### It all started in 2005 ...

- George W. Bush was inaugurated for a second term
- Pope John Paul II died
- Hurricane Katrina ravaged the Gulf

## Birth of the *Indiana Authors and Their Books* Project

- An LSTA funded project (June 2005-July 2006)
- Aimed to digitize and encode:
  - 3-volume reference work *Indiana Authors and Their Books*
    - Published by Wabash College: 1949, 1974, 1981
    - Covering: 1816-1916, 1917-1966, 1967-1980
  - Approximately 150 volumes by selected authors from Indiana's Golden Age of Literature (1880-1920) referenced in the encyclopedia

### Indiana Authors: Anatomy of the Reference Work

- Biographical entry and a complete bibliography for all authors who were born, raised, or educated in Indiana, or who lived in the state for a major portion of their lives
  - ~7,000 entries of Hoosier authors from Indiana's first 100 years of statehood
  - ~21,000 citations in the bibliographies

#### BLACK, WILLIAM HENRY: 1854-1930.

William Henry Black, son of the Rev. Felix G. and Lydia K. Frederick Black, was born at Centerville, Ind., on Mar. 19, 1854. He graduated from Waynesburg (Pa.) College in 1876, receiving the A.M. degree in 1879, and graduated from Western Theological Seminary in 1878. In 1888 he received the D.D. degree from Cumberland University, in 1903 the LL.D. from Westminster College, and in 1915 the Litt.D. from Waynesburg College. He married Mary Ella Henderson on Apr. 3, 1879.

Ordained to the Presbyterian ministry in 1876, he served as pastor at Pittsburgh from 1877 to 1881 and at St. Louis from 1881 to 1890. After 1890 he was president of Missouri Valley College.

Dr. Black died on June 22, 1930, at Marshall, Mo.

#### BLACKALL, EMILY LUCAS (MRS. CHRISTOPHER R.): 1832-1892.

Emily Lucas was born in Salem, Ind., in 1832. She became the second wife of Christopher Rubey Blackall, a newspaper editor, in 1873. She died in New York in 1802.

#### BLACKBURN, WILLIAM MAXWELL: 1828-1898.

"William Maxwell Blackburn, author and educator, was born at Carlisle, Ind., Dec. 30, 1828, son of Alexander and Deliah (Polk) Blackburn . . . He received his early education in district schools and in an academy at La Porte, Ind., and taught at similar institutions previous to entering . . . Hanover College, where he was graduated, June, 1850. He then studied for the Presbyterian ministry at Princeton Theological Seminary from 1850 to 1854, and after completing his course held pastorates at Three Rivers, Mich., Erie, Pa., Trenton, N. J., Chicago, Ill., and Cincinnati, O. Beginning in his early ministry by contributions to the PRINCETON REVIEW, he occupied his leisure continuously with writing; and while preaching and administering the affairs of his pastorates he became known both in America and England, first, as a successful author of Sunday-school books, and later for works on subjects of wider interest. In 1868, the position was offered him of professor of biblical and ecclesiastical history in what is now McCormick Theological Seminary at Chicago . . . He accepted and filled the chair until 1881. From 1884 until 1886, he was president of the Territorial University of North Dakota, and later was appointed president of Pierre University, at East Pierre, S. D., which, in 1898, was removed to Huron, S. D.

"He received the honorary degree of D.D., from Princeton in 1870 and that of LL.D. from Wooster University . . .

"Dr. Blackburn was married in 1854 at Valparaiso, Ind., to Elizabeth Powell . . ."

Dr. Blackburn died at Huron, S. D., on Dec. 29, 1808.

### E-Text Explained, Sort Of

The term "e-text" has been co/ad-opted by the Electronic (Text)books market (eText) and by our central IT division at Indiana University.

(eText + eBook) = e-text

The origin of "e-text" as in Electronic Texts has been used in the humanities computing arena since the 1970s and is speculatively attributed to Michael Hart who started Project Gutenberg.

e-text != eText?

### TEI Refresher

Text Encoding Initiative (TEI) / Guidelines for Electronic Text Encoding and Interchange (TEI)

- The TEI Guidelines "are addressed to anyone who works with any text in electronic form. They provide means of representing those features of a text which need to be identified explicitly in order to facilitate processing of the text by computer programs" (Sperberg-McQueen).
- TEI provides elements, attributes, and other mechanisms for encoding prose, poetry, drama, dictionaries, critical apparatus, linguistic corpora, and other scholarly and non-scholarly texts.

## Indiana Authors: Digitization and Text Encoding

- Encyclopedia encoded following TEI P4 standard
  - Structural, Semantic and Stylistic
- Monographs encoded following the TEI Lite P4 standard, a subset of the TEI schema
  - Structural and stylistic markup
  - Genres vary: mostly prose and poetry, some dramas
- TEI and Page Images
  - Initial round of encoding/scanning was vendor outsourced
  - Second round of encoding/scanning happened inhouse



### E-text workflow: pilot to production

- Summer 2009: 11 catalogers trained
- Spring 2012: 4 catalogers trained; hired a student hourly
- More than half of Tech Services catalogers perform text encoding work today
- Staff cataloging job descriptions were rewritten to accommodate non-MARC metadata

## Libraries are doing it for themselves: Productionizing an e-text workflow

Scanning

### Selection

- Selection initially done by the collection manager
- In the new workflow, selection became more complicated!



### Scanning

- DLP completed scanning in-house
- OCR is run to derive text from scanned images
- Result: a TEI shell (with dirty OCR) and...



### Encoding

- ... MARC data! TEI header metadata was derived from MARC data
- Complies with Level 3 encoding, as defined in Best Practices for TEI in Libraries (version 3.0)




### **Publishing**

 Once published, these electronic texts are then cataloged as ebooks, links can be accessed via IUCAT and WorldCat





### Web Design Challenges

- Mixed Content Types
  - Different levels of encoding (whole/parts)
  - Different user expectations for access
- Only small subset of citations available in full text
- Author name normalization across encyclopedia entries (i.e., "transcribed") and bibliographic access (i.e., "controlled")


