



Cuba: Decadencia y rehabilitación is a wise work, written from an optimistic perspective, full of Cubanness and realism. The essence of Jorge Sanguinetty's economic and sociological thinking about Cuba is masterfully captured in this excellent selection of reflections throughout a long period. This work demonstrates the depth of his capacity for analysis, as well as his appeal to a broad public, both Cuban and from other countries. Part of the author's success is that, unlike other authors who regularly assess the last pirouettes of Cuban economic policy, Sanguinetty dwells primarily on the misery of the political economy and the institutions that operate such changes on the island.

Born in Havana, **Dr. Jorge A. Sanguinetty** migrated with his family to the United States in 1967. In Cuba, he worked at the National Institute of the Tourist Industry, the Central Planning Board, and the Ministry of the Sugar Industry. He settled in New York, where he completed a Ph.D. in Economics at the City University of New York. He earned a postdoctoral fellowship at Yale University, was a research associate in a project on education and economic development in ten Latin American countries, and taught at the Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro. He later developed and directed the Latin American Program in Applied Economics at American University in Washington, D.C. In 1984 he founded DevTech Systems, Inc., an international consulting firm. He helped to found the Association for the Study of the Cuban Economy in 1990 and has been a regular presenter in its anual conference, as well as president of the association. He has written articles for *El Nuevo Herald* y and *Diario Las Américas*. He is the author of the book *Cuba: Realidad y destino, presente y futuro de la economía y la sociedad cubanas* (2005).
