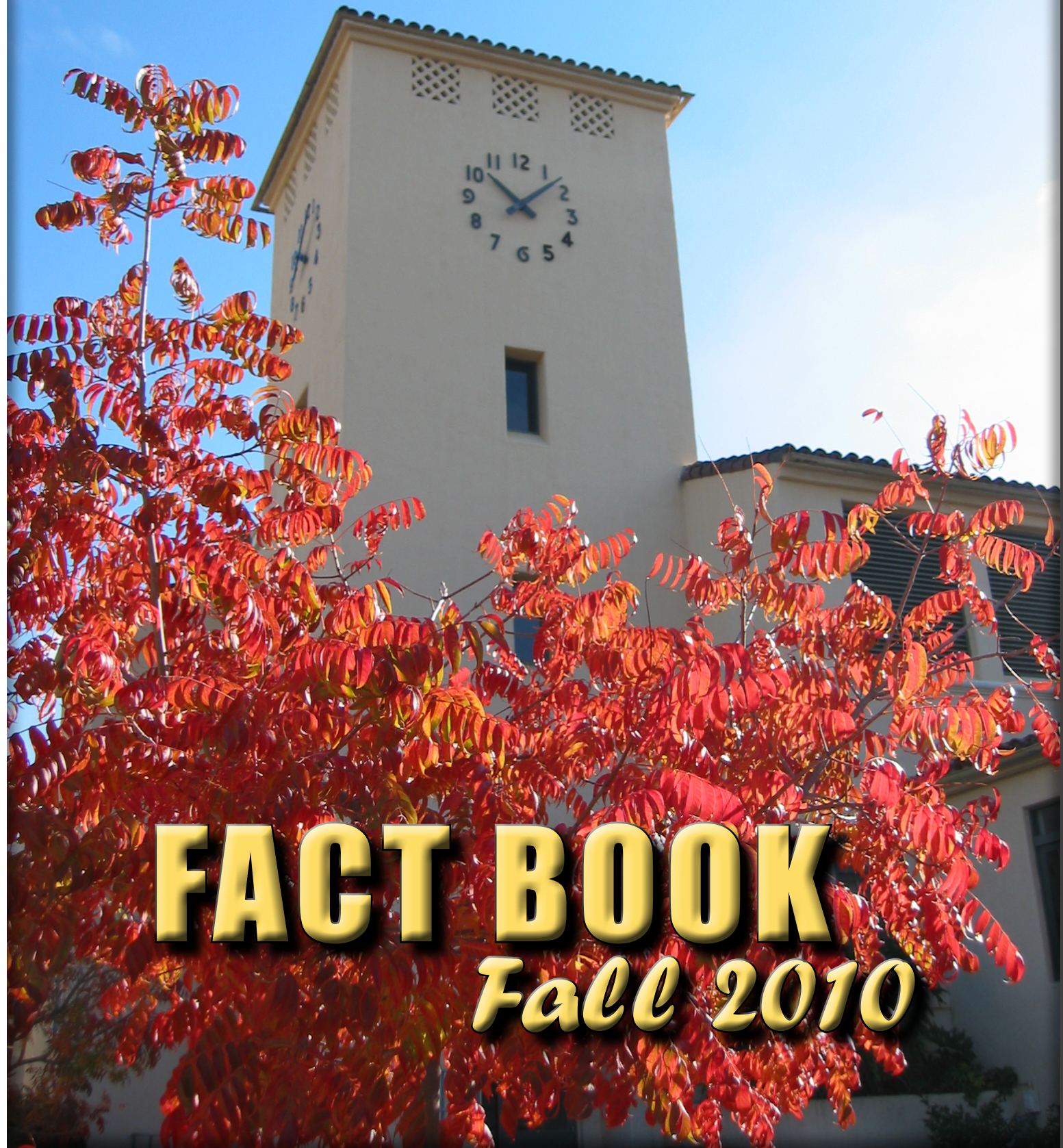

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Milestones, Cal Poly Historical Facts

- 1901** Legislation founding the California Polytechnic School signed into law.
- 1902** Leroy Anderson appointed first director of Cal Poly.
- 1903** First classes held with a total enrollment of 15 women and men.
- 1929** Legislation passed limiting enrollment to men only.
- 1933** Julian A. McPhee, Chief of the Bureau of Agricultural Education, appointed Cal Poly President, moving the Bureau headquarters to Cal Poly.
- 1936** Third year of instruction added to make Cal Poly a technical school.
- 1937** Cal Poly renamed California State Polytechnic School by the California State Legislature.
- 1940** State Board of Education authorized granting of Bachelor of Science degrees upon completion of fourth year and changed School to College.
- 1942** In June, the first BS degrees awarded to 24 men.
- 1943 to 1946** During World War II, military training contracts brought two Navy programs to the campus: Naval Flight Preparatory School and Naval Academic Refresher Unit Program. Civilian enrollment down to 80.
- 1947** Legislation passed officially changing all Education Code references to Cal Poly from School to College.
- 1956** Women students again admitted to Cal Poly.
- 1961** On July 1, control over 17 state colleges changed from the State Board of Education to the newly created State Board of Trustees.
- 1966** President McPhee retired after 33 years as Chief Executive Officer.
- 1967** Robert E. Kennedy appointed Cal Poly President.
- 1972** Renamed California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo.
- 1979** Warren J. Baker appointed Cal Poly President.
- 1996** Cal Poly Plan implemented.
- 2001** New Cal Poly Master Plan approved by California State University Board of Trustees.
- 2002** Students approve college-based fees to support education quality.
- 2010** For 18th year running, rated best public-master's university in the West by U.S. News & World Report.
- 2010** President Warren J. Baker retires after 31 years; Robert Glidden is named interim Cal Poly President.
- 2011** Jeffrey D. Armstrong appointed 9th permanent Cal Poly President.

Cal Poly's Mission Statement

Cal Poly fosters teaching, scholarship, and service in a learn-by-doing environment in which students, staff, and faculty are partners in discovery. As a polytechnic university, Cal Poly promotes the application of theory to practice. As a comprehensive institution, Cal Poly provides a balanced education in the arts, sciences, and technology, while encouraging cross-disciplinary and cocurricular experiences. As an academic community, Cal Poly values free inquiry, cultural and intellectual diversity, mutual respect, civic engagement, and social and environmental responsibility.

Statement of Purpose

When the legislature established Cal Poly in 1901, it acknowledged the need for varied educational opportunities and outlined special goals for this institution. Those special goals were reaffirmed by the Trustees of the California State University and Colleges and the Legislature in 1961 when Cal Poly's enabling act was revised and reenacted.

Certain functions of the California Polytechnic State University are held in common with all California State University campuses, while others are unique to Cal Poly. "The primary function is the provision of undergraduate instruction and graduate instruction through the master's degree (Education Code 66608). In addition to the functions provided by Section 66608, the California State Polytechnic University shall be authorized to emphasize the applied fields of agriculture, engineering, business, home economics, and other occupational and professional fields" (Education Code 90404).

Cal Poly undergraduate students identify their majors from the beginning of their Cal Poly career. Students select majors at the time they apply for admission, and they take courses in their majors starting in their first year. This gives them a chance to decide early if they have chosen a field that is appropriate to their interests and abilities. It also helps students associate with faculty and other students in their field, share common interests, and learn in a supportive atmosphere.

Learn by Doing

Learn by Doing has been the cornerstone of Cal Poly's educational methodology since its inception. Over the past century, Cal Poly has evolved from a vocational school into a premier comprehensive polytechnic university, with its special hands-on teaching approach at the core of the curriculum. Classes emphasize active-learning methods and include a high proportion of laboratory and field work. Activities both on and off campus provide opportunities to apply classroom theory to real-world situations. Cal Poly's primary focus is helping students succeed, which is defined as an expectation that students admitted to Cal Poly should make timely progress to earning their degrees. Cal Poly's faculty and staff are focused on helping students complete their degrees through active advising of students and through the nurturing of student-faculty interactions in the classroom, laboratories, and cocurricular activities.

Cal Poly emphasizes a complete education that teaches students to think logically, evaluate critically, and communicate clearly. Instruction incorporates the ideals of a good work ethic, honesty, and the acceptance of individual differences. The university promotes an effective education that will instill an appreciation for lifelong learning. Cal Poly is committed to student success and excellence in all areas of education.

