The daily operating season at Carowinds ended on August 20, but the 73-acre theme park will remain open on weekends (Saturday and Sunday) until October 15. Neil Sedaka will be performing at Carowinds on Saturday and Sunday, August 26 and 27; the Captain and Tennille on Saturday and Sunday, September 2 and 3; and Larry Gatlin on Saturday, September 16. Members of the Carowinds Fun Club can present their membership card at the Carowinds ticket booths in the fall for a 10 per cent discount off the front gate admission into the park. The Fun Club card is also good for discounts at the Carowinds stables, Frog Creek Campground and selected area motels and restaurants. Carowinds is located on the North Carolina/South Carolina border ten miles south of Charlotte on I-77.
