Jefferson Medical College Class of 1917 Twenty-fifth Anniversary Poem

JEFFERSON THEN...

Not long as institutional time is measured nor even signally important in terrestrial events but certainly not dull—through one world war into a second, greater one—through collapse of a financial system, technocracy and into a so-called social reform with labor predominant. Notwithstanding, science gradually suprsedes the art of

practice.

Remember our great faculty? Never such group distinction before—so we thought. Then "of sudden death" the first, H. Wilson in 1919, then Stelwagon, Stewart in 1920, in like manner we lose Sweet, Loux, Metheny, Dercum, Funk, Keeler, Manges, Fisher, E. P. Davis, Burns, Nassau, Bland and Henry Mohler. Why? they ask. What's wrong with Jeff? Coplin, Klopp, Hare, McCrea at the height of their careers. Fielding Lewis and Radasch suddenly incapacitated. Jackson goes to Temple. The great DaCosta dies. Strecker goes to the University and Thad Montgomery to Temple. John Gibbon gives up teaching.

Not all bad—after a stirring campaign, the new hospital, finest of its kind, is opened in '24 followed in '29 by the building of the present college building and in '31 by the Curtis Clinic. With new buildings come new problems for the Board. Mr. Potter's loss was felt keenly. Alba Johnson, who gave us Ivycroft Farm, convalescent home for men, died suddenly and was followed in too brief time by Wilfred Frye. But Mr. Hooper has associated with him a group of public spirited men who conduct the

affairs of the institution so ably.

Meanwhile, events mark progress. Jefferson, the maker of doctors, becomes research minded and the Society for Clinical Investigation is founded, embodying the necessity for presentation of clinical and experimental material before this society and others throughout the country. A new era is born. Its influence is lasting.

For better fellowship and alumni fraternity came the Ex-Interns' Society in '27. The two-day Ex-Interns' alumni clinics increase in attendance. Jeff is a more live, active

Alma Mater.

Such appointments as Moon, Gruber, Thomas, Michaels give added impetus to research. Surgery looks up in Shallow's guidance. Muller is appointed. Through Gordon Pine Street becomes an active tuberculosis department with clinical and surgical divisions. Bill Kraemer interests Pierre DuPont and we have a tumor clinic with a research chemist. Mr. J. Ewing Mears' research fund is accepted for work in eugenics and hereditary disease. Meanwhile, active, friendly and instructive, Rosy starts the bi-monthly seminars at which research, clinical and experimental, is subjected to critical survey. Jake Shaeffer develops an anatomy department known world wide for research effort and all-round teaching excellence. "Daddy" Thornton, as Professor of Therapeutics, gains his birthright and continues in our hearts as a fine physician and lovable personality.

The College library is enlarged, endowed and becomes an asset to student and teacher. Baldy Keyes takes charge of Psychiatry. In '38 Mohler became Dean and Professor of Therapeutics. Through his influence a new spirit develops. In '38 the Charlotte Drake Cardeza Foundation for the study of diseases of the blood and allied conditions is founded which includes a Transfusion-Plasma Unit, hospital and college

research labs and a Photographic Unit.

Following the untimely death of Doctor Mohler, Harvey "Cy" Perkins is elected Dean. We look forward to a greater Jefferson.


This means we will modernize our curriculum, press research, and adapt ourselves to social progress, but we will do these things only with the best intelligence and advice that we can muster.

No one can predict the future of personalities or the physical features of our College. Men will continue to come and go and buildings have a habit of rising and falling; changes in both are inevitable.


Our students of the future will be better trained than we were in 1913; our Faculty will be the best that we can raise ourselves or attract to us; our Alumni will be the better for these reasons.


