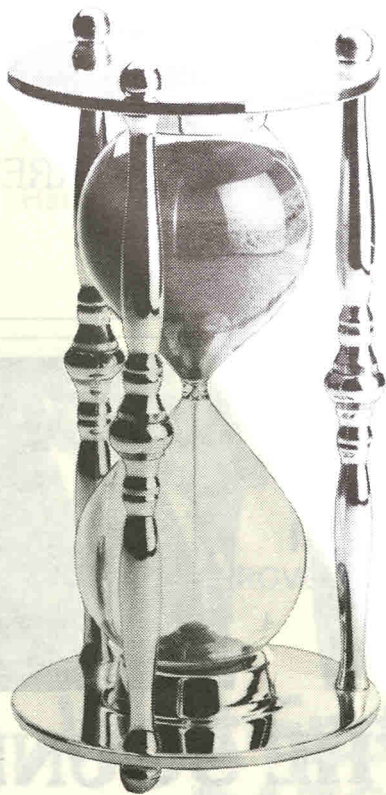

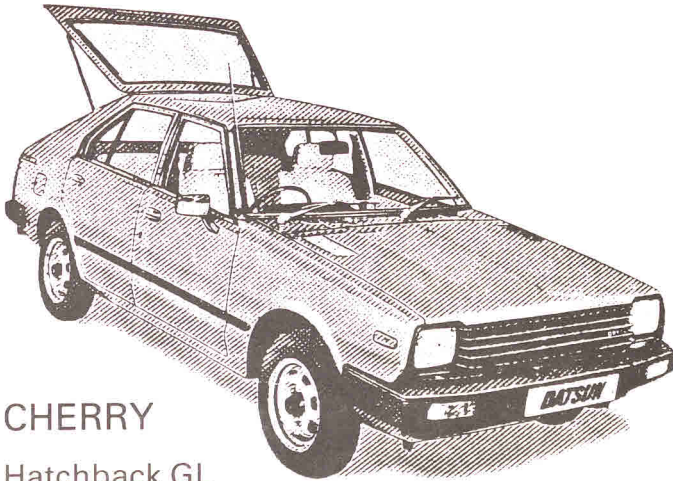

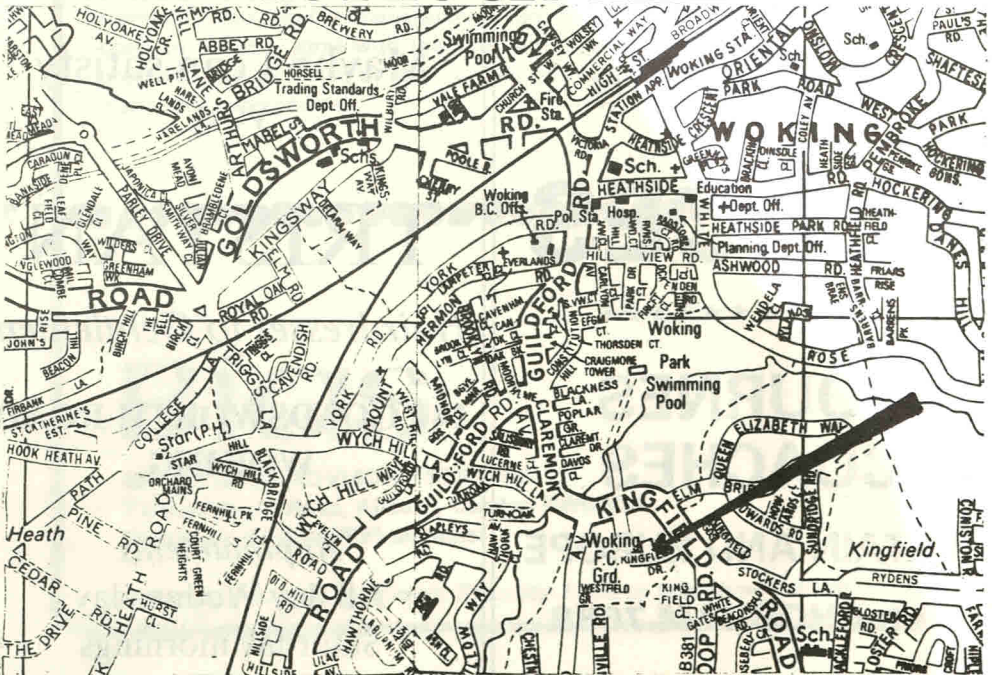

Brent Irish Advisory Service was established in 1978 and aims to promote the social and cultural welfare of Irish people and to improve their position in society through equality of opportunity.

We operate an Information Centre, which deals with telephone calls, letters, and drop-in callers, and also provides follow-up advice and welfare.

We offer information and advice on peoples' rights in Britain and Ireland, including housing, employment, education, legal and pensions; and on Irish cultural activities and classes, including an Ghaeilge, Irish dancing, traditional music, Gaelic games, and Irish Studies.

From this work has developed the Irish in Britain Directory, BIAS Short-life Housing Group, and BIAS Cultural Development Group.

Brent Irish Advisory Service is operated and controlled by its voluntary members who elect a management committee annually. Membership is open to all who agree with the aims and objects of the organisation, are proposed and seconded by two existing members, and are approved by the management committee.

Presenter: Game For A Laugh

Henry's career until **Game For A Laugh** had been mainly concerned with more serious things: he had worked in journalism and on Radio 4 on such programmes as **The World Tonight**, **Profile**, **Midweek** and, he says: 'Anywhere else I could find a studio to broadcast from – like the World Service, **Woman's Hour** and special-broadcasting'. He spent his first seven years in County Athlone and returned to Dublin in 1953 where he went to school at Belvedere College until 1964. Says Henry: 'James Joyce went to school there and so too did Terry Wogan'. Henry's two years of acting at University are coming in useful. Working on a series like **Game For A Laugh** is so different from anything he has done before that he finds that techniques he learned all those years ago are coming back to him now. His appearances on **Game For A Laugh** mark the 21st anniversary of his first ever TV appearance – in 1960 on an RTE programme in Dublin called **Teen Talk**. He appeared subsequently on many programmes of this type in his early teens but has a handful of programmes in this country, notably Eamonn Andrews' **Today** programme. His one complaint of this country is that the Guinness is nowhere near as smooth as in Ireland.
