

ESTIMATED CASH RECEIPTS BY OHIO FARMERS FROM THE SALE OF AGRICULTURAL  
PRODUCTS AND FROM GOVERNMENT PAYMENTS, BY COUNTIES - 1952

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Explanations

Similar estimates of cash receipts by Ohio farmers have been made for 1927 and for each year since 1929. The results have been published in Mimeograph Bulletins of the Department of Agricultural Economics, The Ohio State University and the Ohio Agricultural Experiment Station.

All cash receipt figures were calculated for the calendar year as in the previous studies since 1939. The data used as a basis for this study were obtained from the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture; census publications; information compiled by the Department of Agricultural Economics, The Ohio State University and the judgment and opinion of experts on the various agricultural enterprises. Certain changes of methods of calculation become necessary from year to year due to changes in basic sources of information, therefore, figures for some items are not strictly comparable. However, a fair picture of the sources of agricultural cash receipts and their relative importance is given by this study.

Cash receipts, in this study, denotes the actual cash receipts from the sale of agricultural commodities in the county, however, interfarm sales of livestock, the value of crops used for feed, seed and household use, and income from outside work or investments are excluded. Therefore, the data do not necessarily indicate the relative importance of the various enterprises, but rather their importance as sources of cash receipts. These estimates of cash receipts should not in any way be confused with the net income of Ohio farmers.

A variation exists between the published U.S.D.A. cash receipts from sales shown in Table I and the cash receipts from sales shown in Tables III and IV. This difference is due to the fact that cash receipts, estimated at \$2,210,000, from horses, mules, honey, and beeswax is excluded from Tables III and IV since no satisfactory data were available to permit distribution of these cash receipts to the counties.

Government payments include payments made under both the Agricultural Conservation and Sugar Beet programs. The government payments used here are the amounts earned, by counties, for the 1951 program year. The major portion of these payments was received by farmers during the calendar year of 1952; however, a small amount was received in 1951 for which a breakdown by counties is not available.

In this study, with the exception of Table V, cash receipts from the dairy enterprise includes cash receipts from the sale of dairy products, veal calves, and cull dairy cows, while the cattle enterprise includes the cash receipts from the sale of other cattle. In Table V the cash receipts from veal calves and cull dairy cows has been combined with the cash receipts from other cattle to give the cash receipts from the sale of all cattle and calves. The cost of feeder cattle purchased was not deducted from cattle sales. The poultry enterprise includes the cash receipts from eggs, chickens, turkeys, and other poultry. The sheep enterprise includes cash receipts from sheep, lambs and wool, and, as in the case of cattle, deduction for the cost of feeder sheep purchased was not made from sales. The truck enterprise includes canning crops and other vegetables grown for sales except greenhouse products and potatoes which were estimated separately. The fruit enterprise includes cash receipts from both fruit and small fruits.

Since a great variation exists in the size of the counties, the estimated cash receipts per farm and per acre has been calculated, by using the 1950 census data on number of farms and acres of all land in farms, to serve as a basis for comparing the counties. The low cash receipts per acre in some of the counties is due in part to the fact that the acreage designated by the census as acres of all land in farms includes a considerable amount of land not actually under cultivation and some not even used for pasture. The number of farms, given by the census, includes tracts of three acres or more, if the value of agricultural products in 1949, exclusive of home gardens, amounted to \$150 or more. Places of less than three acres were counted as farms only if the value of sales of agricultural products in 1949 amounted to \$150 or more.

#### Acknowledgments

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Note: The wording of this bulletin has been changed slightly with cash receipts being used in place of gross cash income. Two reasons have prompted this change of wording. First, gross cash income is often confused with net farm income and has resulted in several complaints. The second reason is to conform with the wording used by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture since so much of the material in this bulletin is based on data supplied by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. No change has been made in the method of making the estimates of cash receipts (formerly gross cash income) and the figures presented in this bulletin are comparable with previous issues of this bulletin.
