

# **DATA:**

This analysis is based on 282 sexual assaults reported to the Anchorage Police Department in 2001. More specifically, this analysis compares the 168 victims assaulted by nonstrangers to the 99 victims assaulted by strangers.

Among non-strangers, the most common relationships included acquaintances (30%), friends (27%), and boyfriends / girlfriends (12%).







