Biographies

Tod Bowermaster, a native of Ottawa, Illinois, has been Third Horn of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra since 1995. He is a graduate of Northwestern University, where he was a student of Dale Clevenger and Richard Oldberg.

Before joining the St. Louis Symphony, he was a member of the Honolulu Symphony and the Chicago Lyric Opera Orchestra, and has performed with the orchestras of Chicago, San Francisco, and Houston. Winner of the 1982 Coleman Chamber Ensemble Competition, he has participated in numerous chamber music festivals in Maine, Hawaii, and Colorado, and enjoys frequent chamber music appearances in the St. Louis area as well. He has appeared as a soloist with the Honolulu and St. Louis Symphonies, the Sun Valley Summer Symphony, the Illinois Valley Symphony, and this season will be soloing with the Town and Country Symphony and again with the St. Louis Symphony. In September 1999, he won first prize in the professional division of the American Horn Competition. He loves working with students, and has given masterclasses in the St. Louis area and at the Manhattan School of Music. He and his wife, Cynthia, live in Kirkwood, Missouri with their daughter, Kathryn.

Linda Perry is Professor of Music and Director of the Keyboard Faculty at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where she also coordinates a graduate program in accompanying and chamber music for pianists. Best known as a collaborative artist, she has performed extensively as a recitalist, both locally and nationally. She is pianist with the LeClaire Trio (violin, cello, piano) and also recorded a 1999 CD with the Meridian Trio (clarinet, viola, piano).

Dr. Perry holds bachelor's and master's degrees in Piano Performance from Northwestern University and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Accompanying from the University of Illinois. Her recordings of piano accompaniments for many of the standard violin concerti are widely used by teachers and students nationally. She recently recorded the Suzuki Violin School accompaniments for Time-Warner for release later this year. Her critical edition of George Frederick Pinto's Sonatas for Pianoforte with Violin was published in 1999 by A-R Editions of Madison.

At SIUE, Dr. Perry teaches applied piano and harpsichord, accompanying, chamber music, and piano literature.
