






We've Only Just Begun . . .



In Memoriam



Dr. Rheinhold Engelmayer



Coastal Carolina College suffered a heartfelt loss this year due to the death of Dr. Rheinhold Engelmayer. He died in the People's Republic of China doing what he liked best, research and educational study.

Dr. Engelmayer was the most influential person in many people's education including my own. His enthusiasm and knowledge of his subject somehow seemed to rub off and increase one's desire for outside learning. He was one of those rare teachers who was genuinely concerned with the education of his students, some examples being the many long distance field trips he led as well as the extensive field research he had directed.

A native of Austria, Dr. Engelmayer came to Coastal in 1970. He earned a Ph.D. from Leopold Franzens University in Austria, and the equivalent of a masters degree from the University of Vienna. Prior to joining the Coastal faculty he taught Pre-history at the University of Tuebingen in West Germany. He was an assistant director and curator of the museum of natural history in Vienna, Austria. Dr. Engelmayer also served as a field archeologist for the United Nations in Egypt.


He was the first archeologist to engage in long term excavation of pre-Columbian Indian sites in this area and was known for work; in addition he was a popular speaker.

Dr. Engelmayer had conducted archeological and physical anthropological research in Central and Eastern Europe, the Mediterranean area, the Near East, North Africa, the U.S., and Latin America.

He was exceptionally well thought of and respected by his professional colleagues and students alike. The community will miss Dr. Engelmayer.
