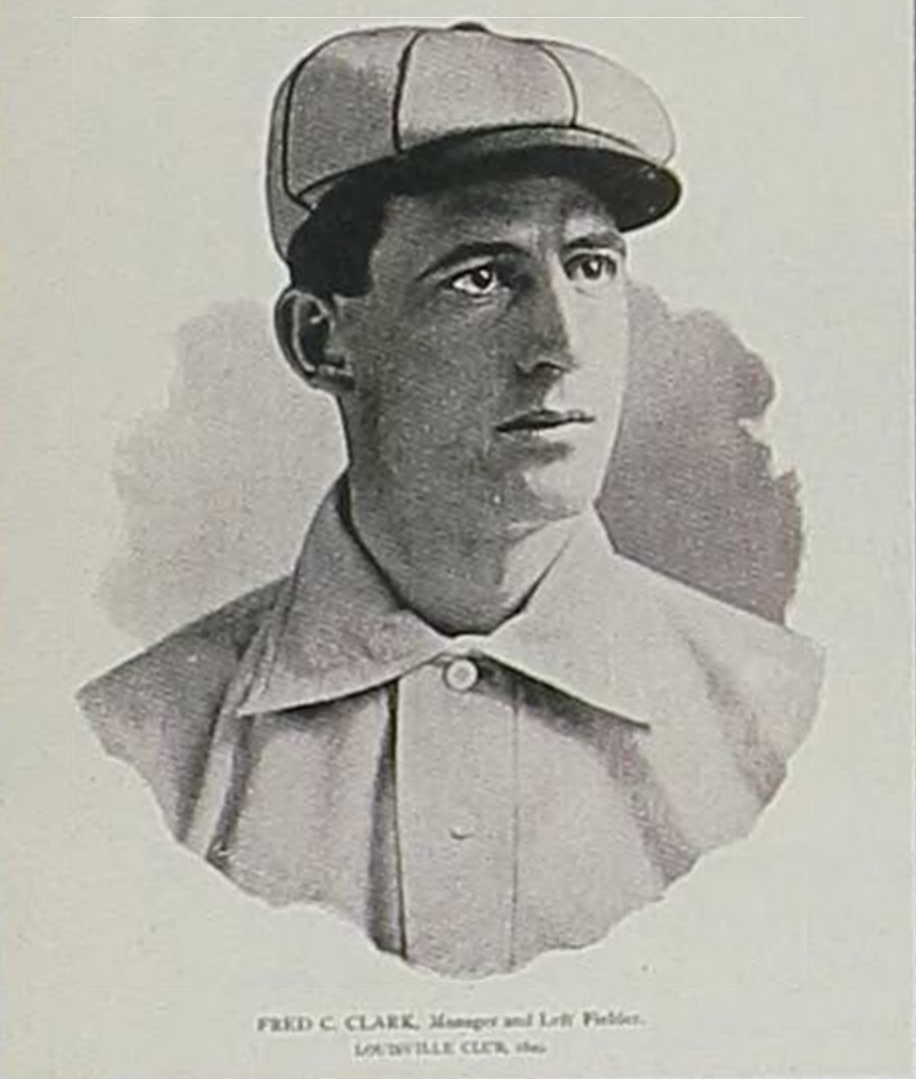


# Baseball Card Images of Iowa's Hall of Famers

FRED C. CLARK, Manager and Left Fielder,  
LOUISVILLE CLACK, 1899.

**Fred "Cap" Clarke:** b. 10-3-1872, Winterset; d. 8-14-1960, Winfield, Kansas. Outfielder for Louisville Colonels (National League), 1894-1899, and their player-manager, 1897-1899. Player-manager for Pittsburgh Pirates, 1900-1915. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1945. (Portrayed on 1899-1900 baseball card as supplement in *Sporting News*.)

**David J. "Beauty" Bancroft:** b. 4-20-1891, Sioux City; d. 10-9-1972, Superior, Wisconsin. Philadelphia Phillies in 1915; then played with three other teams through 1930. Player-manager with Boston Braves, 1924-1927. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1971. (Portrayed on 1922 strip card. W573)

**Urban "Red" Faber:** b. 9-6-1888, Cascade; d. 9-25-1976, Chicago. Right-handed pitcher for Chicago White Sox, 1914-1933. Won 254 games in career. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1964. (Portrayed on 1933 Goudey Gum Co., Big League Chewing Gum baseball card. R319)

**James Leslie Wilkinson:** b. 5-14-1878, Algona; d. 8-21-1964, Kansas City, Missouri. In Iowa he was a pitcher and baseball entrepreneur. Principal owner of Kansas City Monarchs, 1920-1948. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, February 2006. (Photo dated 1924, not a baseball card. Story on Wilkinson begins on page 38.)