University Plans

Access to Excellence (May 2008)

Access to Excellence focuses on the intersection of the California State University (CSU) with the economic, political, and social environment of the State of California. As a new strategic plan that builds upon and succeeds *Cornerstones*, *Access to Excellence* anticipates what the people of the state will need from the CSU in the next decade, and generally indicates how best to position the institution to meet those needs. It is a public statement of the principles and core values of the institution, framing broad strategic goals as the basis for setting the CSU's priorities and measuring its success over the next several years. Cal Poly Master Plan (March 21, 2001)

Looking toward the 21st century and the growing demand for higher education in the state of California, Cal Poly has applied the results of strategic planning efforts at the divisional and college levels to inform its long-term enrollment planning. The campus completed a physical master plan update based on these academic plans and enrollment scenarios. The Campus Planning Committee, consisting of campus and community representatives, oversees implementation of the plan. The California State University Board of Trustees approved the Master Plan and Environmental Impact Report (EIR) on March 21, 2001, after intensive comment from the campus and community. The Cal Poly Plan

During the 1995-96 academic year, a steering committee representing organized campus constituency groups prepared the Cal Poly Plan. According to a set of principles including broad consultation, modest enrollment growth, and accountability for investments and outcomes, the Cal Poly Plan (a focused implementation of the Strategic Plan) seeks ways to enhance student learning, decrease student time to degree, enhance the productivity of faculty and staff, promote the more effective use of fixed resources, and implement comprehensive assessment and accountability procedures. The plan is funded through a partnership of the state, the university, patrons, and students and their families. By matching a campus-based academic fee with external sources, Cal Poly has sponsored educational initiatives to consolidate curricula, introduce technology-mediated instruction, and add 16 faculty positions. The Cal Poly Strategic Plan (Drafted for University Consideration 2011)

Cal Poly's Strategic Plan is a means to guide the university over the next several years. Embodying the university's Mission Statement, it seeks to establish a direction for achieving the goals and priorities that will direct future planning, resource allocation, and decision making. The policies address the following topics: academic programs, faculty scholarship, staff professional growth and achievement, student satisfaction, diversity, governance and collegiality, institutional size, and university relations and image. University Accreditation

Since 1951, Cal Poly has been fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (a.k.a. WASC, which may be reached at 985 Atlantic Avenue, Suite 100, Alameda, California 94501, telephone 510-748-9001). To reaffirm its accreditation, the university is conducting a self-study entitled "Our Polytechnic Identity in the 21st Century," which focuses on the themes of Learn by Doing, the Teacher-Scholar Model, and Integration and Student Learning. The university has completed the first, proposal-oriented phase of the self-study and the second, resource-oriented phase known as Capacity and Preparatory Review; the latter included a site visit in February 2010. The university is in the last phase of the self-study known as Educational Effectiveness Review, which will include a site visit in April 2012. Administrative Organization

Four Administrative Divisions

The university is organized administratively into four divisions: Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Administration and Finance, and University Advancement. The academic division is organized into six colleges, each with its own dean. Academic Affairs also includes the Library, Research and Graduate Programs, and Information Technology Services. Other Special Programs that Support the University Mission

The Alumni Association keeps in touch with many of the 150,000 students who have attended Cal Poly through a variety of alumni functions, both educational and social, on and off campus, throughout California, and across the nation (<http://www.alumni.calpoly.edu/>).

Associated Students, Inc., (ASI) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation owned and operated by Cal Poly student leaders. ASI has an annual operating budget in excess of \$12 million. ASI provides cocurricular experiences for students, faculty, and staff, including events, speakers, concerts, intramural sports, fitness programs, aquatics, outdoor adventure trips, craft center enrichment courses, and child development. ASI manages the University Union, Recreation Center, Sports Complex, and Children's Center, totalling more than 450,000 square feet of campus facilities (<http://www.asi.calpoly.edu/>).

Cal Poly Continuing Education provides access to degree, certificate, and professional development programs and services of the university to the citizens of San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, and Monterey Counties and through distance learning technologies to students across the country (<http://www.continuing-ed.calpoly.edu/>).

Cal Poly Corporation is a public-benefit, nonprofit corporation and university auxiliary. It provides commercial services, fiscal services, and key support services to assist and promote the educational mission of Cal Poly and the California State University System (CSU). The Corporation engages only in those activities ancillary to state operation that are requested by Cal Poly's President and approved by the CSU (<http://www.calpolycorporation.org/>).

The Cal Poly Foundation is an auxiliary organization and IRC 501(c)(3) public charity that accepts and administers tax deductible gifts to the university. The Cal Poly Foundation leads campus philanthropic activity by supporting fundraising activities and investing and managing the campus endowments. Cal Poly Housing Corporation (CPHC) is also a public-benefit, nonprofit corporation and university auxiliary. The CPHC provides the university with certain services and facilities that by law cannot be financially supported by the state government. Its purpose is to develop, provide, and maintain affordable housing for faculty and staff consistent with the teaching, research, and community service mission of the university (<http://www.cphousingcorp.org>).

Admissions Profile

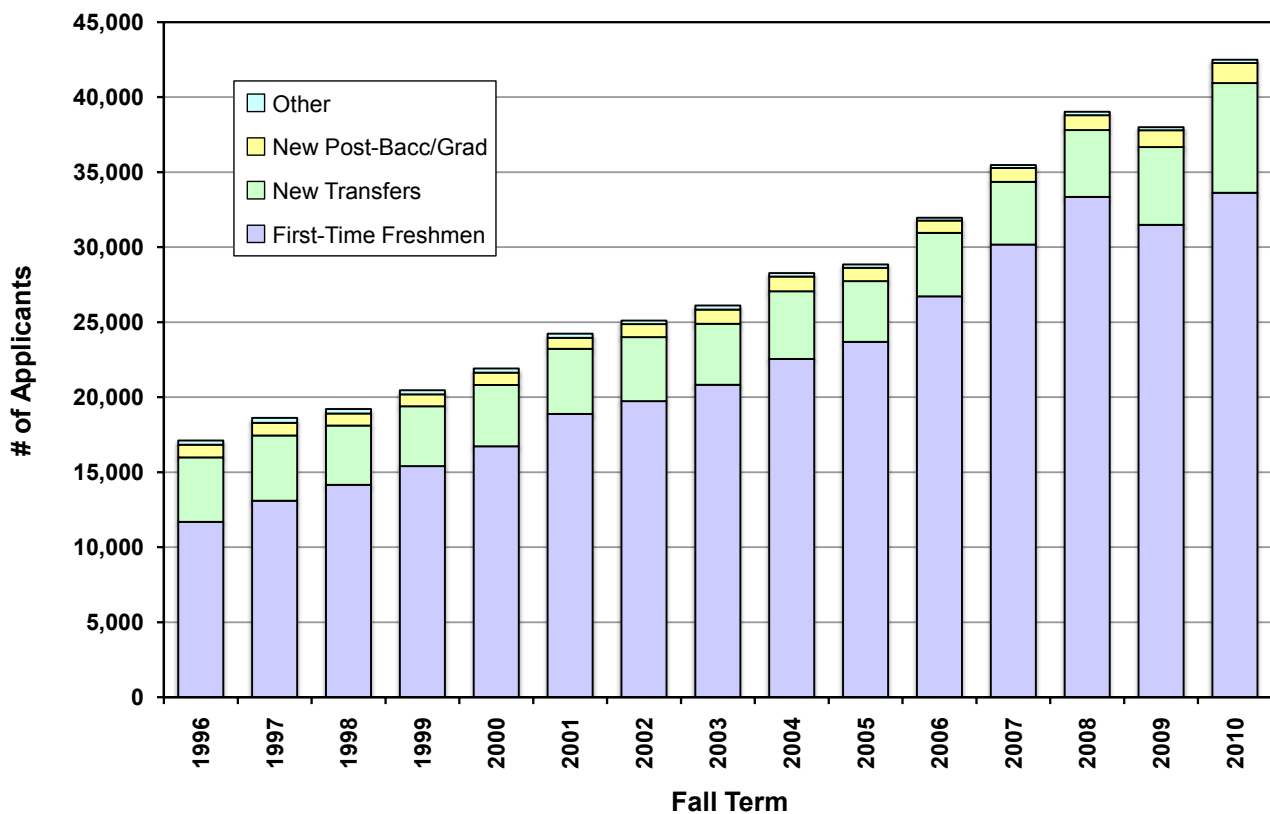
There were 42,495 total applications in Fall 2010, which is an increase of 11.8% from last year. The number of total applications has increased from a low of 13,441 in Fall 1993 to an all-time high of 42,495 in Fall 2010.

Fall 2010 first-time freshmen (FTF) applications increased by 2,138 (6.8%) from last year to an all-time high after last year's drop from a steady climb since Fall 1993.

Fall 2010 new transfer applications have been up and down over the years. New transfer applications are up 41.0% from last year to an all-time high of 7,313.

Fall 2010 new post-baccalaureate/graduate applications increased 19.1% from last year, also an all-time high.

