

1.0. INTRODUCTION

This list provides an alphabetized cross-referenced list of languages and present-day villages of the Central and Northern Districts of Papua¹ together with those of neighbouring parts of the Milne Bay and Morobe Districts where languages, or parts of languages related to those in the Central and Northern Districts are to be found² - see map. It is a codified survey of the present state of linguistic knowledge of the mainland "tail" of Papua which it is hoped will prove useful

to research workers in Papua not only in itself but also as a supplementary index to those currently available¹ and as a guide to the grouping of the numerous alternative names that have appeared in earlier linguistic literature. Later it is planned to publish revised lists containing information not currently available together with names of old villages, tribes etc. not included here.

2.0. NAMES

Three types are included: present-day village names, present-day language names, and earlier published names.

2.1. PRESENT-DAY VILLAGE NAMES

These are taken from the Department of District Administration's *Village Directory* (1968) although some of them do not refer to villages in the usual sense but rather to census points (where the inhabitants of several hamlets or villages in a neighbourhood are counted) or to settlements of plantation labourers or of farmers.² In general no details are available of the linguistic composition of these latter "villages" and this has been stated wherever applicable throughout this checklist. The practice has also been adopted of conforming to the spellings in the *Village Directory*³ even though many of them could be improved upon.⁴ This is felt to be necessary in the interests of consistency and to avoid the unnecessary proliferation of names which, unfortunately, is already all too common. It has the advantage also that later more complete listings can be developed from these spellings as desired.

2.2. PRESENT-DAY LANGUAGE NAMES

These are taken from my own and other recent studies of languages of Central and South-East mainland Papua. Seventy-three languages are referred to in this checklist, twenty-five of which are Austronesian

(symbolized AN); forty-six Non-Austronesian (symbolized NAN), and two - Maisin and Doga - unclassified (i.e., have not yet been shown to belong to one or the other of the two genetic types just given). One, Muluha, is now extinct.

2.21. NON-AUSTRONESIAN LANGUAGES

These belong to eight families (indicated by words ending in *-an*, e.g., Koiarian) which occupy most of the mountainous interior of the tail of Papua. The number and definition of constituent languages of these families is now fairly complete except for the determination of some member languages of the Yareban and Binanderean Families and some boundary details (in terms of present-day villages) of Goilalan languages. A complete language list with available population figures is given in sub-section 2.23. below. Note that Mawai (Wilson (1968: 68)) is treated as a dialect of ZIA and Guhu-Samane as a Binanderean language after Hooley and McElhanon (1970:1075-76).

2.22. AUSTRONESIAN LANGUAGES

These are to be found mainly around the coast from Cape Possession eastwards. They have been well known for a long time though they have never been surveyed in the same way that NAN languages have. Consequently we do not yet have full details of their exact number, size, and internal composition. For the purposes of this paper therefore I have attempted to overcome this deficiency by classifying and defining them on the basis of earlier published accounts cross-checked against some lexicostatistical evidence from available short wordlists and against information kindly supplied to me by missionaries familiar with the linguistic situation in the Milne Bay area through Rev. Fr. K. Twomey, Catholic Mission, Trobriand Island. The result is that in the Milne Bay area the number of distinct languages has been considerably reduced, so that what have formerly been regarded as individual languages are now regarded as dialects of single languages which share up to around 60% basic vocabulary with each other. Thus the Sua language is here regarded as stretching from Gadaisu in Orangerie Bay in the west to Simagai and Sauagauaga in the east and as consisting of many dialects corresponding to such previously suggested "languages" as Bonarua, Dahuni, Daiomoni, Daui, Mugula, Logea and Sariba. Similarly Kehelala is seen here as consisting of the former "languages" Tavara, East Cape, Maiwara, Daruloia, and Basilaki (or Bohilai), and Wedau of Wedau proper, Taupota, Topura and Awalama. In the west, around Kairuku of the Central District, the situation has always been

much clearer. The only change which has been made is to group Bush Mekeo and Kovio¹ with Mekeo as dialects of Mekeo on the basis of a short word list collected in Kovio and Mekeo by Rev. B. Brown in the 1960's. These show approximately 85% correspondence in basic (non-cultural) vocabulary and because Bush Mekeo is geographically closer to Mekeo than Kovio is it is assumed that Bush Mekeo is probably also similarly dialectally related to Mekeo. Of course this is something that needs verification (as do other decisions just discussed) and if this publication serves to stimulate investigation of these cases then it will have been worthwhile. Meanwhile we do know that all the AN languages are closely related and Capell (1943) has suggested that they fall into distinguishable groups. In this checklist I have used Capell's groups (symbolized by capital roman numerals I-VIII) to correspond roughly to families among the NAN languages.

A complete list of AN languages with available population figures follows.

2.3. EARLIER PUBLISHED NAMES

These are taken from and are limited to those published in Ray (1929; 1938) and in Capell (1943; 1962). In some cases these names refer to old villages, groups, sections or "tribes", and/or to what were once thought to be separate languages. All are cross-referenced to present-day languages in the checklist below and most are to be found in *An Ethnographic Bibliography of New Guinea* already referred to.

3.0. PRESENTATION

In this listing language and village names are alphabetized together but distinguished by size of letter and type of information provided for each. Thus language names are capitalized and each entry contains information about its classification, dialectal composition, associated names in the linguistic literature, present-day villages and principal references. This information appears always in that order separated by semi-colons with brackets around the associated names. For example, the entry:

ABIA NAN/Yareban; ? dialects; (Buari, Doriaidi (= Dori-ai-di, Doriviata), Oiwa, Okaudi); Aimara, Arai'ia, Auwaka, Doma, Ianu, Kosiwara No.1, Kosiwara No.2; Dutton (1971a).

states that: (i) ABIA is a Non-Austronesian language of the Yareban Family;

- (ii) its dialectal composition is unknown;
- (iii) it (or parts of it) has (have) previously been referred to as Buari, Doriaidi (or Dori-ai-di, Doriviata), Oiwa and Okaudi;
- (iv) it is spoken in the present-day villages of Aimara, Arai'ia, Auwaka, Doma, Ianu, Kosiwara No.1, and Kosiwara No.2;

and (v) that the most recent discussion of this language is to be found in Dutton (1971a).

Austronesian and Unclassified languages have similar entries except that for Austronesian languages the capital roman numerals I-VIII indicate the group to which each belongs, as described in section 2.22. above. Thus, for example, the entry:

SUAU AN/III... states that SUAU is an Austronesian language of Group III, etc.

For villages only locational and linguistic information is given. The former is enclosed in brackets and gives the district (abbreviated according to the schema set out in the next section), sub-district and census division within which the village is found, together with the page reference to the *Village Directory*. The linguistic information consists solely of the name of the language (or languages) spoken therein together, sometimes, with dialectal information if the village belongs to a large language for which dialects have been suggested or established. If two or more languages are spoken in a particular village these will be entered and separated by a slash and the village starred, as, for example:

*Boteka (C.D., Pt. Moresby, West Coast, 17); KOITA/KOIARI.

Each such village is then entered under each language, so that in the example just given Boteka will appear in the village lists for both KOITA and KOIARI. Further information is then obtainable by looking up the language name entry. In addition to the above conventions other symbols are used to distinguish between villages of various sorts. These have been chosen for their combinatorial possibilities and are listed in section 4.0. below.
