In the Academic Senate Constitution and Bylaws, there is no built-in sexual bias. It is our cultural heritage which tends to slow the progress of equality. Formation of this standing committee on women will be helpful in overcoming cultural bias.

Your wholehearted approval followed by implementation of committee goals is recommended.