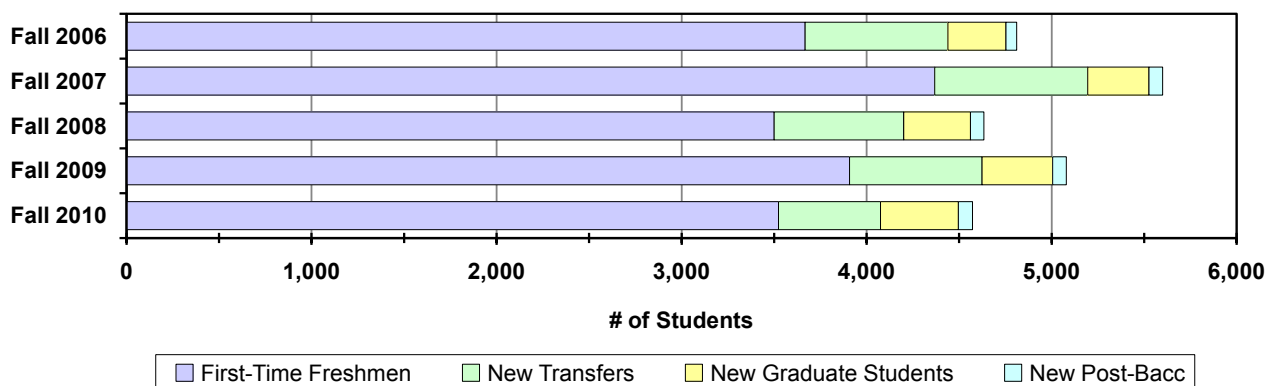

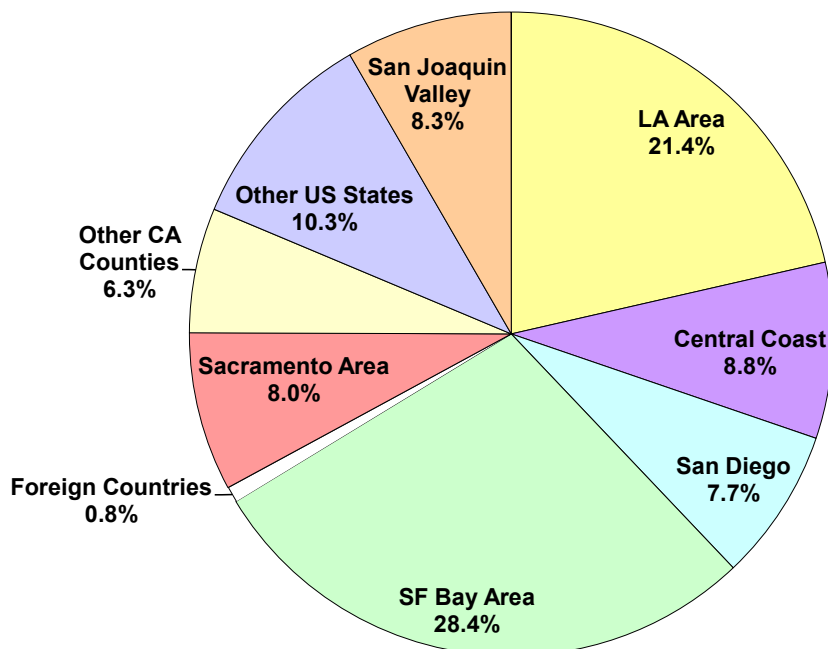

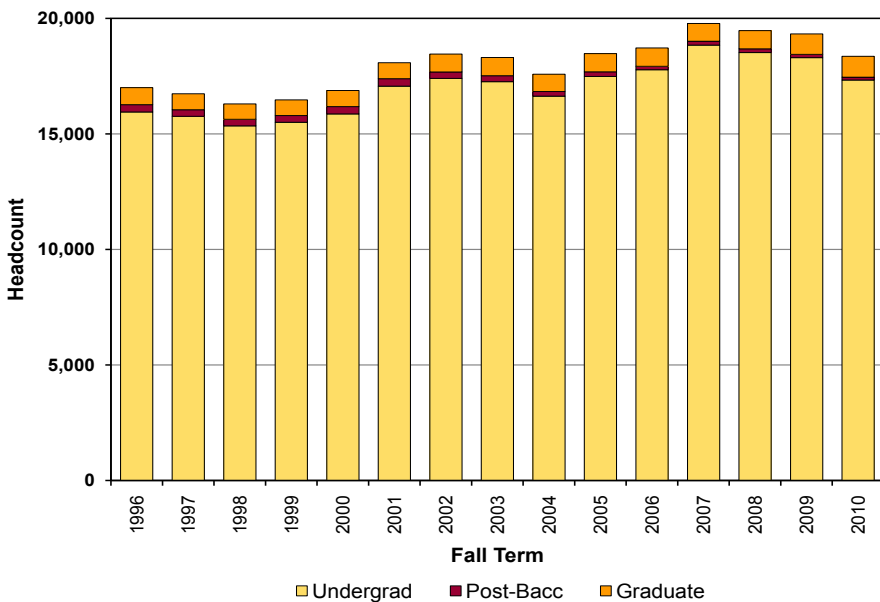

Due to a decrease in the state budget, Cal Poly decreased its enrollment in Fall 2010. The 18,360 total students enrolled is a 5.0% decrease from Fall 2009.

The decrease in enrollment occurred in both undergraduate and post-baccalaureate student populations. Undergraduate headcount enrollment decreased 5.3% from Fall 2009. Post-baccalaureate headcount, which is comprised mostly of credential students, decreased 14.9% from Fall 2009.

Graduate enrollment rose to 908 students in Fall 2010, an increase of 2.9% from Fall 2009.

Notes: Post-baccalaureate category consists of credential and non-degree-seeking students. Graduate category consists of students who are pursuing master's degrees.

Beginning in Fall 2008, second-bachelor's students are counted as undergraduates to conform with federal reporting standards.

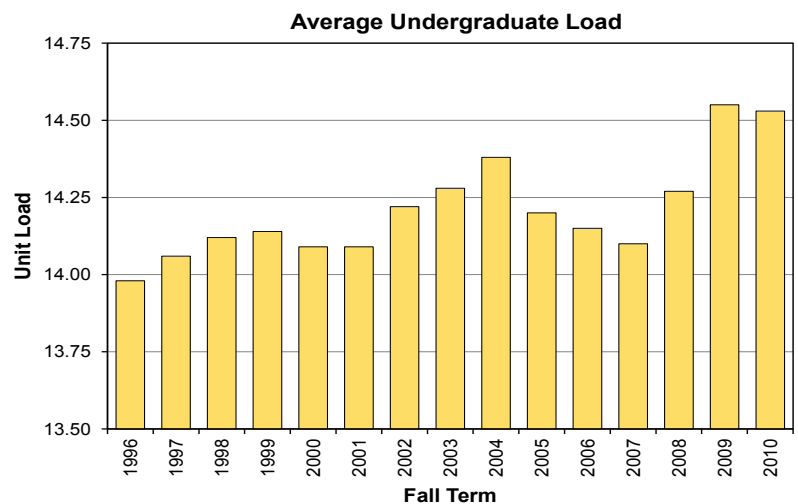

The Fall 2010 undergraduate average unit load dropped to 14.53 from a record high of 14.55 in Fall 2009, which had also been the largest one-year increase on record.

Registration procedures in Fall 2009 differed from previous Fall terms in that new freshmen were block scheduled, and continuing students registered earlier than usual (in May as opposed to August). The differences in these registration patterns likely contributed to the increase in average loads.

The graduate student average unit load increased to 11.26 in Fall 2010 from a drop to 10.98 in Fall 2009, after climbing from Fall 2005 through Fall 2008.

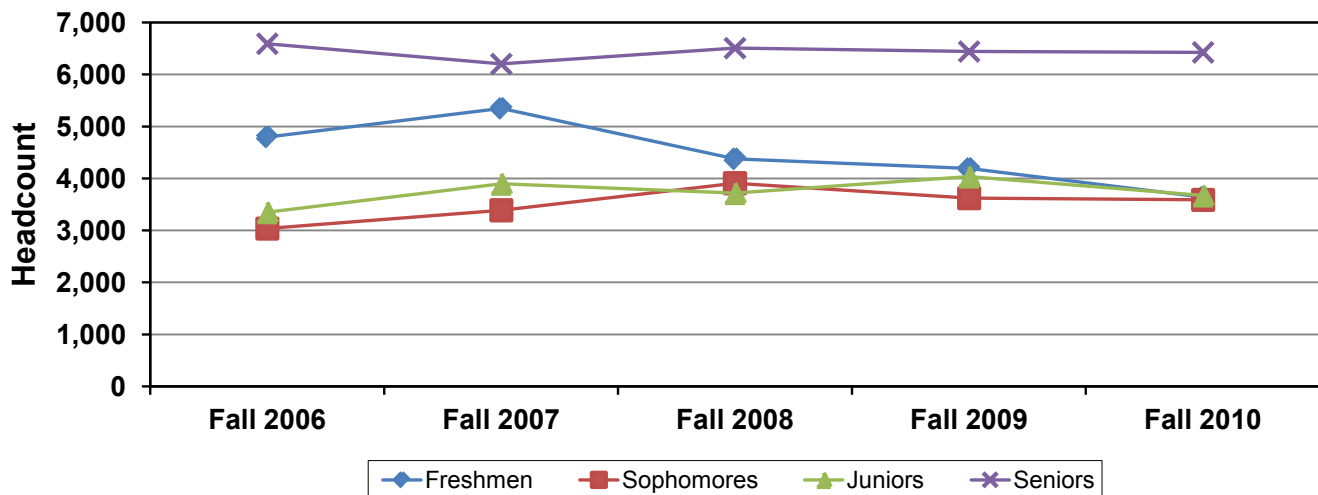

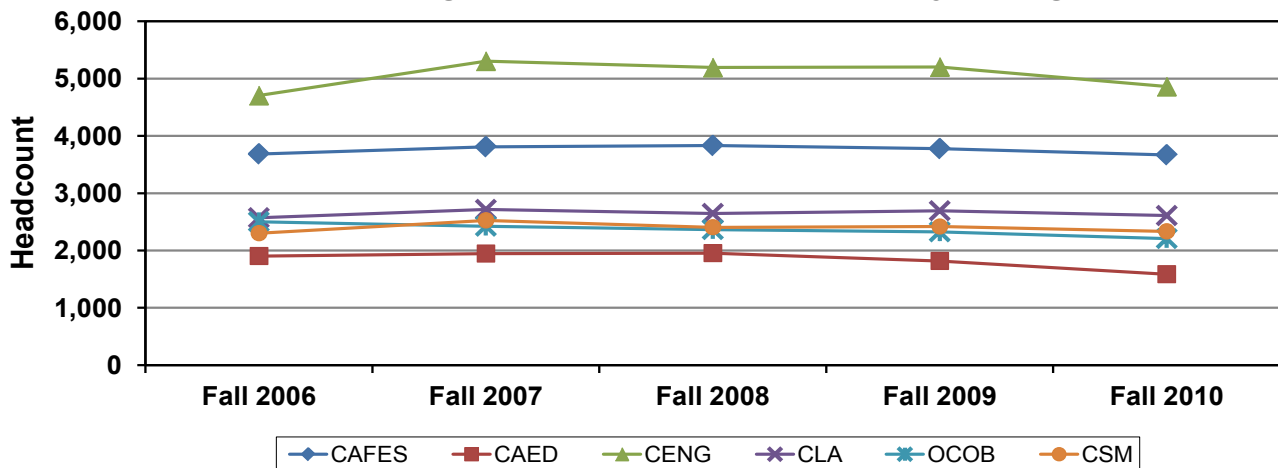

Degrees Awarded Profile

The number of degrees awarded has fluctuated from year to year. Cal Poly had a low of 3,109 degrees awarded in college year 1990-1991 and a high of 4,503 degrees awarded in college year 2009-10. College year 1996-1997 also showed a low point in the trends, while the most recent five college years are higher than any of the previous years.

