Schmeidl has worked on Afghanistan since 2000. She managed the swisspeace office in Kabul between 2002 and 2005, supporting civil society development and civilian peacebuilding mainly through the Afghan Civil Society Forum, which she co-founded.



Susanne Schmeidl has written more than 40 research publications in the areas of early warning/conflict prevention, civilian peacebuilding/state building, protracted displacement, human security, and gender and civil society. Her most recent publications and research focus on the impact on the private security sector on the local peacebuilding process, a critique of top-down state building and displacement in Afghanistan.
