## FORMER PRESIDENT CANTRELL



### HONORED BY LATTIMORE CHURCH

A \$1,000 J. R. Cantrell Memorial Endowment Fund has been set up in memory of the former President of Gardner-Webb College and long-time pastor of Lattimore Baptist Church.

The Lattimore Baptist Church made the fund available to honor the memory of Rev. Cantrell who was pastor of that church for 13 years, retiring around 1966 from that position.

Dr. Eugene Poston, president of the college, said "Words are inadequate to express full appreciation to you for the \$1,000 memorial fund."

Others interested in the fund and in honoring the memory of Rev. Cantrell are invited to make contributions. Members of the Lattimore Church have expressed a hope that many others will join in building up the fund.

Rev. Cantrell, president of G-W from 1936-45 died on June 23, 1967. He had attended the school when it was a high school and financed his way by cutting wood and firing the heater to heat buildings. His was 25 years old when he started to high school and had a wife and two children.

From Boiling Springs High School Cantrell went to Wake Forest College where he graduated in three years with a near perfect academic record, never taking an examination under the old rule that an "A" average exempted a person from exams.

His years at G-W were crucial ones, for he kept it alive in an interim period when everyone felt that hope had run out. The campus had grown up in weeds, the buildings were falling apart, the E. B. Hinrich Building had burned, old bed springs had been tossed into the weeds within 25 feet of buildings and the sewer outlet terminated in the vicinity of the present Stroup Residence Hall.

Rev. Cantrell had the E. B. Hinrich Building reassembled, remodeled the "Old Barn," a residence hall for men; rocked-up the old gymnasium and had the Heggins-Curtis Building renovated.

Mrs. Ansel (Bud) Harmon of Boiling Springs, a daughter, said that she still has in her possession a book kept by Rev. Cantrell showing how he financed the work. "The largest gift was \$10,000 and most of them were in the range of 10 and 25 cents," Mrs. Harmon says. Rev. Cantrell was famous for his prayer times where he spent hours in behalf of the college. "I know he spent many sleepless nights over the college," Mrs. Harmon said.

He had an entrance built to the campus (now gone due to the change in the entrance road direction) and did an enormous amount of work in behalf of an institution which might have closed except for his efforts.

## ON THE COVER

A small historic drama took place on campus recently, involving only a brief pause of interest from hurrying students and some faculty.

Citizens of the faculty paused longer and spoke about the change which to them seemed as insignificant as the replacement of a burned-out light bulb.

The old flagpole which had stood for years at the center of the campus was taken down and a new, shiny one replaced it. Hopefully, the old pole was to be reused at the stadium but it was raised cut and unusable—well it might have been.

Professor Hubert Dixon remembers it when it was completely undamaged, rather than when it was severed. It was the pipe used to pump water through from the old well which supplied running water to the Heggins-Curtis Building, the Boiling Springs Church, the parsonage, and perhaps two other buildings.

The old well was located in front of what is now the campus center building. Professor Dixon, as a student, remembers that when the pumping mechanism would fail and water pressure would drop—all the wells had to be pulled from the well for repair including the house flaps.

In later years, when the well was no longer in use, the pipe was pressed into use as a flagpole near the front of the Heggins-Curtis Building which burned in 1957. From that position it was moved to the center of the campus and has since ended its long service to the college.

The new pole was purchased by the Alumni Association for \$562. It is a 48-foot pole made of aluminum and is an attractive addition to the campus beautification and improvement projects.

James D. Fiske, chairman of the board of J. P. Stevens and Co., Inc., will be the speaker at Gardner-Webb College's commencement exercises. It was announced recently by Dr. E. Eugene Poston, president.

Fiske has been chairman of the board since July of 1965 and was elected to the board of directors of the Borden Co. in April of 1967.

Commencement exercises will be held at 3 p. m. May 12 for approximately 125 students receiving the Associate in Arts Degree from the Baptist junior college.

The May 12 Baccalaureate sermon for graduating students will be preached by Dick Balow of Atlanta, Ga.

The 11 a. m. service is traditionally held in the Bolling Springs Baptist Church and is preceded by the sentence procession from the campus through the Huguenot-Curtis Arch in the church.