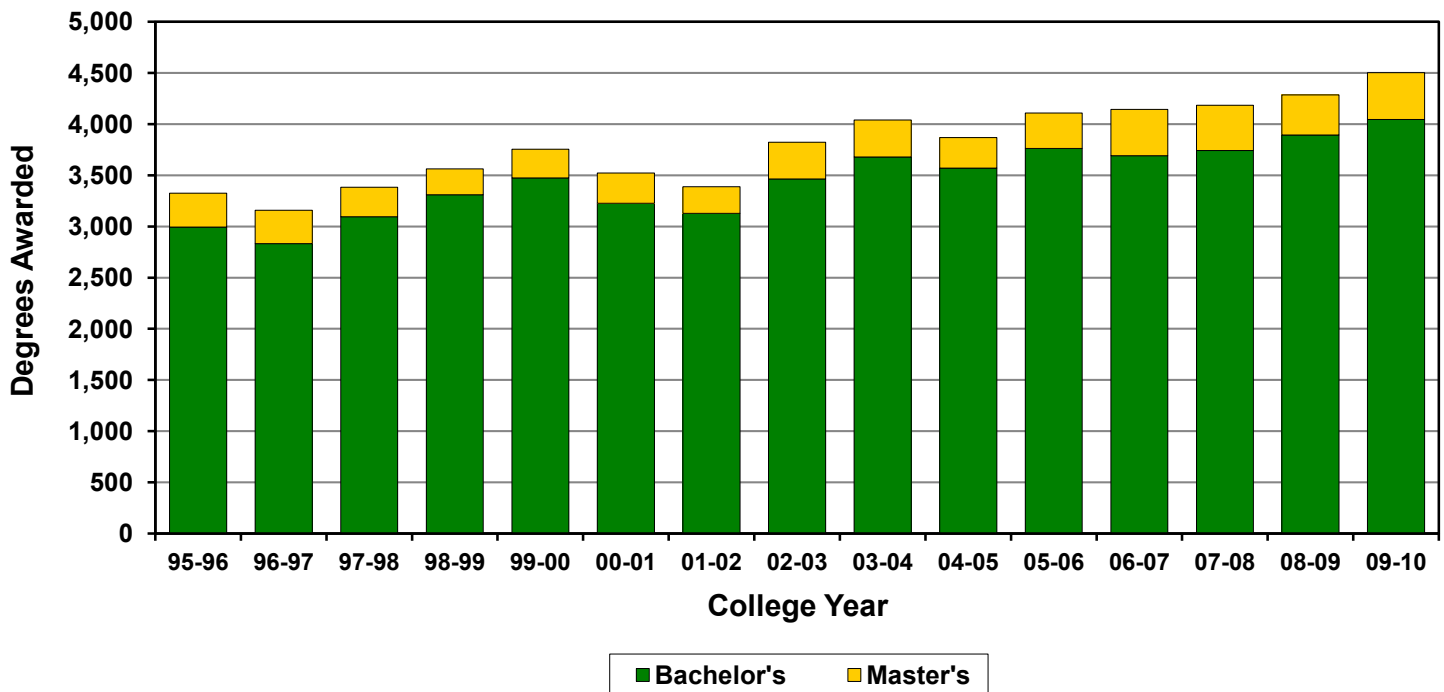
Cal Poly awarded 4,044 bachelor's degrees in college year 2009-2010. This is a 3.9% increase from college year 2008-09.

Cal Poly awarded 459 master's degrees in college year 2009-10. This is a 17.1% increase from college year 2008-09.

Notes:

- A college year consists of all four academic quarters, with the Summer quarter as a lead quarter (e.g., Summer 2008 is part of college year 2008-2009).
- Institutional Planning & Analysis now reports degrees awarded based on the students' actual term of completion rather than the date the degree was posted, as was done in earlier publications. While this allows for more accurate reporting of actual completion as well as more appropriate graduation rate reporting, these figures may change in future publications because degrees can be posted for students retroactively.
- Degrees awarded is not an unduplicated headcount. Students who receive more than one degree are counted for each degree they receive.

