

GAMMA SIGMA DELTA

GAMMA SIGMA DELTA is a faculty governed society that selects its members from junior and senior students, graduate students, faculty, and alumni for the promotion and recognition of high achievement. While Gamma Sigma Delta is an honor society of agriculture, it may elect members from related fields such as biology, botany, chemistry, economics, entomology, family and consumer sciences, forestry, natural resources, plant pathology, sociology, statistics, veterinary medicine, or zoology when the work of the individual is related to agriculture. Officers, committee chairpersons, and others leading the chapter are faculty or alumni.

Election to membership is conducted by the faculty at the local chapter level in accordance with International and Nebraska chapter bylaws. Juniors, seniors, graduate students, faculty, and alumni in agriculture and related sciences meeting criteria listed below are eligible for membership.

<u>Undergraduate Students</u>: Junior and senior students who scholastically rank in the upper 15 percent of their class and show promise of leadership may be nominated for membership each year. No more than 15 percent of the senior class can be members of Gamma Sigma Delta.

<u>Graduate Students</u>: Graduate students of outstanding ability who show great potential for future leadership in agriculture can be nominated by chapter members and elected.

<u>Faculty</u>: Faculty with at least three years of work in agriculture and related sciences who have outstanding performance and achievement in the areas of teaching, research, and/or extension are eligible for election.

<u>Alumni:</u> Alumni are eligible for election five or more years after graduation if they have provided outstanding service to agriculture and have demonstrated their worthiness of the honor.

3,952 members have been initiated into the Nebraska Chapter since May 25, 1918. Members are now located in approximately 20 states and in numerous countries around the world. At the present time, there are 52 active chapters in 41 states, one territory (Puerto Rico), and two countries (Honduras and The Philippines).

EARLY INTERNATIONAL HISTORY

The organization first came into existence at Ohio State University, December 1, 1905, under the name of Delta Theta Sigma. Chapters of the Agricultural Colleges in Iowa, Pennsylvania, Missouri, Utah, and Oregon later were installed. All except the parent chapter adhered strictly to the honorary plan and felt that the unity of the organization demanded that there be no chapter houses maintained. The honorary chapters, therefore, in 1913 withdrew from all use of the old name and adopted the name Gamma Sigma Delta. The Ohio State Chapter retained the original name. Under the name of Gamma Sigma Delta chapters were installed in Kansas and Alabama. On March 10, 1916, a new organization known as the Agricultural Honor Society of America was established at the University of Minnesota. Since the purposes of the two honorary movements were the same, a merger was accomplished May 11, 1917 and the organization then became known as the Honor Society of Agriculture, Gamma Sigma Delta. The Nebraska Chapter was the first chapter installed on May 25, 1918 under the new name. At the present time, there are 54 active chapters in 41 states, one territory and three countries.

These charter members were installed by John O. Rankin of the Iowa State Chapter. He later became a rural sociologist in the Department of Rural Economics at the University of Nebraska from 1923 to 1930. The installation took place in the office of Dean Edgar A. Burnett in Agricultural Hall. During the ceremony, Professor Rankin gave the prospective members a brief history of Gamma Sigma Delta, described the plan of organization, and outlined the aims of the founders. The departmental names listed after the charter member names are those in use at the time of installation of the chapter in 1918.

CHAPTER ANNUAL EVENTS

The Nebraska Chapter of Gamma Sigma Delta currently holds two major events each year, with other events offered as needed. The first event is the Annual Awards and Initiation Banquet, held in late January. Previously, a Scholarship Recognition Dinner was planned, but many of those activities have since been incorporated into the Annual Awards and Initiation Banquet. The second event is the Fall Gamma Sigma Delta Symposium held in late September or early October, with a topic of current interest to students and faculty.

