Workshop in Political Theory & Policy Analysis

 Founded in January 1973 by Vincent and Elinor Ostrom

- A library was maintained by the Ostrom's until 1985
- Hired a part-time librarian to start collecting materials related to common pool resources



Workshop Library

- Today, the Library is housed on the 3rd floor of the Workshop's main building, with collections spreading into seven more rooms in other Workshop buildings
- Holdings:
 - 6,700 Books
 - 25,000 Reprint Files
 - Weight restrictions = in the process of weeding journals that we have electronic access to through Wells



Reprint Files

- Contain unpublished literature
 - Working papers
 - Conference papers
 - Internal reports
 - Manuscript drafts
 - Dissertations
- Many important case studies published at the local level only



What is 'the Commons'?

- 'the commons':
 - shared resource
 - vulnerable to enclosure, degradation, or social dilemmas
 - has to be managed
 - management/governance requires collective action
- The research focuses on the relationship between ecosystems, natural resources, and human management decisions



Digital Library of the Commons

- An innovative multifaceted digital library intended to serve as a gateway to the international literature on the commons and common pool resources (CPR)
- Purpose is to make up-to-date & historical CPR materials globally available to developing countries as well as to the developed world



Digital Library of the Commons

- Started as an outgrowth of the International Association for the Study of the Commons' (IASC) Virtual Library of the Commons in 1996
- Fall 1999 collaboration between the DLP and workshop started with working on the design and implementation
 - would contain digitized documents from the Workshop Library, and also serve as a selfpublication portal for scholars working on Commons issues

Digital Library of the Commons

- Jan. 2000—implemented a prototype of the DLC using IBM's Content Manager
 - Started with 166 electronic papers & 40 scanned papers
 - Prototype was tested & reviewed by attendees of the IASC conference held at IU, June 2000
- Jan. 2001

 replaced IBM software with EPrints
 - became fully operational with the self-publication portal in Aug. 2001




Digital Library of the Commons

- July 2003-June 2006 received a grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, through which we:
 - Hired a dedicated computer programmer to maintain, update and develop the system
 - Digitized published & unpublished full-text seminal literature on the commons
 - Developed, populated and implemented the lmage Database

Digital Library of the Commons

- Apr. 2007-Mar. 2010 received 2nd grant from Mellon to further develop and ensure the long-term preservation of the DLC:
 - Developed an author database to communicate and negotiate copyright agreements
 - Continued to populate the DLC with papers
 - Migrated the DLC to more sustainable technology
 - Upgrading the Bibliography of the Commons and the Image Database

- EPrints
 - Open Access software
 - Stevan Harnad
- DLC early adopter of EPrints
 - Release 1.0 in Nov 2000
 - New releases bi-monthly for 2 years




Technology Infrastructure Issues

- Long term maintenance and support
 - Highly customized EPrints
 - Required specialized support
 - Manual exports and loads for the Bibliography
 - No way to integrate with the new DLP infrastructure
- New grant providing funding to explore new options

- Repository software analysis
 - Functionality
 - Sustainability

 - Ease of implementation
 - Preservation issues



DSpace

- Widely used and accepted
- Positive long term outlook for continued development
- Large support community
- Configurable
 - Interface look and feel
 - Indexes
 - Data fields



Dspace Customization Process

- Jira for enhancement, configuration and bug management
- Tied Jira to SVN for tighter coupling of documentation and source code
- No changes to underlying code base






Image Database

- The underlying database and data entry system is based on the Cushman project
- The search and discovery interface is the work of a graduate student
 - PHP based
 - Delivery images stored on local directory
 - Master files stored on HPSS



New Image Database

- Based on the DLP infrastructure systems and tools
- Fedora digital repository for metadata and image management
- Photo Cataloging tool for data entry
 - MODS metadata standard compliant
 - Flexible
 - Configurable



New Image Database (2)

Status

- Data mapped from old data structure to MODS
- Data exported, converted and loaded into Fedora
- Photo Cataloging Tool is configured
- Public interface to be configured in February
- General Release in March

Future Grant funded Work

- Bibliography of the Commons
 - Currently a manual batch export from and import from Library Master database
 - Need to have a generalize solution for selected bibliographies.
 - Analysis for a generalized solution is underway
- Library Holdings
 - A superset of the BotC
 - Workshop would like to make entire holdings available for searching on the web.



Future of the DLC

 - Collection development and management
 - Papers
 - Images
 - Continued support from the DLP
 - Integrated into the infrasturcture
 - Supportable technology base
 - Upgrades on a schedule