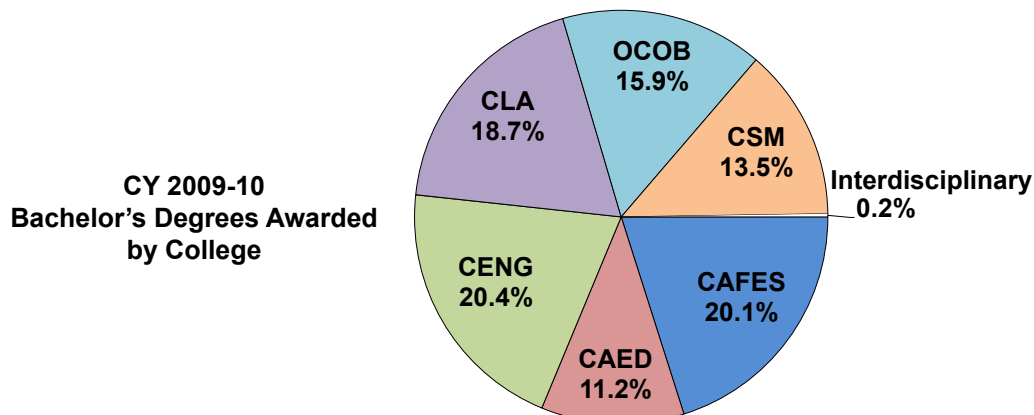

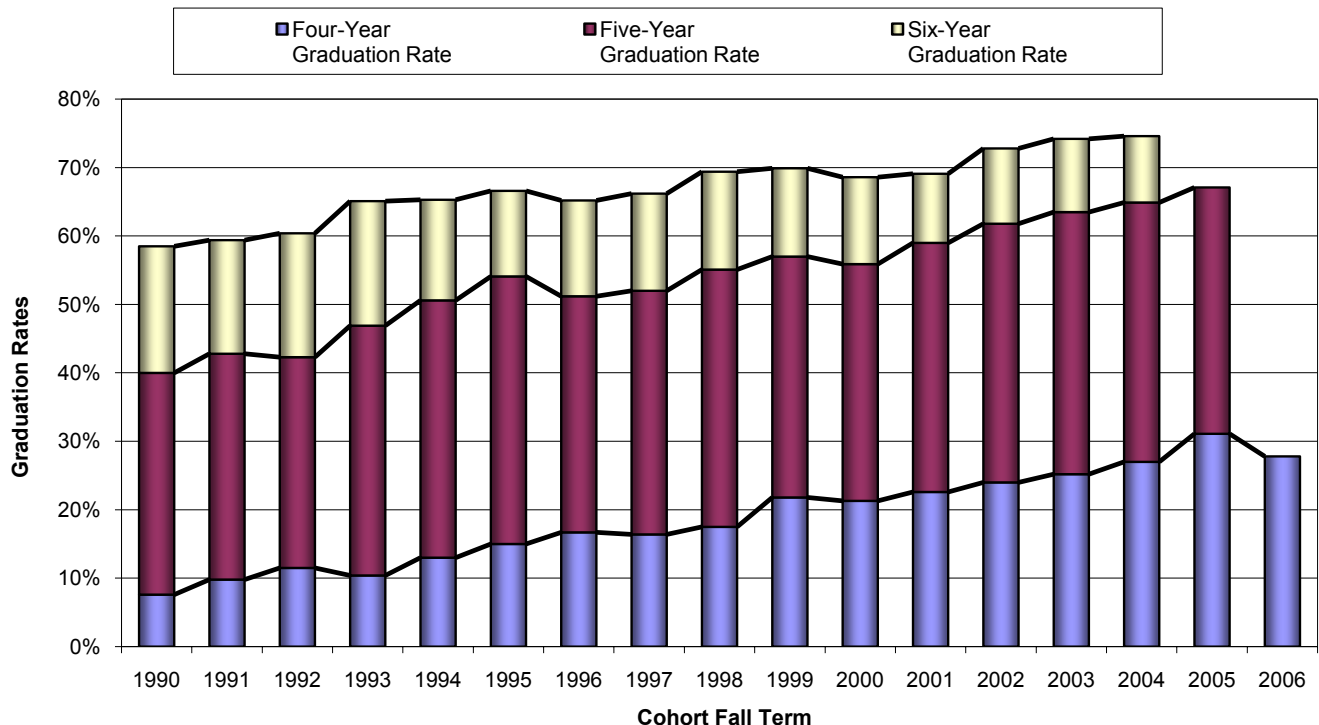

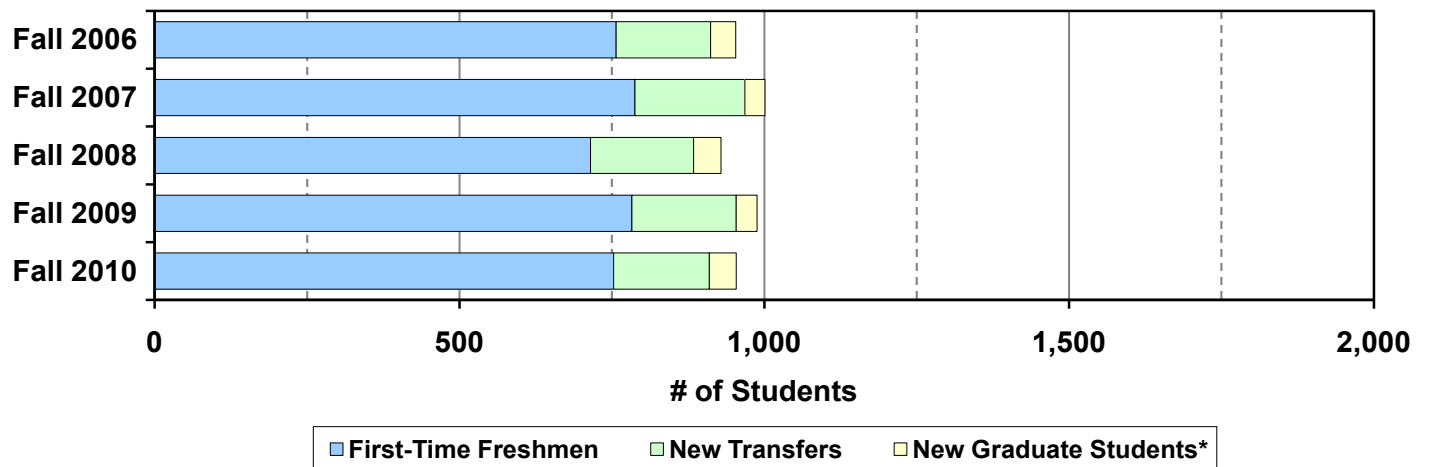

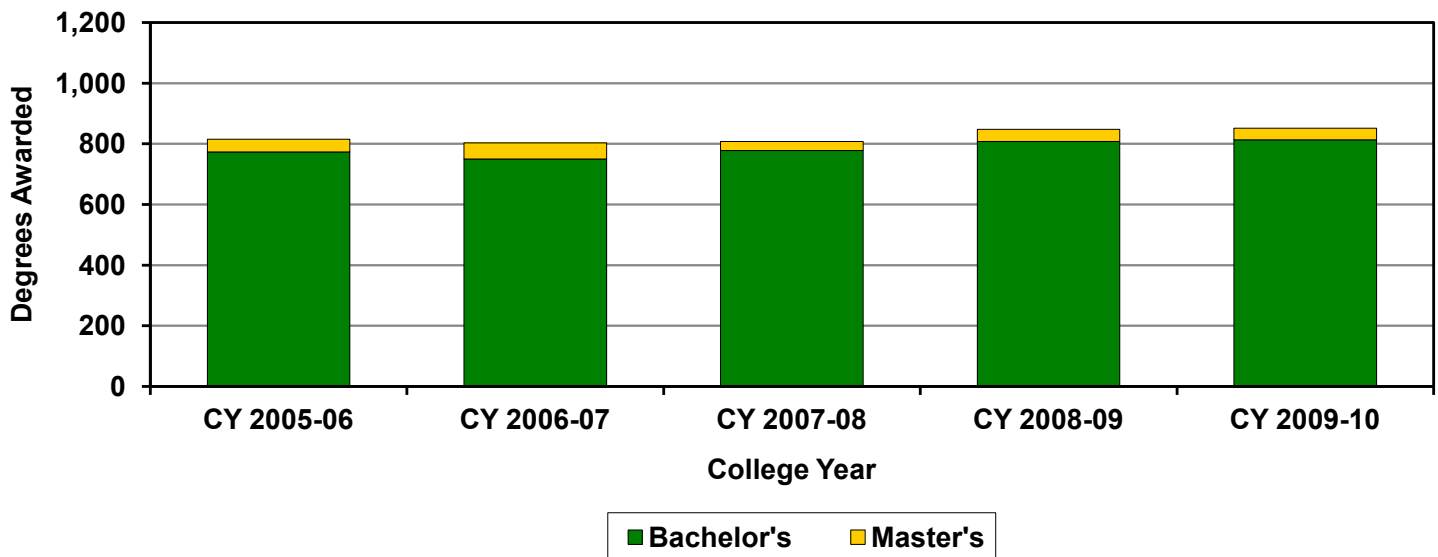

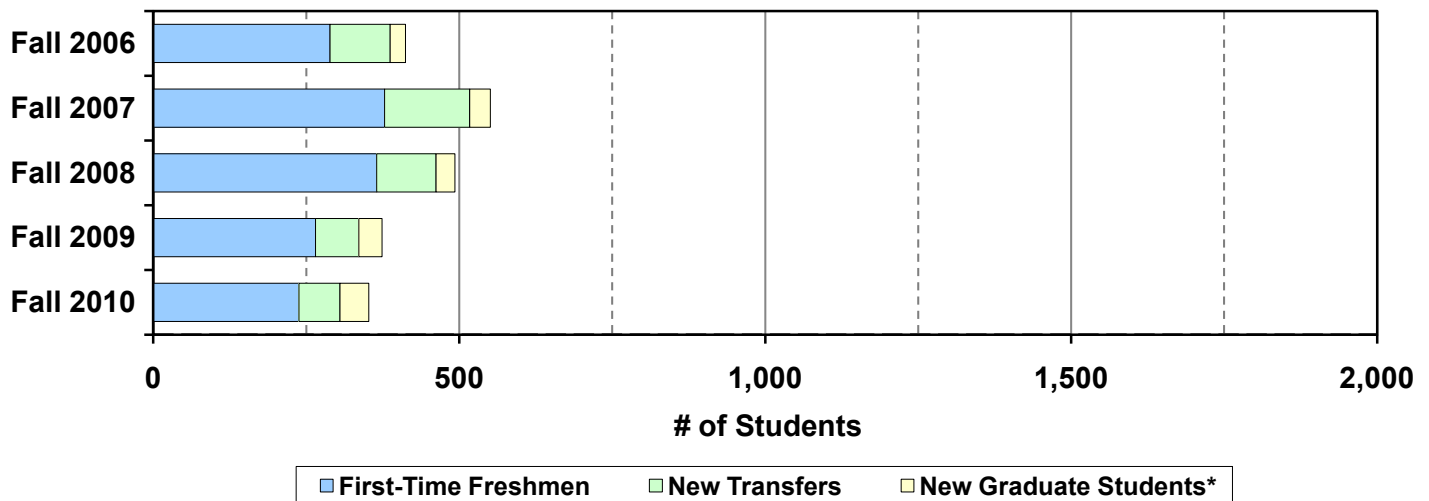

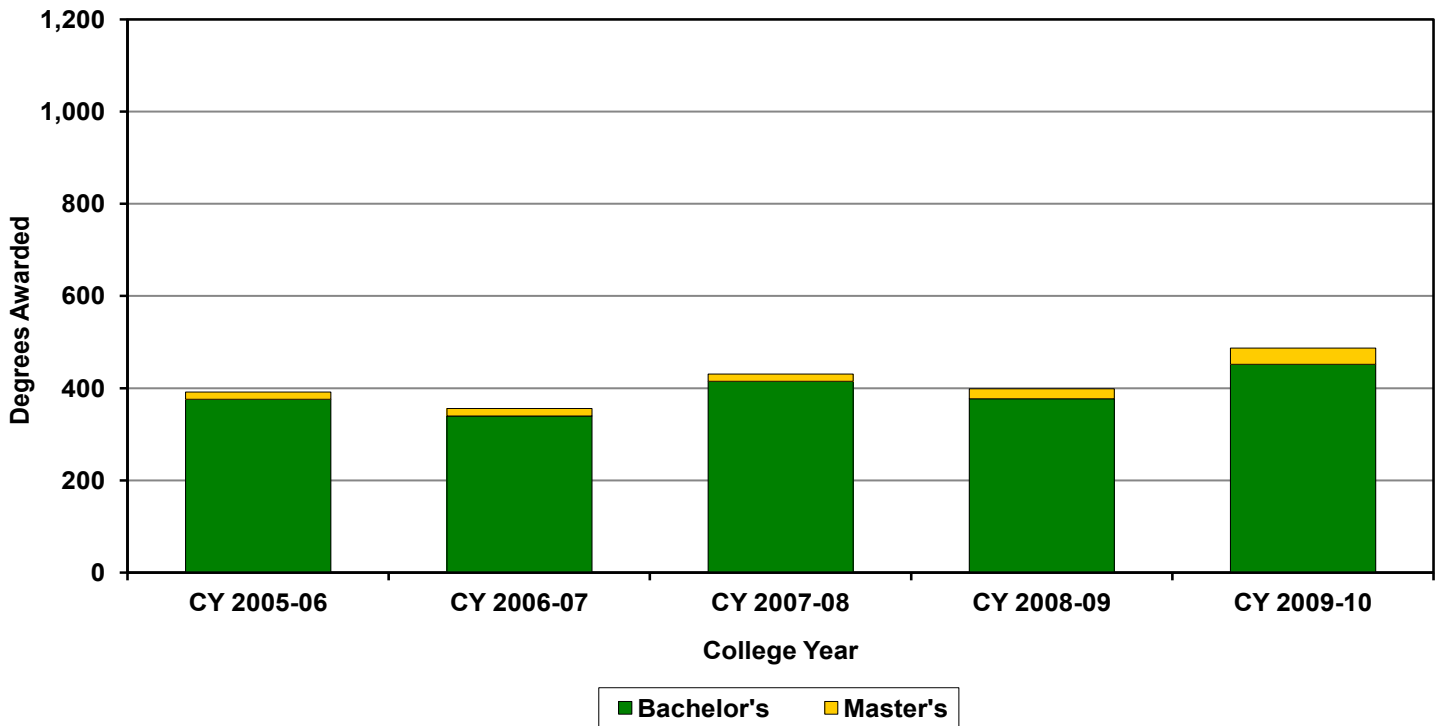