In preparation for the Awards and Initiation Banquet, the Chapter identifies the top 15 percent of the Sophomore and Junior students in the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources, and the College of Education and Human Sciences. These students are recognized for their high scholastic achievement. The Juniors on the list, along with outstanding Seniors from both Colleges, are invited to join Gamma Sigma Delta. Additionally, they are encouraged to apply for the Outstanding Senior, and the Outstanding Undergraduate (previously called the Sophomore Award) Student Award. The highest ranking student in each category is given a certificate, a monetary award and their names are engraved on the "Gamma Sigma Delta Commendation for Excellence in Scholarship" plaque currently on display in C.Y. Thompson Library. The Outstanding Senior award was initiated in 1961 and the Undergraduate Award in 1962. Through January 2017, 68 seniors and 72 sophomores/juniors have been recognized by the Chapter. A list of Sophomore/Junior recipients is included on pages 15-16, and a list of Senior recipients is on pages 17-18.

In 2009, the chapter began recognizing an outstanding graduate student for the year. Graduate Students submit applications and the Scholarship Committee selects the awardee. The recipient receives a certificate and a monetary award. Since 2009, seven outstanding graduate students have been recognized (page 18).

Faculty and Alumni awards are also presented at the initiation and awards meeting. The chapter awards certificates to selected members for excellence in teaching, extension and research. A citation is read for each recipient at the presentation of the award by the respective dean of that division. The Teaching Award of Merit was started in 1963 and the list of recipients is on pages 11-12 of this history. The Extension and Research Awards of Merit were not started until 1980 and the lists of recipients are on pages 13-15 of this history. Plaques for each division are on display in C.Y. Thompson Library with name plates for each of the 55 teachers, 38 extension specialists and 38 researchers honored to date.

The Nebraska Chapter also presents to a member or members its Award of Merit for Distinguished Service to Agriculture at this banquet. This award was started in 1956 and to date there have been 102 recipients and they are listed on pages 9-10 of this history.

At the annual initiation and awards banquet the immediate past president of the chapter is given a plaque provided by the International Gamma Sigma Delta Association. At 10 previous banquets the Nebraska Chapter has had the honor of having the International Distinguished Service to Agriculture Award presented to a chapter member. These 10 members are listed on page 4 of this history. The most recent presentation was made to Dr. Martin A. Massengale in 2008. In 1983 the Nebraska Chapter was presented the Outstanding Chapter Award by the International Association. A plaque was awarded for having the best program of activities of any chapter for that year. This plaque hangs in the C.Y. Thompson Library.

The other annual event of the chapter is the Annual Business meeting usually held in September or October at the Fall Gamma Sigma Delta Symposium (considerable business is now conducted by e-mail notice and voting). Business as needed, is taken care of at the meeting and the nomination process for officers and new members is initiated. There is also a call made for nominations for the various member awards to be presented at the annual awards banquet. In the past, at this meeting a new treasurer for the following calendar year is elected. This person progresses through the offices from treasurer, to secretary, to president-elect, and finally to president. The historian and membership chairperson are appointed to an indefinite term of office. Currently officers are installed and begin their term in January.

Every two years, Gamma Sigma Delta holds an International Conclave at one of the chapters. The Nebraska Chapter has been fortunate to send at least one delegate to each of these biennial conclaves for a number of years. From June 6 to 8, 1982 Nebraska was the host chapter for the conclave. The theme for the program was "The Agricultural Brain Drain." At that meeting, 35 delegates from 23 chapters were in attendance plus a number of Nebraska chapter members. A speaker at that meeting was Dr. Martin A. Massengale, Chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Later Dr. Massengale served a term as the President of the University of Nebraska and was an active member of the chapter.

The 2014 Gamma Sigma Delta Biannual Conclave was held on the University of Nebraska-Lincoln campus June 2-4, 2014. The conclave proceedings were a call to action and the challenge was presented to transform Gamma Sigma Delta with the Synergy of Tradition, New Ideas and New Partnerships. Thirty-five participants representing 14 Gamma Sigma Delta Chapters in 13 states and Honduras participated in the conclave.

Another event that was conducted at the Scholarship Recognition Dinner from 1980-1996 was to recognize outstanding students for the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources Alumni Association. These individuals received a second year of membership in the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Alumni Association without having to pay dues. This award was given to 29 students from 1980 to 1996 when it was discontinued. The list of these senior recipients is on page 20 of this history.
