



Cleveland HOLC Redlining Map (1936)



J. A. Boersig Dies; Fireman-Lensman

Joseph A. Boersig, a retired member of the Fire Prevention Bureau of the years the chief photographer for the aryesterday in his home, 1855 Metzger Road, Valley City. He was 71. Mr. Boersig painted in oils and frequently had paintings and photographs in the Cleveland Art Museum May Shows. He joined the department in 1919 and after several years as a driver of a hook and ladder truck, became a photogra-

His photographs were used in investigations and later, when he also took motion pictures for the fire prevention bureau, the films were shown to firemen in training for duty with the department.


IN 1957 AND 1958, Mr. Boersig was chief of the state fire marshal's Cuyahoga County staff.

He maintained a lasting interest in volunteer fire departments and was a member of the Cuyahoga Firemen's Association and the American Association of Firemen Inc. He had studied art at the Cleveland Institute of Art and was a member of the Medina Creative Art League. He was an Army veteran of World War I and a member of the American Legion Post No. 339 of the Fire Department. Mr. Boersig retired from the fire department in 1948. 






