



Prevalence of and Predictive Factors for Burnout Among French Urologists in Training

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Résumé en anglais	The burnout rate among young doctors currently seems to be increasing [1]. It is essential to be able to diagnose and prevent this condition to better take care of young caregivers. Burnout is defined as a “feeling of intense exhaustion, loss of control and inability to achieve concrete results at work” according to the World Health Organisation. The assessment questionnaire used most often is the Maslach Burnout Inventory (MBI), which covers (1) emotional exhaustion, (2) depersonalisation, and (3) personal accomplishment [2].
