FOUR YEAR STATUS ASSURED GARDNER-WEBB COLLEGE BY VOTE OF BAPTIST STATE CONVENTION

Near Unanimous Decision Changes Course of College's History

President Poston Elated As Seven Years Of Hard Work Reap Success

A near unanimous vote of the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina at 9:50 A.M., Wednesday, November 13, approved the elevation of Gardner-Webb College to senior status.

Dr. Eugene Poston and a delegation of Gardner-Webb College trustees, advisors, faculty members, students, and administrators were elated by the response. Dr. Poston said, "This is a dream come true for many, many people." R. Patrick Sprague, chairman of the Board of Trustees and the man who headed the first large capital gifts campaign, said, "This is a Big Day and I am extremely gratified. I think it is the ending of one dream and the beginning of another. We're going to grow even faster in the future for quality."

Gardner-Webb will have a junior class in 1969-70 and a senior class in 1970-71. Under Southern Association rulings, the college must meet senior status accreditation standards in 1971. This calls for a tremendous effort on the behalf of all supporters of the college.

A host of clamors were in the audience, some of them voting managers, during the historic event. Gardner-Webb was established in 1905 and opened its doors in 1907 as a Baptist high school. In 1928, Boiling Springs High School became Boiling Springs Junior College and retained that name until 1943 when the college was named in honor of the Gardner and Webb families of Shelby.



Today the college has 1,350 students and 72 full-time teaching faculty members, of which 17 holds the doctorate degree. The budget is approximately \$1.9 million and plant value exceeds \$7 million.

Jubilant leaders talk in press. Dr. Poston learned this historic event in 1961 when he took the reins of the presidency and spelled out in detail his "Decade of Advancement" program. Most of the program has been completed or surpassed three years ahead of time but this vote was perhaps the highest hurdle to overcome.

Planning for the four year program has been extensive and includes over a year of study and advice by the Southern Association, the Council on Christian Higher Education of the Convention and by the committees of the Convention and the General Board.
