



Use environmentally friendly cleaning and personal care products that won't damage your septic

- · Your system should be pumped every three (3) years by a certified septic pumper

- . Save time and money and have your septic tank inspected for malfunctions at the time of pumping.
- Low interest loans for septic pumping and maintnance are available through the through the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (AgBMP Loan), and Anoka County.
