


Figure 1: Location of stickers on Digbeth




Figure 2: Digbeth overall signage – languages




Figure 3: Stickers on Digbeth – languages




Figure 4: Digbeth overall signage – discourse types




Figure 5: Stickers on Digbeth – discourse types




Figure 6: Stickers on Digbeth – contexts of agency




Figure 7: Stickers on Digbeth – semiotic codification
