Allan Publications and one piece for solo euphonium with Tuba-Euphonium Press. Smoke is Roy's first composition for choral ensemble.

Notes from the composer

Writing Smoke at this time in my life has functioned primarily as a therapeutic exercise. I am 22 years old and am at that time in life where I am no longer a child, but not an adult. Soon, I will be responsible for all the things that my parents are responsible for, the most terrifying of all being another human life. My biggest concern is that I will not create a world as wonderful as the one that I was so lucky to be brought up in and that somehow my children will not be as happy as I have been.

I chose to express this concern through recreating a memory I have of my childhood. Growing up on a farm in rural Illinois, we often had 'burnings' in the back yard (think Green Acres, not Deliverance). The most vivid part of these memories for me is how the smoke would slowly twist and turn up into the air, or how the colors would swirl between black and white and grey. And the smells! Nothing smells better than a great leaf burning! I want my children to be able to look back on their childhood with this same delight.

Musically I have attempted to capture the wistful, ethereal qualities of smoke while maintaining a rather neutral, innocent harmonic palette. The use of percussion is intended to supplement the voices in creating this atmospheric wash. There is, of course, the key to fight with. I chose this key because of its color. None other could, for my ear, convey the sensitivity and simplicity of the memory while still maintaining a dark, serious tone. I think because the key (a-flat minor) is so infrequently used, it has maintained a fresh quality to a large portion of the listening and performing and communities.

I would like to thank Dr. Fredstrom and the University Choir for the unparalleled dedication and commitment to bringing this music to life. It means so much.
