

YOUR HEALTH-THEIR WEALTH!

157 BUILDING WORKERS WERE KILLED LAST YEAR

The latest accident figures are frightening. There are two deaths every week, and the incidence of reported major accidents is rising faster than ever. The truth is that 90% of so-called accidents could be prevented, since they are due to the negligence of management. Such negligence should be regarded as criminal and those responsible should be prosecuted in the crown court and imprisoned. No employer has ever been imprisoned in this country for causing the death of a worker. Instead they are fined an average of £400. This is not justice - this is an insult.

Health and Safety at Work: KNOW YOUR RESEARCE

Your employer has a legal duty to ensure your site is safe and healthy. In addition your site must have:

- * toilets and washing facilities with hot water
- supply of clean, fresh drinking water
- training and information on hazards
- protective clothing
 for work in rain,
 snow, sleet or hail
- * heated shelters
- * place to dry clothes
- place to heat and eat food

BUILDING

Despite legal duties and industry agreements, most building sites are death traps lacking many of the provisions listed above. Employers will try intimidation to stop you obtaining these basic rights. Your only hope of winning a safe workplace is to unite with your workmates and demand it.

Unions have health and safety experts, solicitors and researchers who will work for their members, defending their health, pay and conditions.



KEEP DEATH OFF BUILDING SITES

These services-all free to members. And trade union safety reps have many legal rights other workers do not have. Being in a union could save your life.

ORGANISATION

Accidents have killed over 1500 building workers in the last ten years. Bronchitis, cancer and other diseases of dust and lousy working conditions have killed in the region of 40,000 more. Injuries run into millions. The perennially cautious HSE admit that at least 500,000 were sufficiently badly injured to be off work for three days or more. The situation on site is getting worse.

Ill-health. In the event of a building worker evading the 'accidents' that cause a site injury once every couple of minutes and that kill 150 every year, other hazards lie in store. The incidence of many cancers, back injuries, respiratory diseases such as bronchitis, emphysema and asthma and of many others ailments are much higher in building workers than in the general population (Hazards 4, June 1985). As many as 4,000 building workers may die every year from industrial disease.

Not everyone on site is at risk. The chances of a site manager or agent dying of lung cancer before reaching retirement age is half that of the general population. A plasterer, by contrast, runs three times the risk of an early death from the disease as the boss (OCPS Occupational Mortality Decennial Supplement 1979-80, 1982-83). The story is repeated for other building trades and other diseases. For those at the dirty end, building work is a death sentence.


THE DEMANDS OF THE CAMPAIGN

The aims of the Construction Safety Campaign are:

• to get the labour and trade union movement to make deaths and serious injury in the construction industry a major political issue.

- for local authorities to refuse to employ contractors and sub contractors with a proven record of wilful and serious negligence in the matter of safety in construction.
- to make a prison sentence on the employer mandatory where gross negligence is proven, or in the event of death or serious injury.
- to ensure no sacking of workers who raise health and safety issues on sites and a statutory right to immediate reinstatement.
- to canvas the support of the medical profession.
