
Baby Bay and The Big, LOUD Ocean

But I'm here to tell you a story of


something that's happening right now.

As they continued on, the sound stopped. So Mama let out a great big loud song! And nothing came back, so they decided to wait a few more minutes.


This time they just listened to try and figure out where they

> "Today" said the ship captain, "we need to make a change. After today we will make our ships much quieter, we're being too loud for the whales!"


"Yes" said the submarine captain, "and we will not use our noisy radar systems where the whales live anymore! They need to be able to find each other and find food, even in the dark."