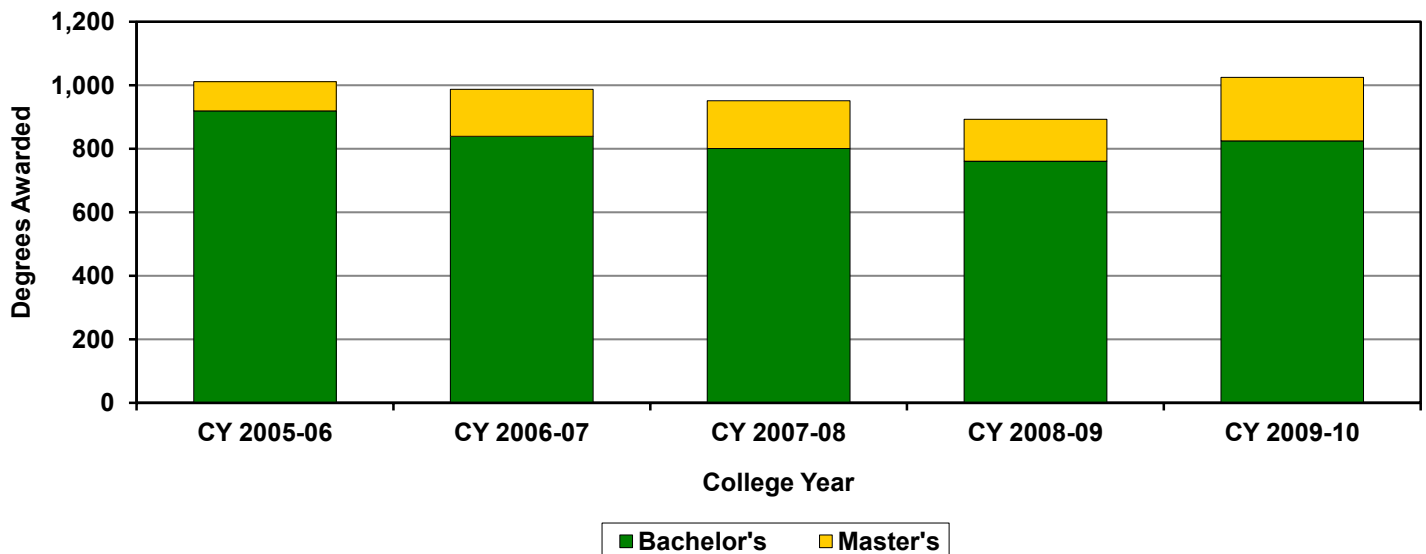

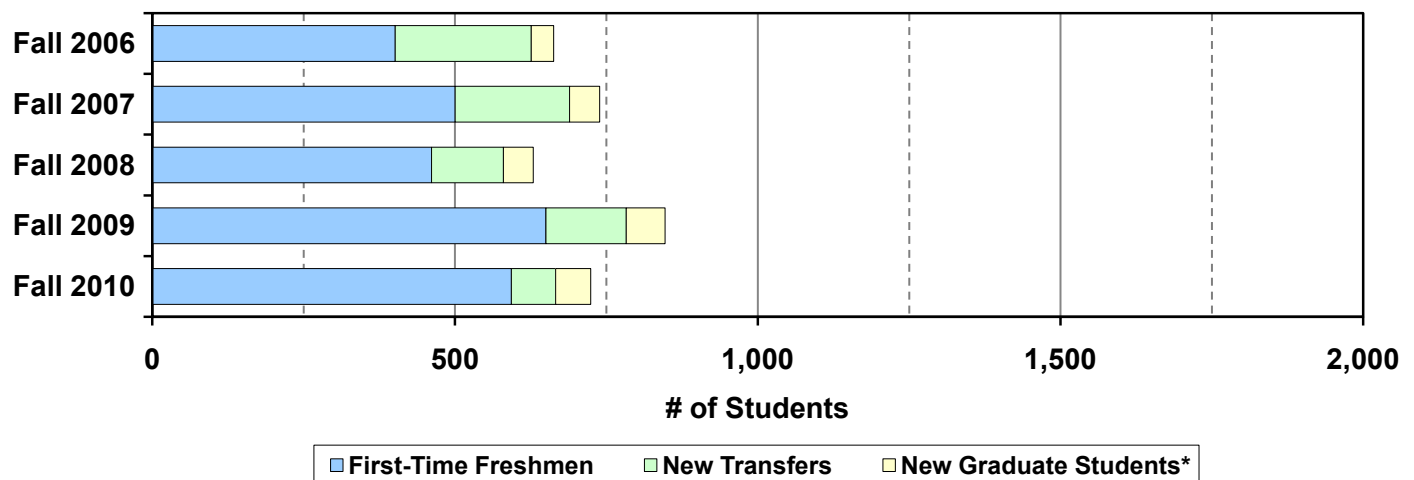

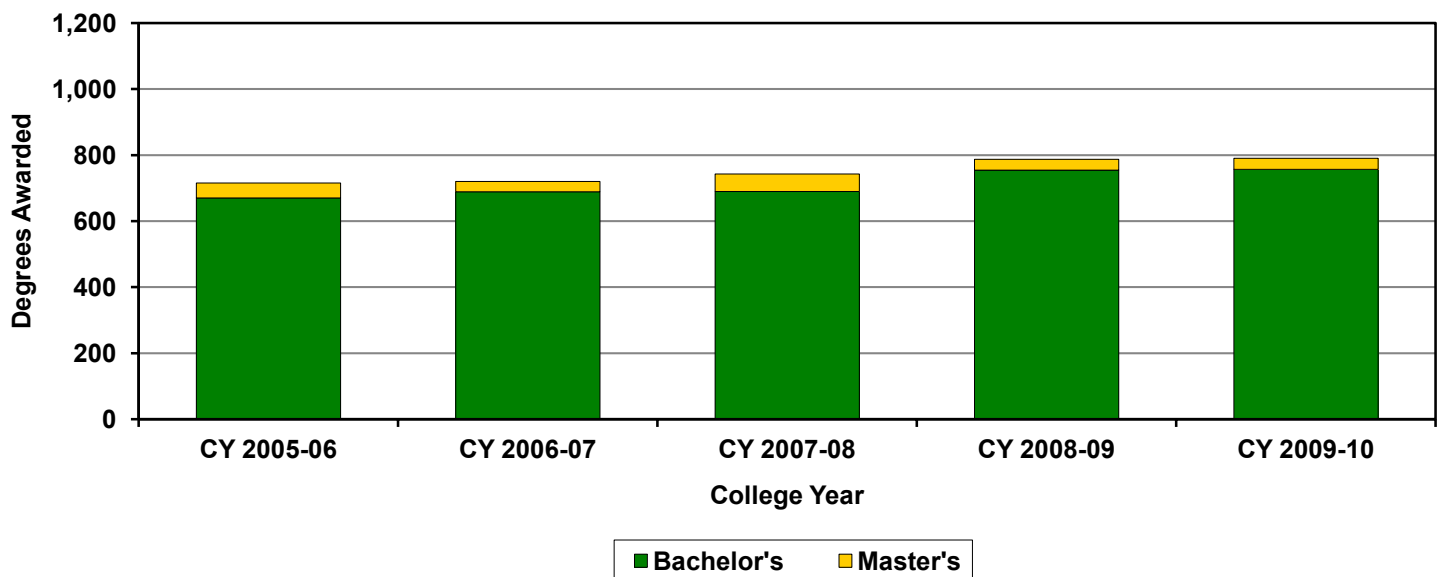

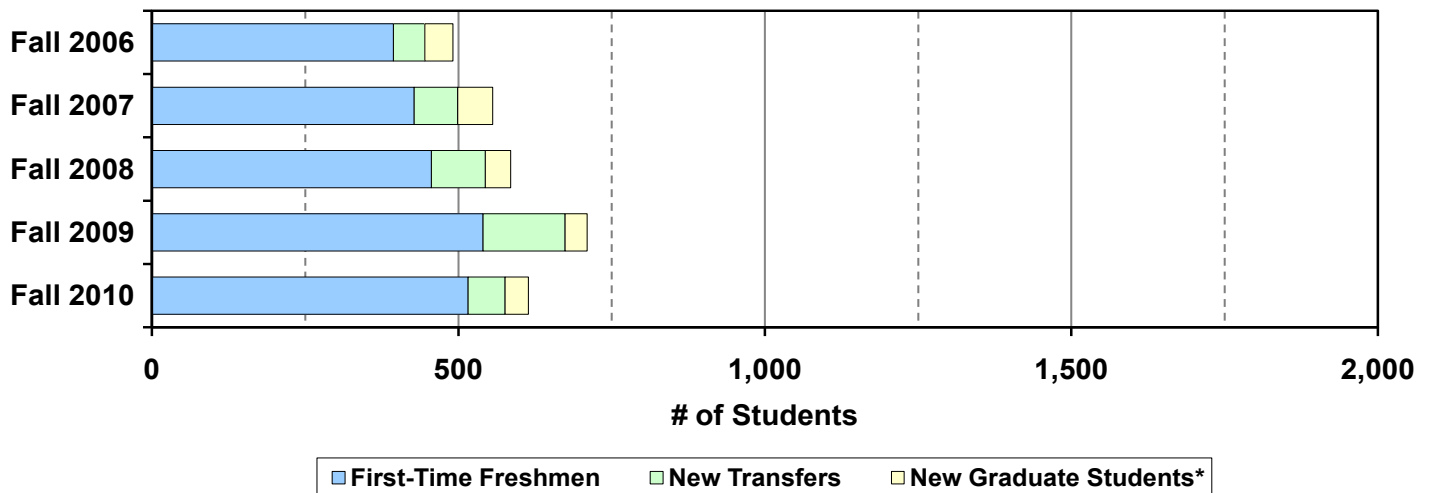

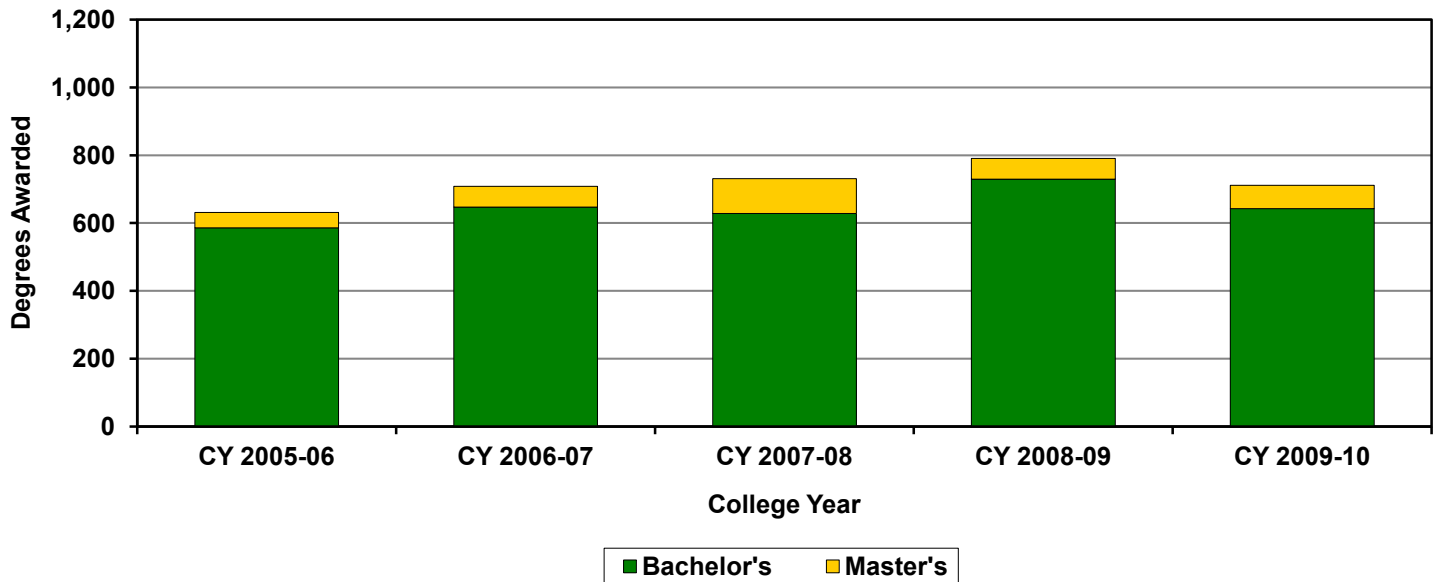

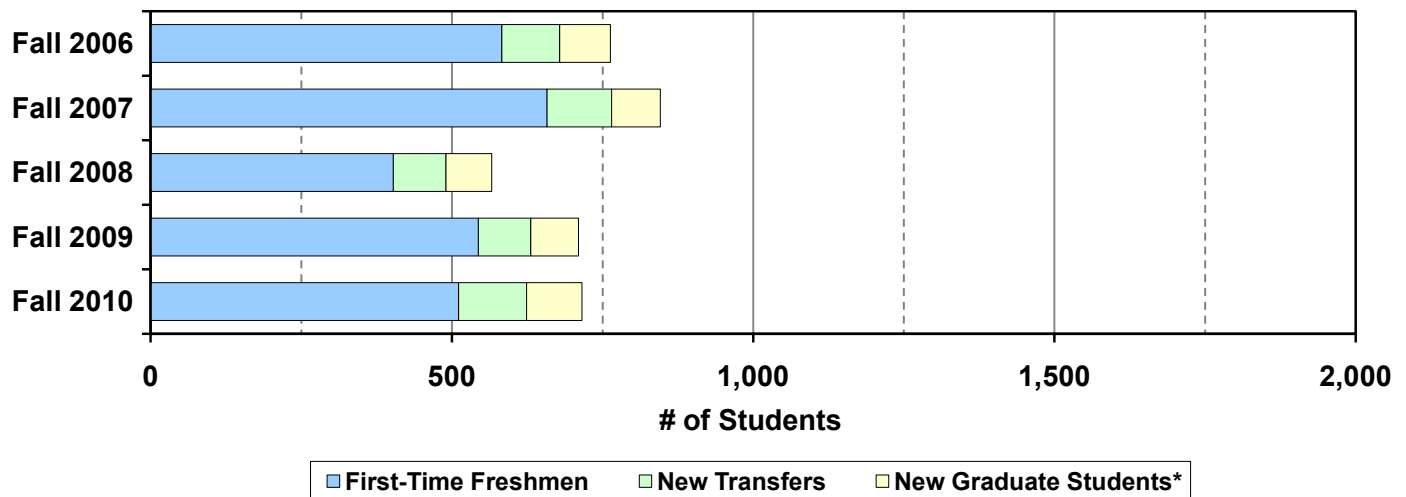

