- Dr. Christoph Bruch and Anja Lengenfelder
- Aims:
 - Advocating Open Access internally and externally
 - Linking different parties and Open Access activities
 - Building up sustainable workflows and communication channels (e.g. MPS-OA-Network)
 - Advancing Open Access publishing
 - Supporting the Berlin process (Berlin Declaration 2003)



Berlin Declaration (2003)

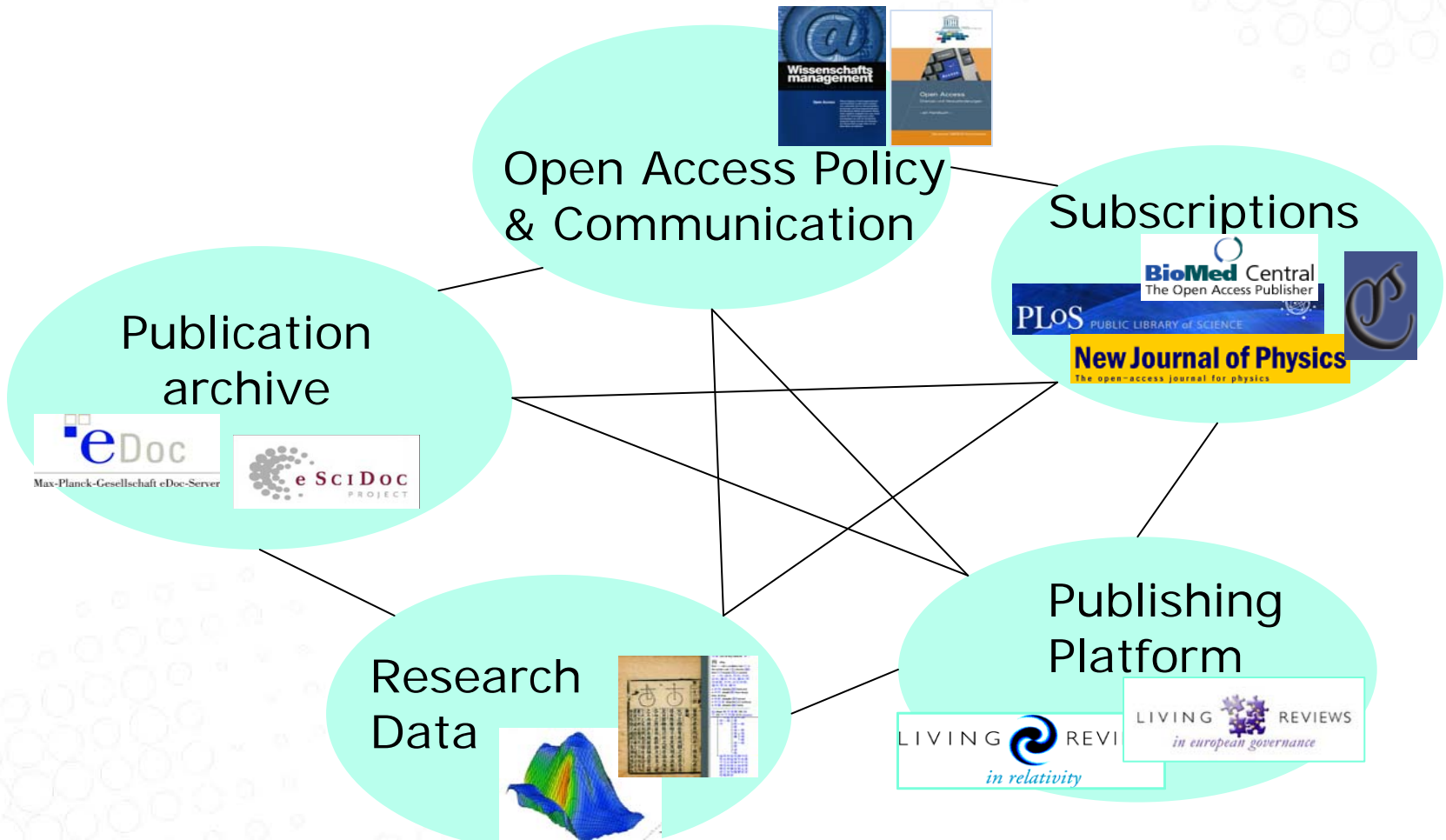
„...free, irrevocable, worldwide, right of access to, and a license to copy, use, distribute, transmit and display the work publicly and to make and distribute derivative works, in any digital medium for any responsible purpose....“

Signed by more than 260 scholarly institution worldwide





Five spheres of Open Access at Max Planck Society



Why Open Access? And Why Should You Support It?

- Political statement: MPS with Berlin Declaration
- Technical implementation: PubMan
 - ➔ Metadata AND full text; allows to display list of your publications
- Additional thought: Budget for Information Provision is limited for all research institutions ➔ also for MPS

It is sustainable, it is easy, it makes your work highly visible



How You Can Achieve Open Access

Towards Open Access there is a

- **Green** Road (Selfarchiving, PubMan) and a
- **Golden** Road (OA Publishing)





Using the Golden Road

You want to publish in an Open Access journal:

- Note that there are often article charges!

But those are often paid for by your funders or institution



Golden Road @ MPS

- Central Article charge agreements:
 - MPS -> OA Publisher:
 - New Journal of Physics
 - BioMed Central
 - PLoS
 - EGU/Copernicus
 - MPS -> Hybrid Publishers
 - Springer

In addition, there are consortial agreements emerging and OA journals published at MPIs or MPDL

The majority of publishers allow self-archiving!





The following describes each of the six main licenses offered when you choose to [publish your work](#) with a Creative Commons license. We have listed them starting with the most accommodating license type you can choose and ending with the most restrictive license type you can choose.

License Conditions

Creators choose a set of conditions they wish to apply to their work.



Attribution

You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your copyrighted work — and derivative works based upon it — but only if they give credit the way you request.



Share Alike

You allow others to distribute derivative works only under a license identical to the license that governs your work.



Noncommercial

You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your work — and derivative works based upon it — but for noncommercial purposes only.



No Derivative Works

You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform only verbatim copies of your work, not derivative works based upon it.
