## 'Good night and good luck'



Edward Roscoe Murrow (25 April 1908 – 27 April 1965) American journalist.

- prominence with a series of radio news broadcasts during World War II, which were followed by millions of listeners in the United States and Canada.
- Many journalists consider Murrow one of journalism's greatest figures.
- Honesty and integrity in delivering the news.
- Pioneer of television news broadcasting
- Murrow produced a series of TV news reports that helped lead to the censure of Senator <u>Joseph</u> <u>McCarthy</u>.

- Good night, and good luck.
  - Sign off line of his radio and TV broadcasts.