## O. Max Gardner Foundation Donates Home For President



Trustees of Gardner-Webb College have unanimously accepted a \$75,000 grant from the O. Max Gardner Foundation, Inc., for the purchase of a new president's home.

The lovely new home is located on a wooded knoll in the River Bend Area development and is adjacent to the country club facilities of that development.

Dr. and Mrs. E. Eugene Poston are expected to occupy the house on or before August 1 of this year. Recently constructed by the Pied Pipers, the home is on a three acre site. It is completely carpeted, air conditioned and has four bedrooms, three and one-half baths and is especially adapted for entertaining. The 5,500 square foot new home is expected to be a great asset to the college while the present president's home is expected to be used as a guest house. The college has long needed a guest house due to a lack of motel facilities in Belling Springs.

## Cagers Conclude Finest Season

It was a tremendous success for the Gardner-Webb College Basketball team. Although eliminated from the national playoffs in two straight games, the Bulldogs could look back on a 30-3 overall mark, including championships in the Holiday Tournament at Belling Springs, the Holiday Tournament at Wytheville, Va., the Western Carolinas Conference title, and for the first time in history the Region 10 title and participating in the national playoffs.

Coach Eddie Holbrook will have returning in 1968-69, 7-2 center Arria Gilmore, 6-4 guard Art Roberts, 6-5 forward Eddie Fream, starting guard, Steve Kuchek; number six man, Jack McMillan; 6-3 Kevin Castellini, Joe Boyd, Steve Raadall and Robert Wilbourn.

The team flew to Hutchinson, Kan., via Chicago and faced Northeastern of Sterling, Colo., in their first game. Raced as underdogs to the fifth ranked Colorado team, the Bulldogs forced the tilt into an overtime only to lose 83-80. The next evening Robert Morris College of Carthage, Ill., whipped the G-W lads 82-60 eliminating them from national play.

Perhaps the biggest surprise for G-W fans and players was the consistently packed 8,000 seat arena in Hutchinson, a city of around 50,000 persons which annually inspects over 60 senior colleges to send schools and coaches to look over the finest junior college players in the country.

For Coach Eddie Holbrook, now holding a 92-25 college coaching mark, it is a case of waiting until next year. Should the young rooster compare up with as much talent this year as he did last, what a year it could be.

## FOUR YEAR PROGRAM PROGRESS

Three giant steps have been made by Gardner-Webb College in its efforts to gain approval for a senior college program.

Two major steps remain to be made.

Procedure set up for colleges owned and operated by the Baptist State Convention of N. C. to change status is to make a request of the Council on Christian Higher Education of which Rev. Ben Fisher is secretary.

The Council appoints a study committee which guides and evaluates progress of the college toward its goal. Approval of this committee moves the issue to the Committee on Administration and Finance of the Council as a preliminary move before study by the entire Council.

Gardner-Webb has now successfully made the steps mentioned above and will have a presentation to make in July to the Executive Committee and the General Board of the Convention which can then decide to recommend or not recommend this change of status to the entire convention in November. Should the convention vote approval the request, Gardner-Webb could then proceed with its work toward senior status.

Determination of approval is based on the progress of the college in the realm of curriculum, faculty and library which means the school must be well on its way in planning and equal results before a final decision is made on the matter.

The original study committee consisted of Mr. Forrest Hunt, superintendent of schools in Rutherford County, as chairman; Judge David Britt of Raleigh and Farmwell; Dean Ralph M. Lee, academic dean of Main Hill College, The Rev. Hayne Rivers, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Cramerton who has moved to Union, S. C., to accept the pastorate of the First Baptist Church; Dr. James Ralph Scales, president of Wake Forest University and executive member, Rev. Ben C. Fisher and R. N. Shores, Jr.

This committee recommended on March 15, "We recommend to the Council of Christian Higher Education that Gardner-Webb College be allowed to move toward senior status when in the judgment of its trustees and administrators qualifications for accreditation can be reached."

Fisher explained that this committee was not to determine accreditation as a senior college but to be reasonably certain that Gardner-Webb College can meet the requirements for accreditation before recommending change of status to the Council.

He went on to say that Standards I, III, IV, and VI of the Southern Association of Colleges were subjects for the main part of discussion. "In addition to previous progress reports, documentation was furnished, demonstrating that Gardner-Webb is progressing steadily in meeting requirements for the accreditation," Fisher said.
