Non-members will be added to the mailing list (at no cost) as long as they wish to have it sent, on request, and as long as funds are available for this. Obviously, we hope you will find this, and *Insecta Mundi* worth the expense of membership, only \$35.00 per year.

We are adopting the publication procedure used by the Entomological Society of America for their newsletter. We are publishing a four to eight page "hard copy" edition which will be mailed by first class postage to the United State, Canada, and Mexico.
