The repository makes the information accessible to the world, creates a persistent URL for each item, and preserves the work over the long term. Scholarly output is not just journal articles. It includes grey literature (items that have not been formally published), theses and dissertations, newsletters, video and audio recordings, presentations, data sets and more.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. I'm the new Digital Repository Librarian and I started at UT in January. I'll be taking over many of the management responsibilities of the repository from Amy Rushing. I'll also be working on increasing outreach both within the library and to the rest of the UT campus. I look forward to working with all of you!
