## From the Reviews Editor -

When the FORUM receives things to be reviewed, subject specialists are assigned as reviewers when possible. Upon request from a subscriber, the FORUM will also solicit review copies of current items from the publisher or producer and forward them to the requesting subscriber.

## Some flexible guidelines:

- I. Content in your review you may wish to consider such things as the author's theoretical stance, methodology, scope, content, organization, readability (or if a record or film: quality of performance, soundtrack, shooting technique, variety, etc.), the author's conclusions, the relation of the work to past or current folklore scholarship, and the usefulness of the work as a bibliographical or instructional aid.
- II. Form please submit double-spaced typewritten manuscripts. The heading should be set up like the following examples, the first for books and the second for records:
