## PRESIDENT'S PRIZE

### Purpose

This program aims to increase produce accessibility through campus community connection. A community garden will be created on Waterman Farm that will be managed by students from Ohio State.

The produce grown at that plot will be placed in five different sites that are located in food deserts. The produce will be delivered bi-weekly to twelve families per site.

### Impact

Provide sixty families at partner sites with fresh produce bi-weekly for one year.

Provide opportunities for participating families and students to share recipes and build community together through garden gatherings.

Involve Ohio State University students in service activities related to food, gardening, and health in the Columbus community.
