Robert M. Diamond and Edward F. Kelly have information on the Planning for the Evaluation of Programs and Agencies (PEPA) Questionnaire which was designed as part of a systematic process to assist those involved with the administration of academic agencies or departments in selecting the criteria by which the success of that unit will be judged. The recommended procedure for use of PEPA requires that all major groups and individual decision makers who have responsibilities within or for a specific agency or unit actually participate in the evaluation process. The criteria that are established ideally should be agreed to and understood by all. Diamond and Kelly will provide you a copy of the guidelines for

the administration, analysis, and interpretation of the PEPA Questionnaire and will grant permission for the duplication and use of the questionnaire so long as proper credit is given to the authors. Their procedure was developed through extensive input from POD Members.