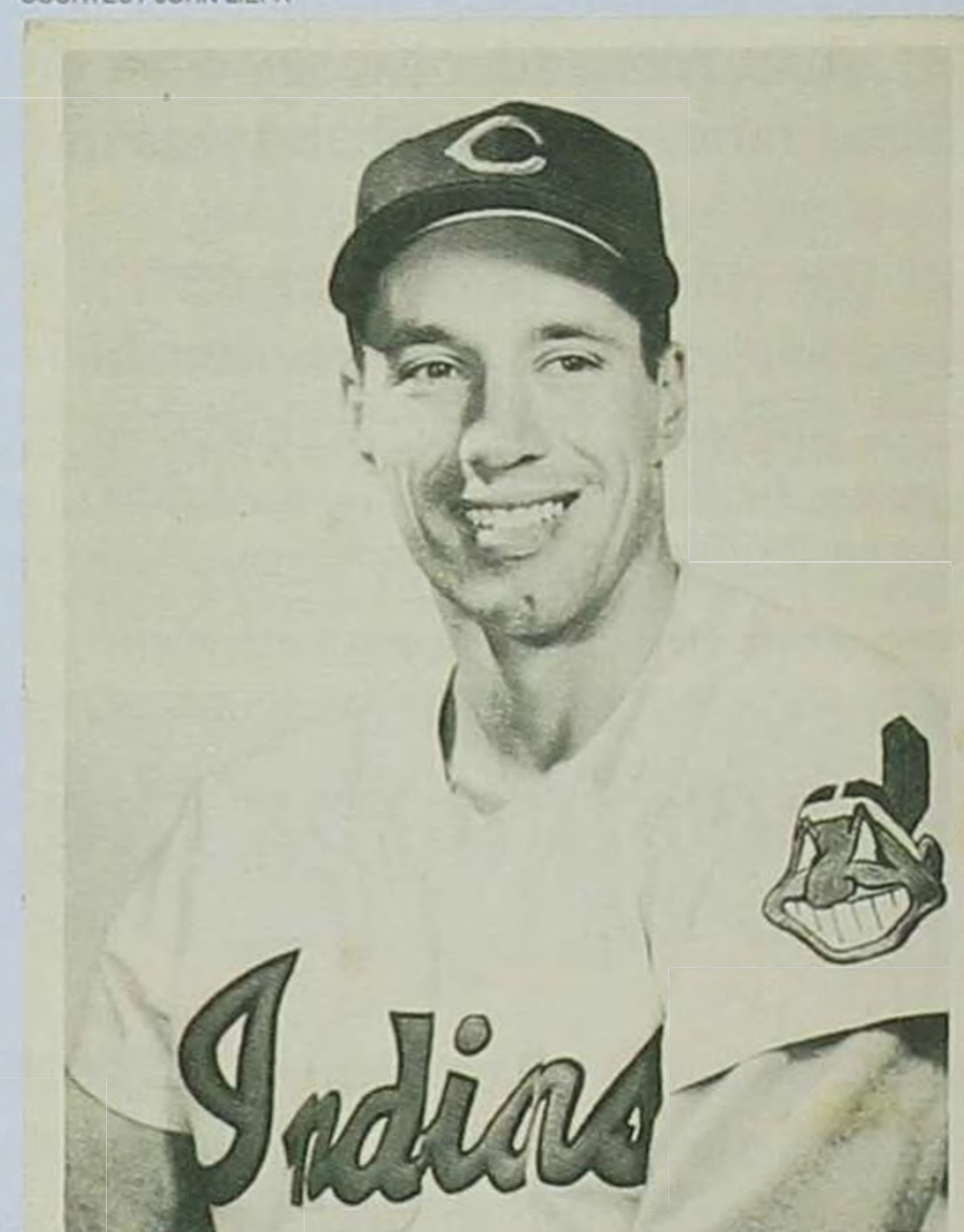

**Adrian "Cap" Anson:** b. 4-17-1852, Marshalltown; d. 4-14-1922, Chicago. Primarily a first baseman, played with Chicago Cubs, 1876-1897. For Chicago White Stockings, pitched two games in 1883 and one in 1884. Player-manager for Cubs franchise, 1879-1897. Managed New York Giants, 1898. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1939. (Portrayed here on 1887 Allen & Ginter series of "World's Champions" cards, packaged in boxes of ten cigarettes. Card series also included wrestlers, pool and billiards players, rifle shooters, pugilists, and oarsmen. N28)

**Bob "Rapid Robert" Feller:** b. 11-3-1918, Van Meter. Right-handed pitcher for Cleveland Indians, 1936-1956. Missed 1942-1944 seasons due to military service in World War II. Won 266 games. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1962. (Portrayed on 1952 Cleveland Indians card series by Num Num snack foods.)

**Clarence "Dazzy" Vance:** b. 3-4-1891, Orient; d. 2-16-1961, Homosassa Springs, Florida. Right-handed pitcher. Pittsburgh Pirates, 1915-1918. Sold to New York Yankees and played briefly, 1918. Brooklyn Dodgers, 1922-1933. Traded to St. Louis Cardinals. Began 1934 with Cincinnati, returned to Cardinals and briefly appeared for victorious "Gas House Gang" in 1934 World Series against Detroit. Brooklyn Dodgers, 1935. 197-140 record in 16-year career. Elected to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1955. (Portrayed on 1922 strip card. W560)
