





To be effective, **libraries need to** understand and respond to those changes.







- WFT: What the Fake was another workshop offered.










FIGURE 1. RDM SERVICE CATEGORIES: A TOUR OF THE RESEARCH DATA MANAGEMENT (RDM) SERVICE SPACE. THE REALITIES OF RESEARCH DATA MANAGEMENT, PART 1<sup>3</sup>.


