

#### CASH RECEIPTS FROM FARMING IN OHIO 1968

Cash receipts to Ohio farmers from marketings and government payments totaled \$1,318,292,000 in 1968. Return from the sale of farm commodities was up one percent from the revised 1967 figure. Government payments were up 35 percent with the Feed Grain program accounting for most of this increase. Total cash receipts from farming in 1968 were nearly three percent higher than a year earlier.

Farm marketings during 1968 amounted to \$1,223,580,000. Of this total, cash receipts from the sale of livestock and livestock products accounted for \$704,269,000 or 57.6 percent. The marketings of crops accounted for \$519,311,000 or 42.4 percent of the total. Cash receipts from crops were up less than one percent while cash receipts from livestock and livestock products were up almost two percent from comparable revised 1967 estimates.

Changes in cash receipts from various crops resulted in offsetting increases and decreases. Receipts from food grains were down 20 percent, due mainly to lower prices and a smaller quantity of wheat sold. Feed grains were down \$13,369,000 or eight percent due to a smaller quantity of corn sold. Cash receipts from most crops except food grains and feed grains were up from a year earlier. Soybeans showed the largest dollar gain, increasing \$10,295,000 or eight percent above 1967. Vegetables were up \$9,089,000 or 14 percent. Some other increases from 1967 were in fruits and nuts (19 percent), greenhouse and nursery (nine percent), and sugar beets (56 percent).

All major livestock groups showed an increase over 1967 cash receipts. Receipts from all meat animals increased three percent with cattle and calves up five percent, hogs up one percent, and sheep and lambs up seven percent. Poultry showed a two percent increase, and receipts from all dairy products were just slightly (0.2 percent) above a year earlier.

The sale of dairy products continued to be the largest single source of cash receipts to Ohio farms, accounting for 20.0 percent of the State total returns from farm marketings. Cattle and calves ranked second with 15.4 percent. Hogs ranked third with 13.4 percent. Soybeans moved ahead of corn this year, with these crops accounting for 11.7 and 10.8 percent of the State respectively. These five commodities accounted for over 71 percent of the total cash receipts from sales received by Ohio farmers in 1968.

Darke County led all other counties again this year with cash receipts of over \$36.5 million in 1968. The next five ranked counties - Wayne, Fulton, Mercer, Putnam, and Wood - each topped \$30 million in cash receipts from farming in 1968. Leading counties by commodity were: Wayne County in dairy products, Fulton County in cattle and calves, Clinton County in hogs, Darke County in poultry, Wood County in both soybeans and wheat, and Henry County in corn. Government payments in 1968 amounted to \$94,712,000 or seven percent of the total cash receipts in Ohio. This was a 35 percent increase over 1967 government payments with the Feed Grain Program accounting for practically all of this increase. Government payments by type were: Feed Grain Program, \$58,653,000; Wheat Program, \$21,872,000; Conservation, \$5,740,000; Cropland Adjustment, \$3,553,000; Wool Act payments, \$1,928,000; Soil Bank, \$1,590,000; Sugar Act payments, \$1,376,000.

#### PROCEDURE

Estimates of cash receipts by county from farm marketings in Ohio were published initially in 1927 and annually since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts are published by the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology of the Ohio State University and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the Statistical Reporting Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains the 1968 Ohio county cash receipts estimates, and revised 1967 estimates for the State.

<u>Gross and Net Farm Income</u> data are presented in Table III. The information is available only at the State level, but the relative income situation of the Ohio farmer can be observed over a period of years. It is interesting to compare the net income figures with total cash receipts and realized gross income for the State by years.

<u>Cash Receipts</u> represent gross returns from the actual sale of crops and livestock during the calendar year. The value of home consumption and interfarm sales are not included as cash receipts. Production expenses such as feed, fuel, fertilizer, and purchases of feeder animals are not subtracted from cash receipts. The addition of government payments to cash receipts provides a measure of gross cash income, or total cash receipts from farming.

Current cash receipts estimates for Ohio and other states appear in the USDA's <u>Farm Income Situation--214--Supplement</u>, August, 1969. These estimates are prepared by the Economic Research Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture from basic data provided by the Statistical Reporting Service, the 1964 Census of Agriculture, and other sources. The State estimates published in this bulletin may differ from previously published estimates due to revisions in marketings, inshipments, inventory numbers, etc., as more complete information becomes available.

Data from milk market administrators provided a basis for allocating receipts of milk from producers at plants operating under the Federal Order to counties. Data from the Animal Health Division of the Agricultural Research Service provided information on the location by county of producers selling milk to dairy plants. The number of producers in each county was used as a basis of breaking down total receipts at plants not under Federal Order to counties. This assumes annual deliveries per producer to each plant would not differ significantly at the county level. Each grade of milk was considered separately in arriving at the county total cash receipts. As in recent bulletins, the sale of dairy cows and veal calves has been included with the sale of cattle and calves. Poultry cash receipts include income from the sale of eggs, farm chickens, broilers, and turkeys during 1968. Because of the confidential nature of the data, cash receipts from turkey eggs and other poultry are included as other livestock. Included with sheep cash receipts are returns from wool sales as well as income from sale of sheep and lambs.

Cash receipts from the sale of greenhouse vegetables are included with vegetable cash receipts, and not with greenhouse and nursery. The county vegetable estimates are a combination of field grown vegetables and vegetables grown under glass. For purposes of ranking, potatoes were considered as separate from vegetable cash receipts. Cash receipts from fruit crops are made up of returns from small fruits as well as from tree fruits and nuts.

Two important factors influencing any comparison by counties are the size of the counties and the major source of cash receipts in each county. Table VI presents the average cash receipts per farm and per acre by county. These averages aid in the comparison of counties with similar farming practices better than a comparison of the total cash receipts. The average per farm and per acre is based on the 1964 U. S. Census of Agriculture "number of farms" and acres of "all land in farms" projected to 1968 levels. In some counties the average per acre cash receipts are relatively low because the Census designated acres of "all land in farms" includes a considerable amount of land not cultivated and some not even used for pasture. The 1964 Census defined a farm as any tract operated as a unit of 10 or more acres, if the estimated sales of agricultural products for the year amounted, or normally would amount, to at least \$50; or if less than 10 acres, had sales of agricultural products totaling \$250 or more.

County estimates of cash receipts do not include the value of commodities used on farms. For example, producers may market grain and hay in the form of beef or milk rather than in its original form. By counties the relative importance of some commodities would be different if the value of these commodities used on farms where produced were computed. Figured on a season average price basis for each commodity, the value of selected crops used on farms where produced in 1968 would amount to \$131 million for corn, \$67 million for hay and \$9 million for oats.

This bulletin has been prepared through the efforts of many people. Included are personnel of the Ohio Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, Federal Milk Market Orders operating in Ohio, the Ohio Department of Agriculture, the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center and the Agricultural Research Service. Special recognition is due the professional and clerical work done by the staff of the Ohio office of the Statistical Reporting Service. However, the greatest recognition is due to the large number of Ohio farmers and agribusinessmen for their interest and help in providing the basic data used in compiling the information for this bulletin.


