Biographies

Nancy Van de Vate, one of the world's most active women composers, has been commissioned by Austria's Mozart Year 2006 to compose a new work in celebration of the 250th birthday of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. Born in the United States, Van de Vate now lives permanently in Vienna and holds dual Austrian and American citizenship. The works of this widely travelled composer, a cosmopolitan in every respect, have been heard in more than 30 countries and have achieved major recognition in virtually every genre. For her Mozart Year 2006 commission, Van de Vate has composed a new string quartet.

After more than five years of extensive research and musical analysis by Professor Laurdella Foulkes-Levy and Dr. Burt Levy, Scarecrow Press has published the Levys' new book, "Journeys Through the Life and Music of Nancy Van de Vate." The 430-page volume includes extended analyses of four of Van de Vate's orchestral compositions and one of her operas. It also contains an 80-minute compact disc including those works, as well as selected solo and chamber works. Although numerous articles and various dissertations have been published in several languages about the work of this distinguished composer, "Journeys Through the Life and Music of Nancy Van de Vate" is the first comprehensive book about the composer and her music to be distributed internationally.

Composer of 26 orchestral works, ten operas and music theatre pieces, and numerous solo and chamber music compositions, Van de Vate is among the world's most recorded composers. She is frequently invited to give guest lectures, and in October 2005 will present a talk at UNESCO's World Music Forum in Los Angeles. Since its inception twenty years ago, she has been a nominator for the quadrennial Kyoto Prize, the world's largest music award. As a composer, she has been nominated seven times for the Pulitzer Prize and six times for the Grawemeyer award. In 1975 she founded the International League of Women Composers and in 1990, the compact disc recording company Vienna Modern Masters, for which she still serves as President and Artistic Director.

Dr. Harley Hammerman is a full-time physician – a partner in a large radiology practice in the suburbs of St. Louis and the CEO of Metro Imaging, a network of diagnostic imaging centers. His "hobby" is Eugene O'Neill.

Dr. Hammerman began "collecting O'Neill" in high school and now has the largest collection of O'Neill letters, manuscripts, inscribed books and various ephemera in private hands. He started eOneill.com in 1999 and the website now hosts 50,000 visitors per month.

eOneill.com archives Dr. Hammerman's O'Neill collection, as well as similar collections from institutions such as Yale University and the New York Public Library. In addition, the site features complete online texts of O'Neill's works, a reference library, an audio archive, a theatre guide, a production archive and a forum for the exchange of ideas and information. Students of all ages come to the site to listen to plays and to seek information about the playwright. eOneill.com strives to take O'Neill out of the mothballs of academia and make the playwright and his plays come alive, particularly for the young.

Dr. Hammerman is a member of the Board of Directors of the Eugene O'Neill Society.

Laurdella Foulkes-Levy earned the B.M. at Westminster Choir College, the M.M. at Northwestern University, and the Ph.D. (music theory) at SUNY–Buffalo. She holds a Diploma from the Kodaly Musical Training Institute and the Zoltán Kodály Pedagogical Institute in Kecskemét, Hungary. She is a Past President of the Organization o fAmerican Kodály Educators and a former Director of the Kodály Musical Training Institute. She has published articles on aural skills pedagogy in the Journal of Music Theory Pedagogy and co-authored Journeys Through the Life and Music of Nancy Van de Vate. She currently teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in music theory at the University of Mississippi.

Burt Levy earned the B.A. at Temple University, the M.M. at the University of Oregon, and the D.M.A. (composition) at the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana. His teachers have included Homer Keller, Kenneth Gaburo, Herbert Brün, Salvatore Martirano, Lejaren Hiller, and Ben Johnston. Hehas taught music theory, composition, and electronic music at Western Illinois University, the University of Wisconsin-Madison, SUNY-Albany, the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Levy's music has been performed throughout this country, in Europe and Latin America. He co-authored *Journeys Through the Life and Music of Nancy Van de Vate* and currently teaches composition at the University of Mississippi where he produces the yearly Composers at Ole Miss concerts.
