Slide 1: Title of the workshop

• Today we will work together on the first out of five workshops from the EMEE project. Our topic today is opening new perspectives on museum objects, and how to make Europe visible.

Slide 2: Objectives

- What are the objectives of the workshop?
- First, you will get to know the central aspect of the EMEE project better: the Change of Perspective.
- In working session A we will work together on different ways of re-interpreting museum objects in a European/ trans-regional perspective. You will get to know a system of eight categories applicable to nearly all kinds of objects, so it will be helpful for you in your daily museum work.
- In working session B we will think of ways to make the re-interpretation visible to the museum visitor. That means we will think of ways to stage objects in a new way and open new access routes for the visitors. Working session B is also about how to develop audiences and make a museum into a public space.
- In every working session, we will arrive at ideas that you can transfer to your own
 museum, to your own daily work, which will inspire you to make Europe visible in your
 museum.