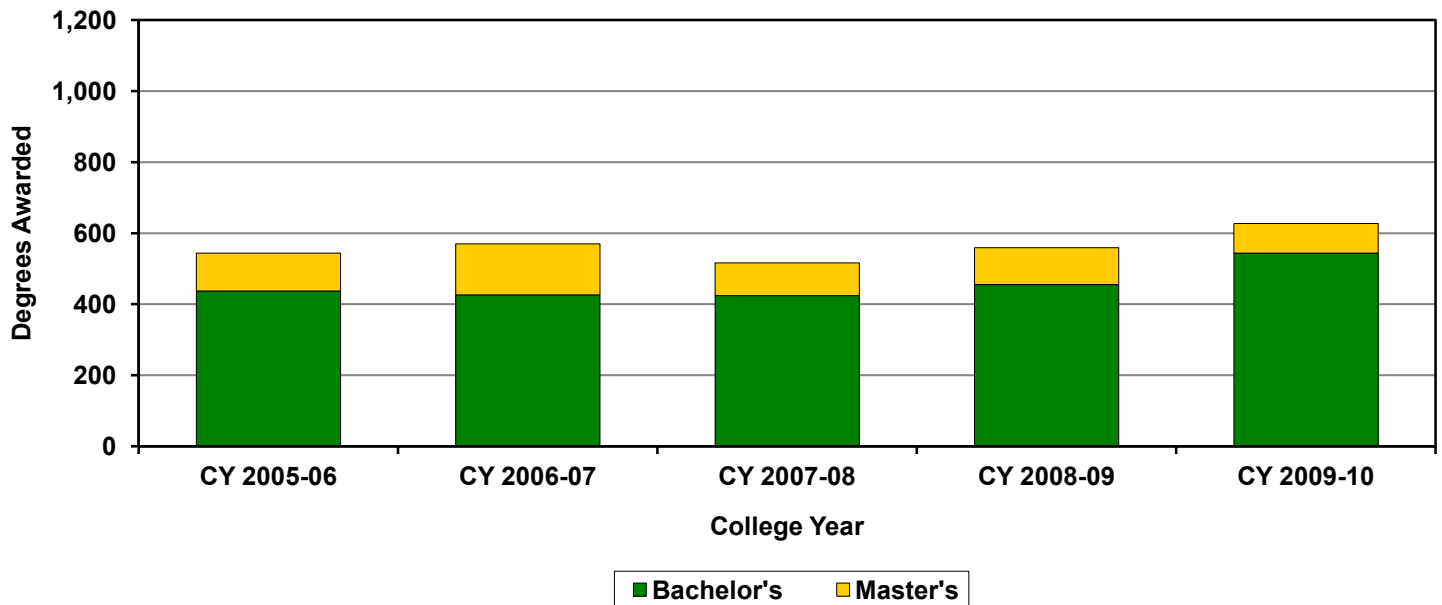

Employee Profile

In Fall 2010 Cal Poly had a total of 2,573 employees, who generated 2,140.5 paid FTE (full-time equivalent). There were 1,225 staff, 163 management, and 1,185 faculty. Fall 2010 faculty generated 900.3 instructional FTE.

