	Her most recent book, 1989, appeared with Princeton University Press	
	on the 20th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall. In addition to	
	receiving the DAAD Prize for Distinguished Scholarship in German and	
	European Studies, 1989 is also the first book to become the winner of	
	both SHAFR's Ferrell Prize, awarded to the best book on U.S. foreign policy, and AAASS' Shulman Prize, awarded to the best book on	
	Communist foreign policy (co-winner). 1989 was favorably reviewed in	
	The New York Times Book Review, The New York Review of Books,	
	Foreign Affairs, which called 1989 a new "classic," and the Financial	
	Times, which selected it as one of the "Books of the Year."	

Mary received her AB from Harvard and her PhD in History from Yale. She has subsequently been a White House Fellow and a member of the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton. She is now a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and on leave at Harvard University's Center for European Studies.
