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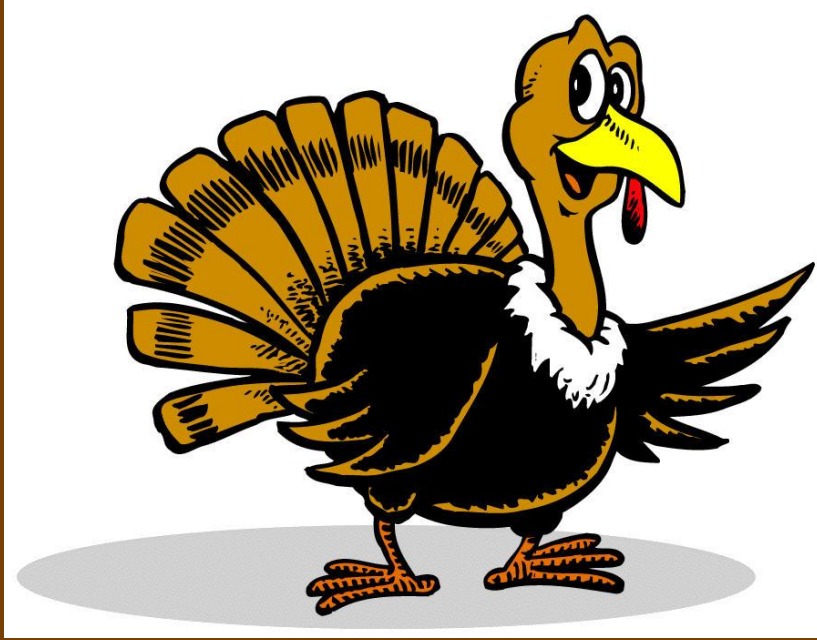

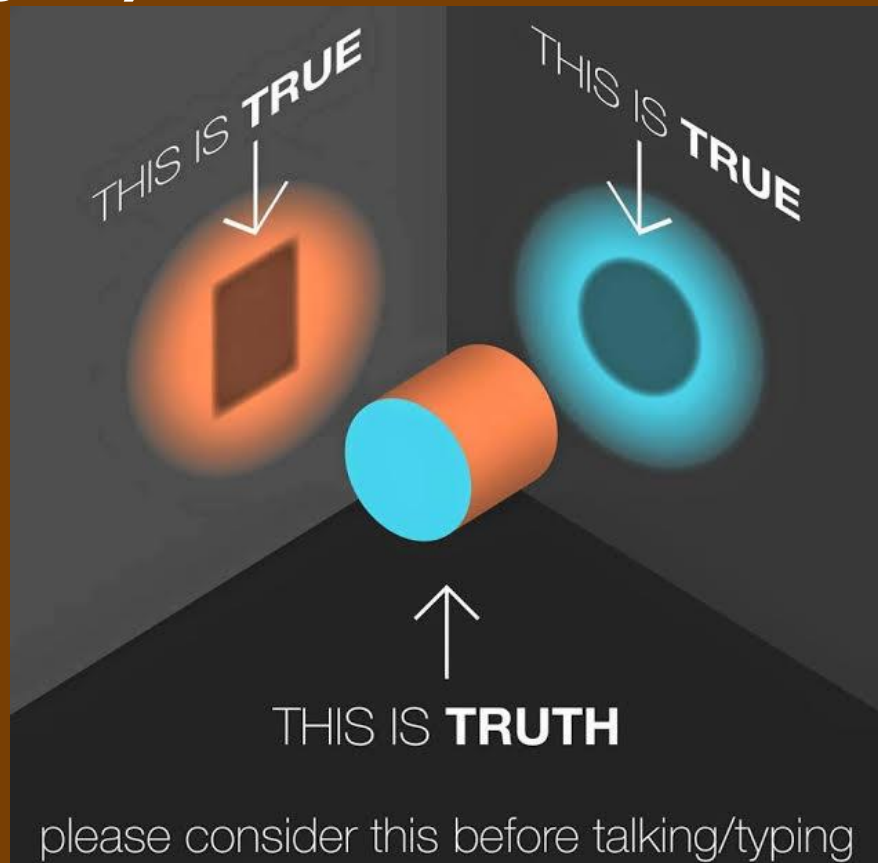
Is this article **relevant**? (does it answer a question for the intended audience, would other sources be better, would you or would you not use it for research?)

What's the **accuracy** of the article? (where does the information come from, was it reviewed by someone else, and can you verify it in some way?)

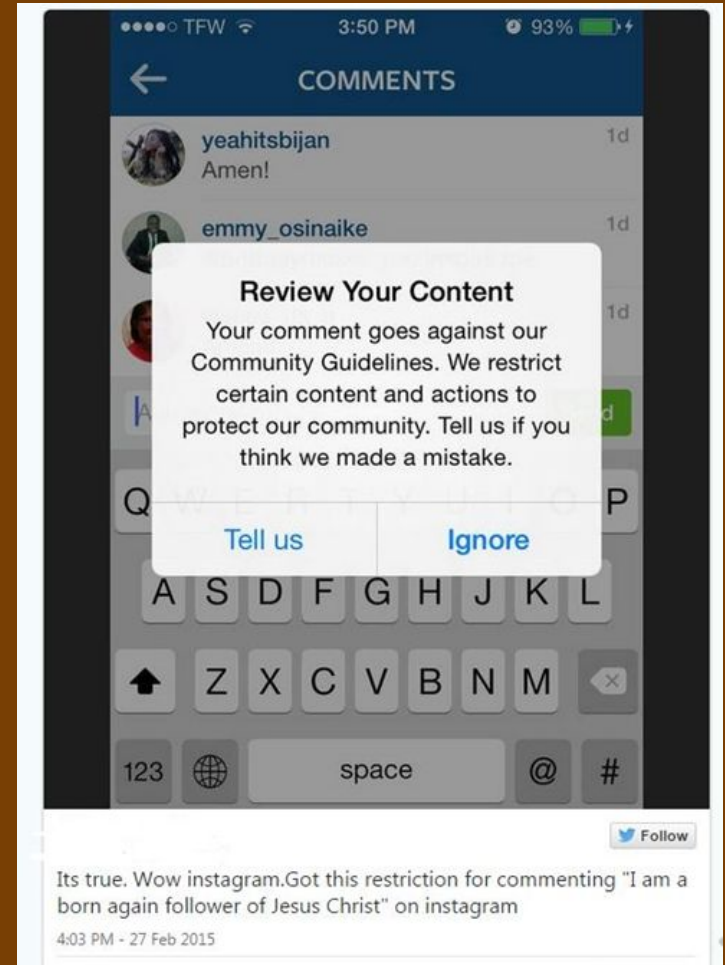
