
FOREWORD

In addition, this publication carries estimates of prices, and value of production of agricultural commodities. Receipts and shipments of many selected agricultural products are also included.

This issue of Statistics of Hawaiian Agriculture is the last to be published under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension Service of the University of Hawaii. It is a part of a series of annual publications of basic agricultural data begun in 1936, at a time when there was no repository of agricultural statistics in Hawaii. The Cooperative Extension Service is proud that the statistical work of the Hawaii Crop and Livestock Reporting Service has grown and developed to the extent that today its monthly and annual reports are the authoritative source of data for governmental agencies, research departments of private firms, and business and agricultural enterprises.

HAWAIIAN AGRICULTURE 1960

The value of Hawaii's agricultural products marketed in 1960 dropped 11 million dollars from the previous year to \$283,000,000. Sugar production was still reduced because of the 1958 strike and the value was about 20 million dollars less than for the years immediately before the strike. Value in 1960 was less than for the year before. The pineapple pack value in 1960 was 9 million dollars less than for the previous year. The values of diversified crops and of livestock and livestock products were each up about a million dollars in 1960.

Livestock and Livestock Products

The increase in value of marketings of livestock and livestock products for 1960 was accounted for by the dairy and poultry industries. The value of dairy sales was up 5 percent and of poultry sales, 10 percent. Prices for chickens and for eggs were down slightly but marketings were up especially for eggs. Milk prices were up slightly but most of the increase in value was due to increased production. Beef production was about the same in 1960 as the previous year but prices were lower. Hog prices also were lower in 1960 and despite increased production the value of marketings was less than the previous year.

The leader in the value of livestock marketings in 1960 was again the dairy industry at 11.0 million dollars. Second was the beef industry with 9.3 million dollars and a close third, the poultry industry with 8.4 million dollars. Hog sales had a value of 3.7 million dollars.

Oahu's value of livestock marketings in 1960 of 19.3 million dollars was 60 percent of the total for the State. Hawaii was second with 7.1 million dollars followed by Maui with 3.3 million dollars and Kauai with 2.5 million dollars. Oahu accounted for 83 percent of the State total value of dairy marketings, 78 percent of the hog total and 66 percent of the total for chickens and eggs. Hawaii led in the value of beef production with slightly over half of the total and was second for hogs and poultry and third for dairy products. Maui ranked second for beef and second for the dairy industry.

Diversified Crops

Marketings of diversified crops in 1960 were up nearly a million dollars in value from the previous year. About half of the increase came in the value of coffee marketings. Prices were down slightly but the crop was considerably larger than the previous year. The volume of marketings of vegetables and melons and of fruit were down from the previous year in 1960. However, prices were up enough so that values of marketings increased. Sales of macadamia nuts and the value of sales continued their uptrend.

Vegetables and melons, with sales of 4.6 million dollars, was well ahead of coffee with sales of 3.5 million dollars as the major diversified crop enterprise. Fruit ranked third with marketings valued at 1.4 million dollars.

First place in value of diversified crop marketings was held by the island of Hawaii with a total of 5.9 million dollars. Hawaii led in coffee production with a value of 3.5 million dollars and in production of macadamia nuts and was second in vegetable and melon production and in fruit production. Oahu held second place in

the State in value of crop marketings with a total of 2.9 million dollars. Oahu held first place in value of production of vegetables and melons and of fruit.

Land in Crops and Agricultural Enterprises

The acreage of land in crops in 1960 was up slightly from the previous year. Increases in land in sugar cane and pineapple more than offset a drop in acres of diversified crops. Acreages of all diversified crops were down in 1960 with the biggest drop in coffee acreage.

The total number of commercial diversified crop enterprises in 1960 was less than a year earlier. There were decreases for all enterprises except fruits and macadamia nuts. There was an increase in fruit enterprises and about the same number for macadamia nuts. The number of commercial livestock enterprises also decreased in 1960. The number of beef enterprises increased a little but the numbers of all other enterprises dropped.

State Market Supplies

Total market supplies of fresh vegetables and melons in 1960 were 2.3 million pounds less than the previous year. Most of the decrease was in inshipments. The items with major decreases were celery and potatoes but lettuce and tomato inshipments were also down by fairly large amounts. There were sizeable increases in local supplies of celery, green corn and lettuce that were about offset by decreases in green beans, cucumbers, tomatoes and watermelons. Market supplies of fresh fruit were also down in 1960. The total was down 3.1 million pounds with inshipments accounting for 2.5 million pounds of the decrease. Shipments of most fruits were down, with a drop of 1.5 million pounds for oranges and 0.3 million pounds for plums most important. A sharp drop in local supplies of papayas more than offset an increase in the supplies of bananas.

Supplies of eggs from local sources accounted for 84 percent of total supplies for the State in 1960 as shipments dropped and production increased. Local supplies of chicken also were a larger part of the total this year but were still only 40 percent of the total. Island production of pork increased in 1960 while inshipments dropped to give local supplies a larger share of the market. Supplies of Hawaii produced beef in 1960 were the same as a year earlier but inshipments increased.

Outshipments

Fresh pineapple shipments in 1960 totaled about 16 million pounds, 8 percent more than the previous year. Papaya shipments in 1960 were about half as large as a year earlier. Production was severely reduced by the volcanic eruption in the Puna area early in 1960. Green coffee shipments increased in 1960 to 9.6 million pounds. Exports to foreign areas amounted to 2.2 million pounds. Shipments of processed fruit products in 1960 dropped slightly from the year before.

APPENDIX

Definitions and Explanations

The statistics of production and value in this publication relate principally to "diversified" agriculture, diversified being used in the sense of non-plantation crops. Statistical material on the two plantation crops, sugar and pineapples, was furnished by the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association and the Pineapple Growers Association of Hawaii.

Data on diversified agriculture are for "commercial" production, which excludes very small enterprises and some of the minor crops. Beginning in 1956 "commercial" production of crops is defined as production from enterprises which yielded \$600 or more of product. Previously there was no specific definition. Commercial production of livestock products is defined as the portion originating from beef cattle herds of 20 or more head, dairy and hog herds of 10 or more, and poultry flocks of 100 or more layers or 500 or more meat birds.

Sources

Basic livestock data are collected annually as of January 1 by mailed questionnaires and enumeration by crop reporters and county agents. Monthly estimates of dairy, poultry, and hog production are obtained from samples of enterprises, supplemented by slaughter records. Production of vegetables and fruits is estimated from recorded wholesale marketings, adjusted for direct sales to retail stores or to consumers, and for losses of mature crops resulting from market conditions. Coffee, rice, and taro production is estimated from milling records. Acreage of diversified crops is obtained by monthly enumeration.

Data on inshipments and outshipments are derived from records of steamship and airline companies, importers, wholesalers, and plant quarantine agencies. Products shipped in annual quantities of less than 1,000 pounds are excluded. Direct shipments to the Armed Forces are also excluded.

Annual average prices are computed from value and volume of marketings. Prices of vegetables and fruits, formerly shown at the wholesale level, were converted to prices received by farmers. Adjustments were made for wholesale and other handler commissions. For items shipped to Honolulu from other islands, shipping charges were also deducted. Monthly wholesale prices in Honolulu are medians of quotations in the Tuesday or Thursday Federal-State market reports. Annual average wholesale prices are simple averages of monthly prices.

Values are calculated on the basis of prices received by farmers. When not available footnotes explain the type of price data used. Values of diversified crops and livestock are for marketings and exclude the value of products consumed on farms or not harvested because of marketing factors.