Faculty and staff make up 93.7% of Cal Poly employees (46.1% and 47.6% respectively).

Academic Affairs is the division with the majority of employees, with 70.1% of total employees.

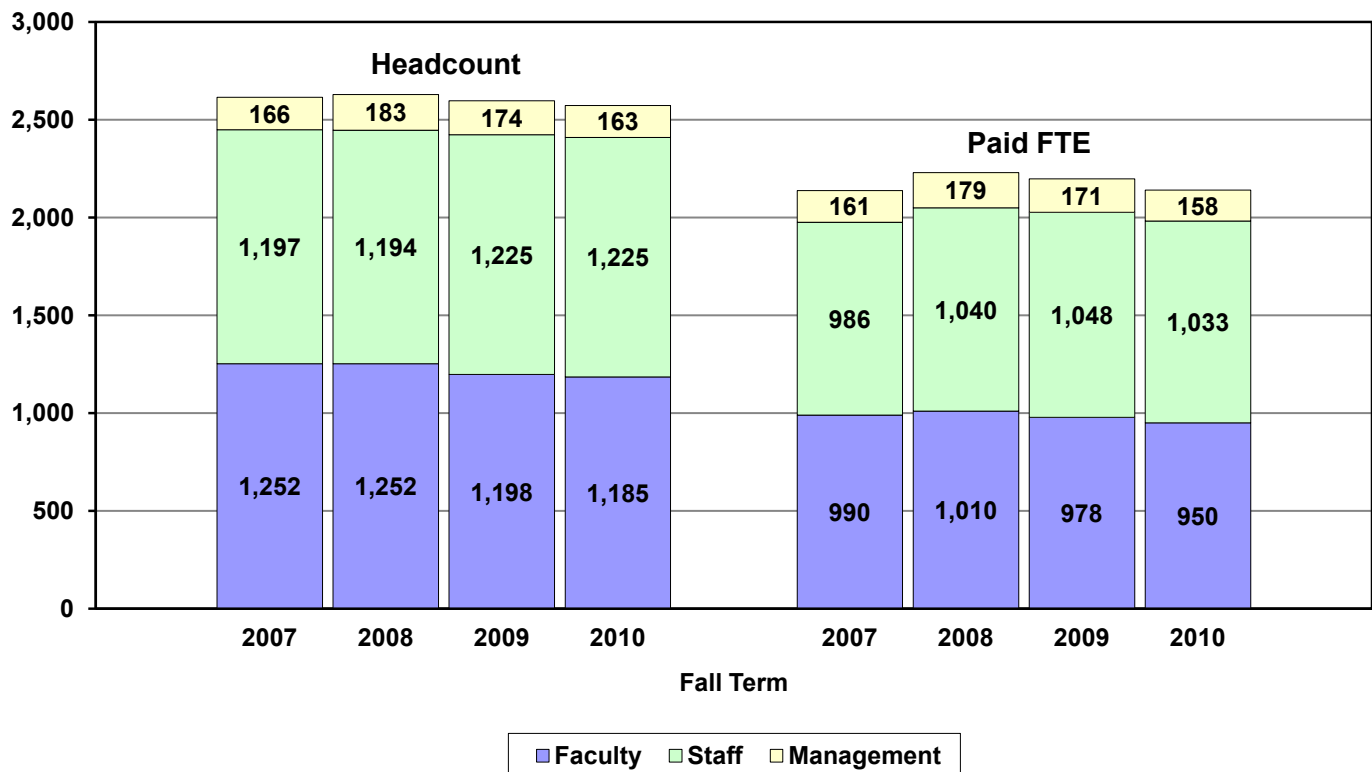
The average age of Cal Poly employees is 47.0 years, and the median years of service is 7.0 years.

Of tenured and tenure-track faculty, 95.8% have a doctorate or the terminal degree in their field.

Notes:

- Employees can have multiple appointments. For headcounts, employees are only counted once in each employee type and once in the total employees profile according to their primary appointment.
- Whereas headcounts are according to primary appointments, FTE (full-time equivalent) is a summation of each individual appointment.
- "Paid" FTE is the amount of FTE the employee is paid for. In the faculty profile, "instructional" FTE is the portion of "paid" FTE devoted to instructional activities, including release time.
- Faculty FTE figures may differ slightly from previous Fact Books, because some inconsistencies were found and corrected.

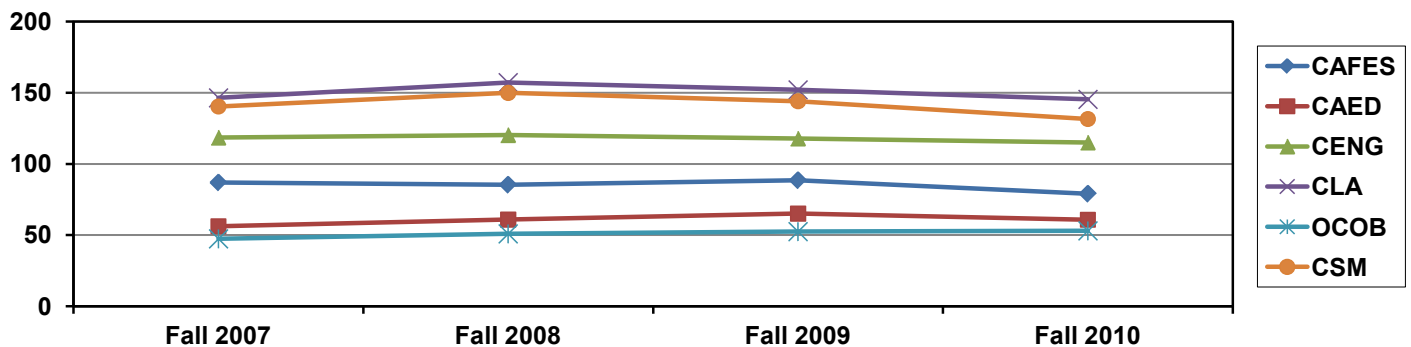

Financial Aid Awards Profile — Aid Year 2009-10

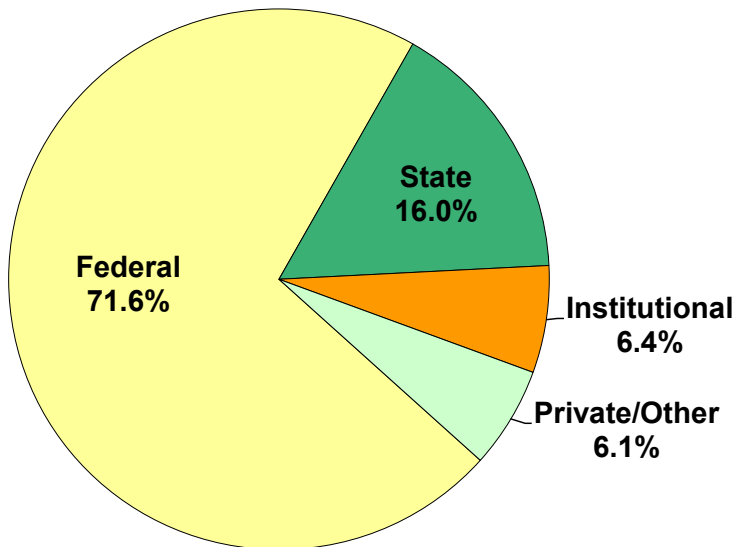
Cal Poly disbursed a total of \$115,508,389 of financial aid in aid year 2009-10. Of this aid, 71.6% was from federal sources and 60.4% was in the form of loans. The overall average award was \$3,759. The average loan was \$5,043, while the average scholarship was \$2,005.

A total of 9,963 students received aid in aid year 2009-10. The overall average total aid package per student was \$11,594. Total aid disbursed increased 20.1% (\$19.4 million) from the previous year and 28.6% (\$25.7 million) from two years ago.

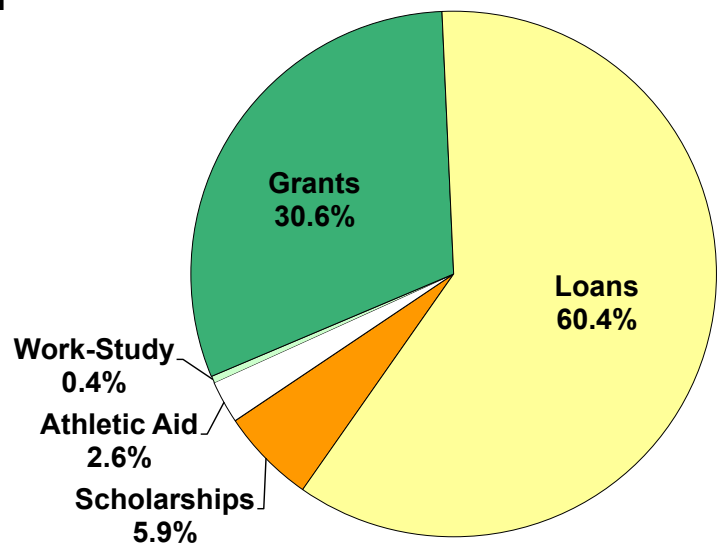
