Aims	The School aims to create a high-quality distance learning programme that offers off-campus students a learning experience as rich as that provided in the classroom.				
Objectives	 To provide training and support that introduces staff to various distance learning technologies and methodologies, giving them confidence in selecting between and using various media and methods for teaching and assessment. To develop a template for distance learning modules that provides students with the necessary information and reading materials in a paper-based form, incorporates meaningful interaction with the material, and includes meaningful on-line discussions/activities to draw students into the learning community. To develop support systems and structures within the School to ensure that students have a high-quality learning experience. To pilot distance learning materials and use feedback from the pilot to improve future versions. To investigate barriers to making materials culturally relevant to students from different backgrounds and identify means to reduce or overcome these barriers. To prepare results on culturally-relevant materials for publication in a peer-reviewed journal. 				
Overview	 The project will support the School of Public Policy's initiative to create a distance learning version of the Public Service MBA with the aim of creating a high-quality programme that offers students a learning experience as rich as that provided in the classroom. The priorities will be: To facilitate interactive learning for DL students in order to create a robust and effective learning community; To develop and provide high-quality learner support to students; To support students from many different backgrounds / countries to learn from each other and be able to draw lessons that apply to their own situations.
