PETER	PAUL
• Was God's spokesman to the Jews (Gal. 2:7, 8)	Was God's official messenger to the Gentiles (Rom. 11:13)
• Was a fisherman (Matt. 4:18)	Was a tentmaker (Acts 18:1-3)
• Called by Jesus near the Galilean Sea (Luke 8:10)	• Called by Jesus on the Damascus Road (Acts 9:1-16)
 Preached his most famous sermon on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:14-40) 	• Preached his most famous sermon on Mars Hill (Acts 17:16-31)
• Gave excellent advice to married couples (1 Peter 3:1-12)	Gave excellent advice to married couples (Eph. 5:22-33)
Often warned about latter day apostasy (2 Peter 3:1-12)	Often worried about latter day apostasy (1 Tim. 4:1-3; 2 Tim. 3:1-5; 4:1-4)
