 base period. This index is a weighted average of relatives.
