The Rainwater Basin of south-central Nebraska has attracted millions of migratory birds each spring for generations. During migration, millions of snow geese, Canada geese, white-fronted geese, ducks, and ½-million sandhill cranes use the Rainwater Basin and the adjacent Platte River. The shallow wetland basins and surrounding croplands of the area provide the birds with critical resting and feeding sites during their migration north.

The Waterfowl Production Areas (WPAs) of the Rainwater Basin Wetland Management District (WMD) are managed as grassland-playa lake ecosystems. The Rainwater Basin WMD staff currently manages 59 WPAs in the Rainwater Basin. Most of the WPAs must undergo extensive restoration to provide quality habitat for the millions of migrating birds. To restore wetlands, WMD staff employ a variety of management techniques such as pumping groundwater, prescribed burning, grazing, filling in pits, removing trees, and clearing non-native plants. These lands, once used for agricultural purposes, are now reseeded to recover the native plant communities.

About this Bird List

The species listed in this leaflet have all been observed in the WPAs. All species names are in accordance with the *A.O.U. Check-list of North American Birds*, 7th edition, 1998. For clarity, some of the former names are shown in parentheses.

Nesting species documented in the WPAs are marked with a round bullet (•) in front of the species name. Some species may be seen during the nesting season, but are not marked as nesters in the WPAs. These birds may be seen, but their nests or nesting behavior have not been documented on the WPAs. For

example, frequent nesters in the area, such as northern rough-winged swallows, are not marked as nesters on the WPAs because the WPAs do not provide their preferred nesting habitat.

Please report any additional sightings to the WMD staff.

Seasonal Abundance Definitions:

The definitions for the seasonal categories used in this bird list are listed below. Please note that seasonal abundance codes for some species such as shorebirds may be misleading because their fall migration starts in July or August (Summer season). For example, the Pectoral Sandpiper is coded as ccc_. The bird is commonly seen in Spring, and in the Summer, when peak migration occurs in mid-August, and in the Fall. It is not seen in Winter.

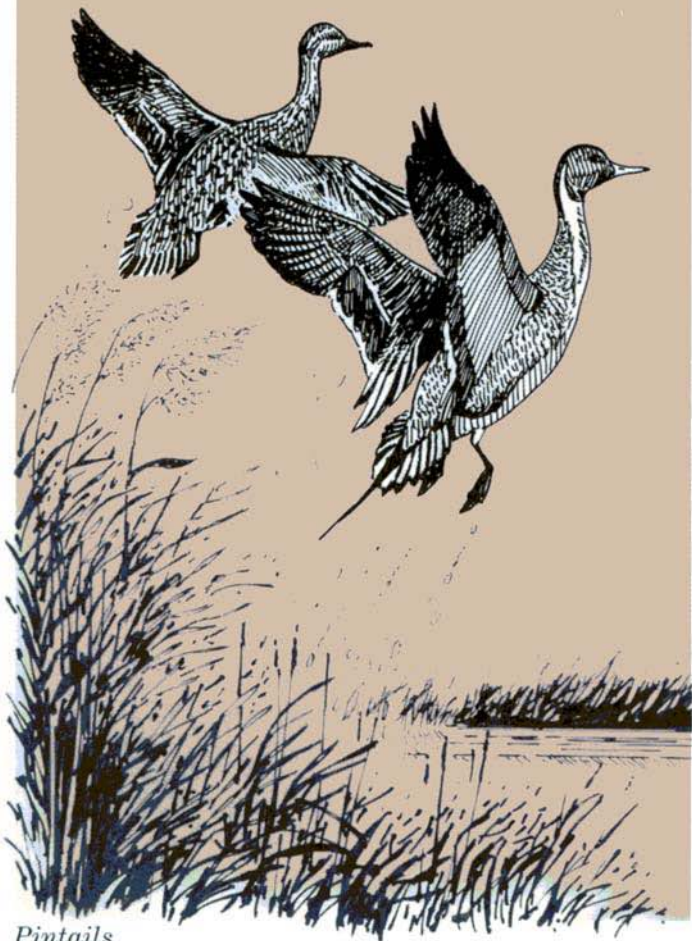

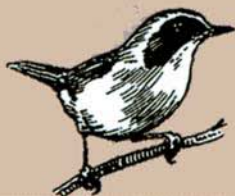

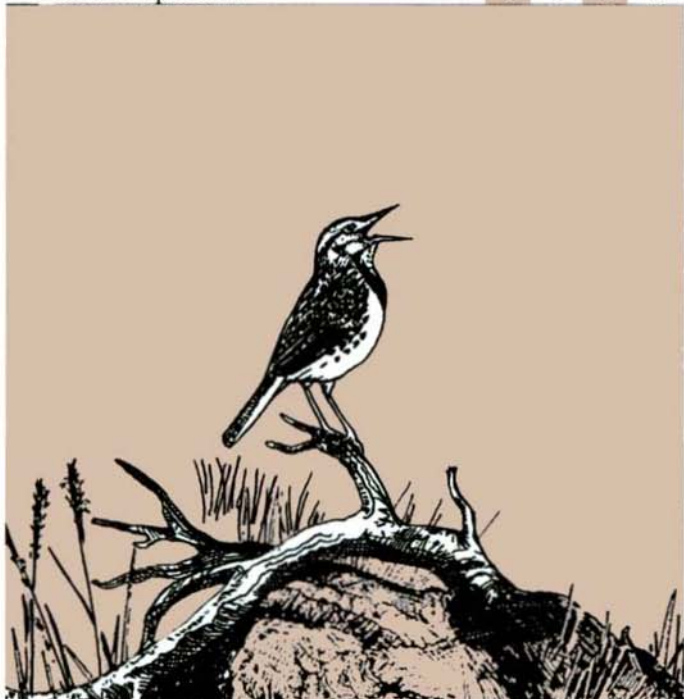
