





Objective : To increase use and awareness of reference e-books which the Libraries have purchased or licensed

Reference e-books at the title level

- Those that are database-like are listed on the A to Z "Articles and Databases" page
- Via the catalog
 - o All reference e-books are listed in the catalog
 - o A keyword search on "electronic reference works" will bring up all 750+ titles
 - In advanced search can be limited by doing a "Genre Headings" on "electronic reference works" and adding additional terms

Access through "Electronic Reference Works" LibGuide

- General Reference
 - General reference titles
 - o Access to the electronic reference e-book collections :
 - Credo
 - Gale Virtual Reference Library
 - Oxford Reference Online. Premium
 - All have title lists
 - All have federated searching
- By Subject
 - o Based on LibGuides taxonomy
 - Selective titles chosen from the 750+ reference e-books (approx 100 titles)
- Biographies
 - o Variety of resources to information about people
 - Dictionaries and Thesauri
 - English and non-English
