



MY LIFE IN DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY FROM 1986 TO DATE

It gives me immense pleasure to write a note in the silver jubilee issue of Cutting Edge. When I glance back at the past towards the developments that have taken place in this span of time, it seems like a miracle to see how the surgery department evolved into a completely changed and developed form.

I started my career as a Filing Clerk/Typist in 1986 and then gradually, step by step, progressed to the position of Senior



Administrative Officer today. There were no computers in the early days. There was just one IBM type writer shared between two secretaries, which was followed by a new touch bottom Canon typewriter with basic advance system. And then finally we got individual computers type DX 1 in 1990.

We were routinely using dictation machines, transcribe letters and type on the type writer and then retype the full letter again on letter head after edition by faculty. Memos, letters, patient referral letters and M &M were all done manually and typed routinely.

The power point presentation slides for lectures were made on PC by me and I had to request the Information System Department (Mr. Zulfiqar Meghani) for a laser print out. These were then handed over to Audio Visual Department (Mr. Amir Tariq) to develop slides for presentation. There was only one laser printer available at AKU. Slides were developed through studio and were on x-ray films.

Around 1994, we were able to obtain email access. This connection was only available for 30 minutes every day. We had only one designated PC for this purpose. We were taught by Dr. Talati about its usage and learned how to get connected with the rest of the world. All correspondence were done manually and filed.

There was complete dedication towards Undergraduate and Postgraduate education right from the beginning. The examination and skills workshop were being conducted routinely by Dr Raja and organized by myself. The actual patient with basic diagnosis was brought from Civil Hospital for examination by Aziz Hayder.

From my experience and knowledge, I have learnt many good things in life from all colleagues, faculty and residents. I feel proud when alumni of those times come at AKU and meet me very respectfully.

My mentors have been Drs. Jamsheer Talati, Farhat Moazam, Rizwan Azami and Asad


Jamil Raja. Something of myself: I have spent days and night and worked as best as I could do to run the activities of Surgery department. My reporting relationship is with all full time and non-full time faculty, residents and medical officers, management and staff. There is no end limit on my job responsibilities. Many managers have been recruited but my workload never seems to be ending.

I have been collecting data from day one and finally today it has been incorporated in the Silver Jubilee Souvenir.
