


# 1981 OHIO FARM INCOME

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### CASH RECEIPTS FROM FARMING IN OHIO, 1981 <sup>1/</sup>

Ohio cash receipts from farm marketings of crops, livestock and livestock products were \$3,447,142,000 in 1981, down 18 percent from last year. At \$2,018,507,000, the 1981 sale of crops decreased 28 percent from 1980 and accounted for 58.6 percent of the total cash receipts from farm marketings compared with 67.0 percent a year earlier. Cash receipts from livestock and livestock products, at \$1,428,635,000, were up 4 percent from last year and accounted for 41.4 percent of the total compared to 33.0 percent in 1980. Government payments amounted to an additional \$24,089,000.

Ohio's total 1981 realized gross farm income was \$4,230.6 million, of which \$783.5 million was from services other than farm marketings. About 94 percent of the total gross farm income was needed for production expenses, leaving a figure of \$267.1 million as realized net income, down 74 percent from 1980. The percent of income going for expenses compares with 79 percent a year earlier. Although 1981 farm production expenses has the smallest increase in years (1.3 percent), low corn, soybean and wheat prices along with reduced yields caused disastrous economic problems for many farmers.

Soybean cash receipts, at \$690,653,000 for 1981, placed number one and accounted for 20.0 percent of the total cash receipts from the farm marketings in Ohio. Soybeans ranked first in 1974 and annually each year since 1977. The previous all-time high for any commodity was \$1,116,156,000 for soybeans in 1980, more than one-third above the 1981 total. Corn, with 1981 cash receipts of \$648,923,000, remained in second position, but decreased 37 percent from 1980. Wheat maintained the sixth position ranking with receipts of \$250,146,000, a 2 percent decrease from a year earlier. Greenhouse and nursery crops totaled \$169,556,000 for seventh position in total cash receipts.

In the major livestock groups, cash receipts from dairy products of \$598,557,000 increased 8 percent from 1980 and retained third position. Cattle and calves in fourth position, with sales of \$336,698,000, declined 14 percent due to fewer marketings and lower prices. Improved prices pushed total hog cash receipts 15 percent above last year, but remained in fifth place in total cash receipts. Poultry and eggs held eighth position with cash receipts of \$154,310,000, a 15 percent increase over 1980. Higher egg prices were responsible for the increase.

After one year in first place ranking, Darke County, with cash receipts of \$122.1 million, was again edged out by Mercer County which had cash receipts of \$127.1 million. During the past decade, Mercer County held first place ranking for 1978, 1979 and 1981; Darke County led for all other years. The next three highest counties were Wayne (\$115.9 million), Putnam (\$82.2 million), and Fulton (\$78.6 million). Leading counties by commodities were: Soybeans, Darke; Corn, Wood; Dairy Products, Wayne; cattle and calves, Wayne; hogs, Darke; wheat, Wood; greenhouses and nursery, Lorain; poultry and eggs, Mercer; and fruits and vegetables, Sandusky.

PERCENT OF TOTAL



## Procedure

Ohio estimates of cash receipts by county from farm marketings were published initially in 1927 and annually since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts are published by the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology of the Ohio State University and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the Statistical Reporting Service of the United States Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains 1981 Ohio county cash receipts estimates and revised 1977-1980 State estimates. County production estimates of various commodities are published annually in the Ohio Agricultural Statistics bulletin.

Current cash receipts estimates for Ohio and other States appear in the USDA's ECONOMIC INDICATORS OF THE FARM SECTOR: State Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1981. These estimates are prepared by the Economic Research Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, from basic data provided by the Statistical Reporting Service, the Census of Agriculture, and other sources. Estimates presented in this publication may differ from previously published data due to revisions in marketings, inshipments, inventory numbers, and other data, as more complete information becomes available. Cash receipts for some commodities were combined to avoid disclosure.


Cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent calendar year gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs. The value of home consumption and production expenses is excluded. County estimates of cash receipts from marketings are derived by allocating State estimates to counties on the basis of crop reporting and census marketings by crop reporting districts. Check data such as county dairy production from the milk market administrators are also used.

The definition of a farm includes places which had annual sales of agricultural products of \$1,000 or more. This definition was used for the 1978 Census of Agriculture. The average cash receipts per farm will aid in the comparison of counties with similar farm practices better than a comparison of total cash receipts.

This bulletin has been prepared through the efforts of many people. Included are personnel of agricultural agencies throughout Ohio. The greatest recognition is due the large number of Ohio farmers and agri-businessmen for their interest and help in providing the basic data used in compiling this information.

# FIGURE II CASH RECEIPTS FROM FARM MARKETINGS OHIO, 1981


