NEW ERA BEGINS AS FIRST JUNIOR CLASS ARRIVES

A SYNOPSIS OF THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Gardner-Webb College will make available a Baccalaureate Program with eight divisions and 16 departments in its initial efforts toward senior status. There will also be an Associate Degree Program which includes the Department of Nursing and some few associate degrees in the area of societal science and data processing.

Gardner-Webb will award the Bachelor of Arts and the Bachelor of Science degrees in the spring of 1971 to students who successfully complete 128 semester hours of work with a 2.0 or better quality point average.

Students, to receive the degree, must complete their final 30 hours of work at GW and should fulfill all the college's basic (core curriculum) requirements and the requirements of their major field.

Over 1,300 Students Register For Classes

Over 1,300 students have registered for Gardner-Webb's historic 1969-70 school year. Of the number, 241 are members of the junior class—the school's first in a move toward eventual four year status in 1970-71.

Dr. Eugene Postle, president, is seeing his Decade of Adverse plan, announced in 1961, coming true as schedule and web enter in the way of physical facilities and growth of the faculty and administration.

Ninety-five professors and administrators, plus a large crop of staff members, are on hand for the important year. This number has grown steadily during the past three years and will possibly level off now as enrollment remains around the 1,300 figure for the next few years.

Students arrived throughout the period of August 28-27 in preparation for registration on August 28-29. Organizational leaders and football players were first to arrive followed by freshmen and transfer students who are required to take part in orientation programs.

Most of the juniors are returning students although some do come from other colleges or are returning to college after an absence of a few years.

Most of these students are boarding on campus or in community housing (1,000) and there are 300 commuting students. Classes began September 1 in what is expected to be Gardner-Webb's greatest year since its founding in 1925.

Wedding Unites Families Which Have Supported College Since Its Origin

Mrs. Dorothy Wankham Henrick and Tabago Irvin Edwards were united in marriage at 2:30 P. M., July 27, 1969 at the Balfing Springs Baptist Church with the Rev. T. Max Linnens, pastor, officiating.

The bride was dressed in a light, sky-blue sheath with lace panel down the front, matching gloves, shoes, and hat but contrasted with pearls and clusters of oysterdy. Her bouquet of sweetheart rose buds was mounted on top of a white covered Bible with streamers draping over the sides.

The marriage united two families which have supported Gardner-Webb College since its founding. Mrs. Edwards graduated from Lattimore High School, Balfing Springs Junior College and Meredith College. She was employed at Gardner-Webb in 1946 and became Registrar in 1948. She plans to continue her work at the college. Her grandfather, W. W. Washburn, was a member of the original board of trustees of the college and her father, I. C. Washburn, and brother, Dr. Wyan Washburn, have served as members of the board since the lifetime service of her grandfather (1911).

Mr. Edwards graduated from Henricks High School and was employed by Reynolds Tobacco Co. for 18 years and has been associated with the McInnis Wholesale Grocery Co. in Monroe since 1947 until July 16, 1969, when he retired.

Mr. Edwards' father was an original member of the Board of Trustees of Gardner-Webb from the Seady Row Association and a life-time member until his death in 1944. His brother, Carl, along with Mr. G. P. Henrick, were the first two students to register when Gardner-Webb first opened its doors in 1907.

The cool, "slutty" basketball player who, more than any other individual, earned Gardner-Webb College its first national basketball tournament, was killed in an early morning automobile accident August 13 in Birmingham, Ala.

Karl Neilson, 65, 185 pounds forward for the Gardner-Webb teams of 1966-67 and 1967-68, died instantly in a one-car accident. He was a passenger in the vehicle which occurred on a Birmingham city street, rolled over several times, and then hit a utility pole.

A rising senior at Sanford University where he had led that school's team in scoring as a junior, Neilson was showing bright promise for his final year of college basketball.
