FROM THESIS TO JOURNAL ARTICLE

We often get requests for information on modifying a student thesis, dissertation, capstone, or other final research project for publication. Publishing your work can advance science by making your findings available to a much wider audience and can be beneficial to your career. But shortening and focusing a thesis into a publishable structure can be hard work. To help you get started, <u>consult this chart</u> on nine differences between a thesis and a journal article (and call or email us anytime to schedule an appointment).
