Carrie Rosefsky Wickham (Ph.D., Princeton University) is associate professor of political science at Emory University, where she specializes in politics of developing countries, with a regional focus on the Middle East. Her current research examines the origins of political opposition in authoritarian settings, focusing on the rise of Islamic activism in Egypt and other Arab states. Other research seeks to identify the conditions for the political integration of "anti-system" parties in the Arab world, based on intra-regional and cross-regional comparison.
